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