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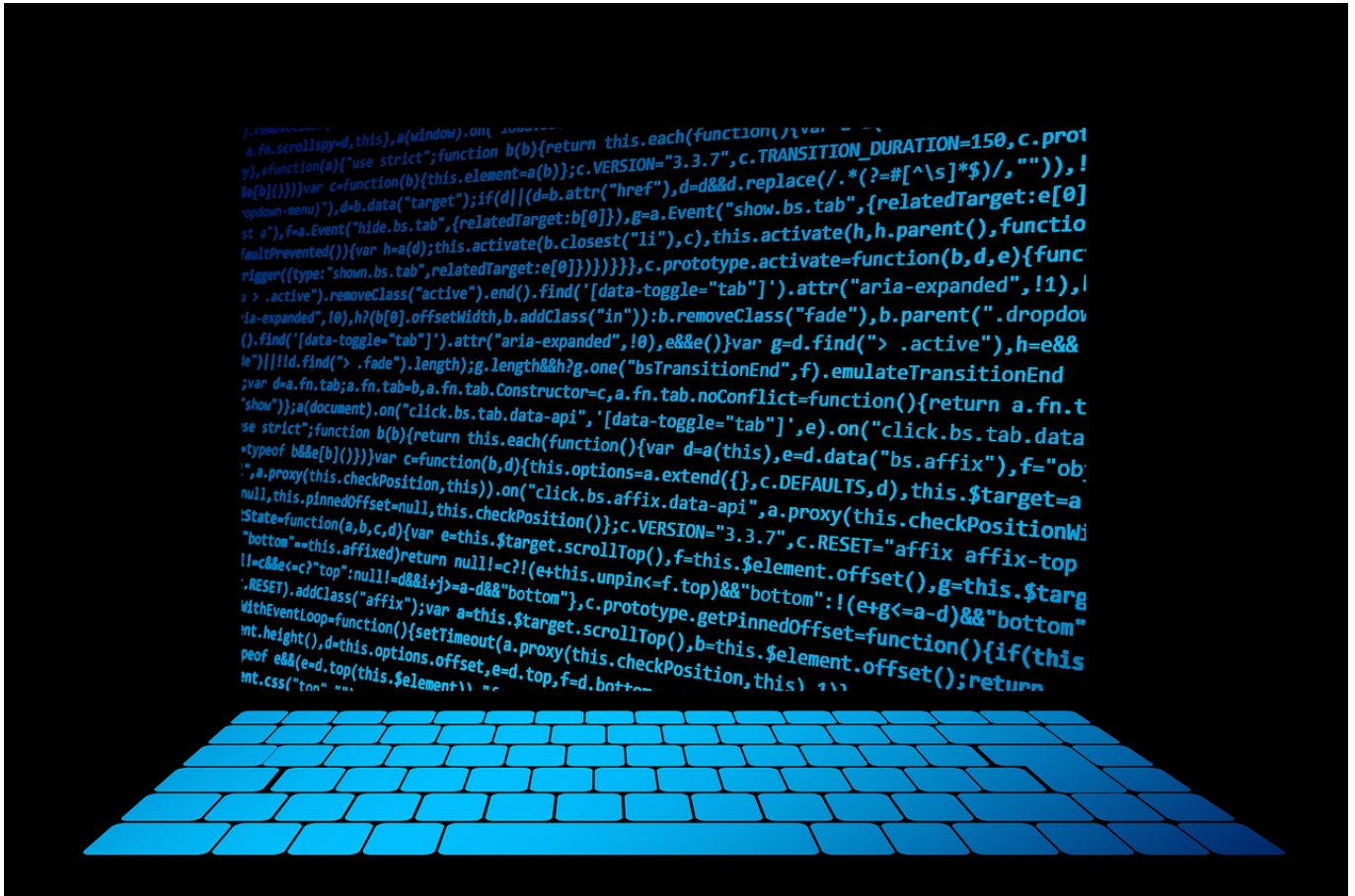

Definitions of "Syntax" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “syntax” as a noun can have the following definitions:

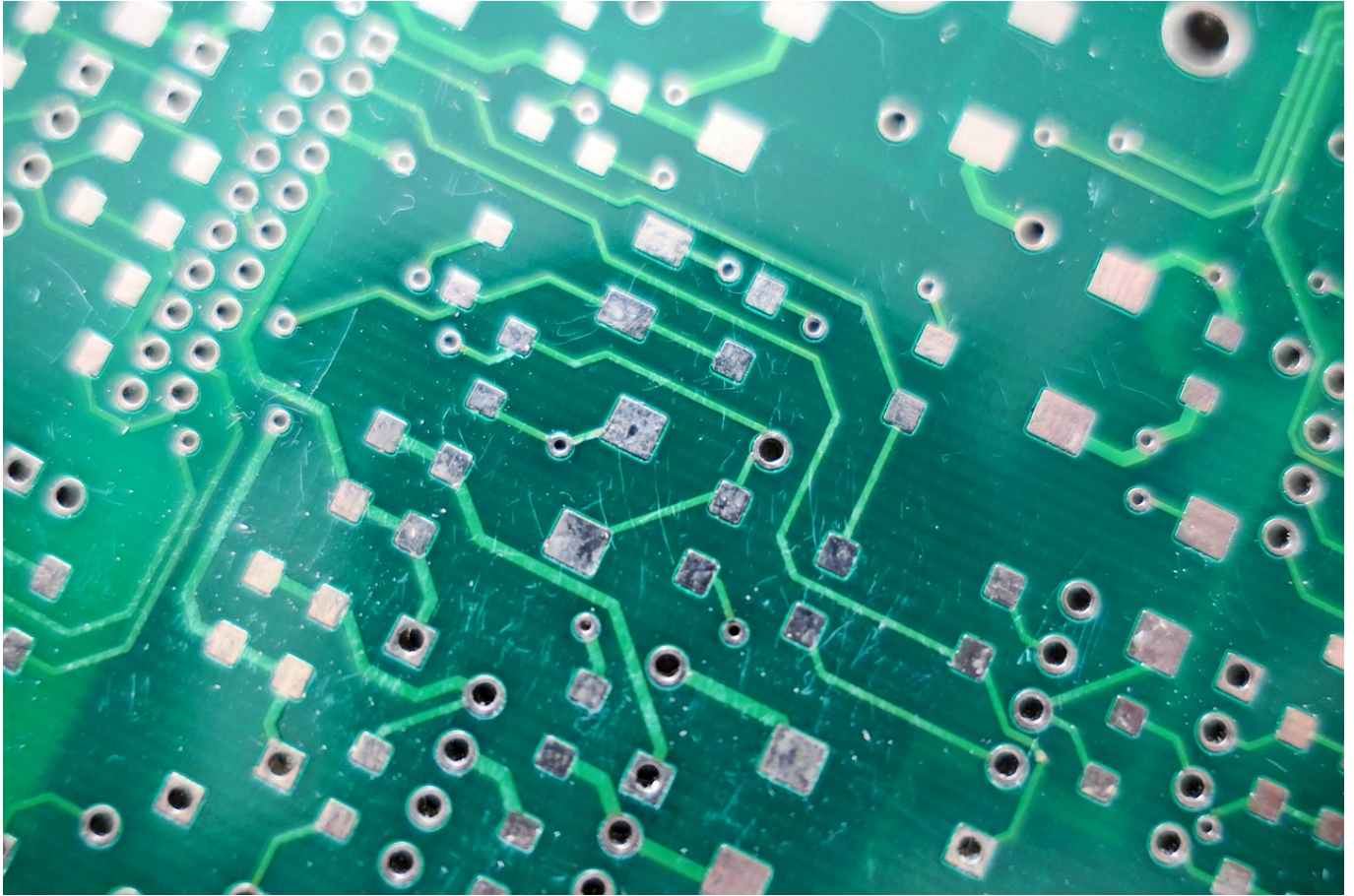
- *The structure of statements in a computer language.*
- *The branch of linguistics that deals with syntax.*
- *A systematic orderly arrangement.*
- *The arrangement of words and phrases to create well-formed sentences in a language.*
- *Studies of the rules for forming admissible sentences.*
- *The grammatical arrangement of words in sentences.*
- *A set of rules for or an analysis of the syntax of a language.*



Synonyms of "Syntax" as a noun (2 Words)

phrase structure A short musical passage.

sentence structure The period of time a prisoner is imprisoned.

Associations of "Syntax" (30 Words)

- abstract** Give an abstract of.
Abstract concepts such as love or beauty.
- alliterate** (of a phrase or line of verse) contain words which begin with the same sound or letter.
His first and last names alliterated.
- alphabet** A set of letters or symbols in a fixed order used to represent the basic set of speech sounds of a language, especially the set of letters from A to Z.
A phonetic *alphabet*.
- antonym** A word that expresses a meaning opposed to the meaning of another word in which case the two words are antonyms of each other.
To him the antonym of gay was depressed.
- bewitchment** A magical spell.

circumlocution	An indirect way of expressing something. <i>He used a number of poetic circumlocutions.</i>
collocation	The action of placing things side by side or in position. <i>The collocation of the two pieces.</i>
concordance	Make a concordance of a text. <i>A concordance to the Bible.</i>
correction	A drop in stock market activity or stock prices following a period of increases. <i>Isotopic ratios are presented normalized to NBS SRM981 using a fractionation correction of 0.101 per amu.</i>
<u>derivative</u>	An arrangement or product (such as a future, option, or warrant) whose value derives from and is dependent on the value of an underlying asset, such as a commodity, currency, or security. <i>Fly tip is a derivative of the phrase on the fly.</i>
dictionary	A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words with information about them. <i>I'll look up love in the dictionary.</i>
diphthong	A digraph representing the sound of a diphthong or single vowel as in feat.
etymology	The study of the origin of words and the way in which their meanings have changed throughout history. <i>The etymology of the word devil.</i>
grammar	A grammar school. <i>My old Latin grammar.</i>
grammarians	A linguist who specializes in the study of grammar and syntax.
homonym	Two words are homonyms if they are pronounced or spelled the same way but have different meanings.
<u>indent</u>	The space left between the margin and the start of an indented line. <i>An indentured servant.</i>
indentation	The formation of small pits in a surface as a consequence of corrosion. <i>An indentation for each change of speaker.</i>
lexicon	A language user's knowledge of words. <i>The size of the English lexicon.</i>
litotes	Understatement for rhetorical effect (especially when expressing an affirmative by negating its contrary). <i>Saying I was not a little upset when you mean I was very upset is an example of litotes.</i>

<u>morphology</u>	The study of the forms of words, in particular inflected forms. <i>Grammar is organized along two main dimensions morphology and syntax.</i>
orthography	A method of representing the sounds of a language by written or printed symbols. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned orthography.</i>
paragraph	Write about in a paragraph. <i>All her friends were paragraphed in last Monday's paper.</i>
<u>parse</u>	Analyze syntactically by assigning a constituent structure to (a sentence). <i>I asked a couple of students to parse these sentences for me.</i>
<u>rhetoric</u>	Using language effectively to please or persuade. <i>He is using a common figure of rhetoric hyperbole.</i>
sentence	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>Slander of an official carried an eight year prison sentence.</i>
<u>spelling</u>	The way a word is spelled. <i>The spelling of his name was influenced by French.</i>
typo	A typographical error.
vocabulary	The body of words used in a particular language. <i>The term became part of business vocabulary.</i>
word	A word is a string of bits stored in computer memory. <i>So many words for so few ideas.</i>
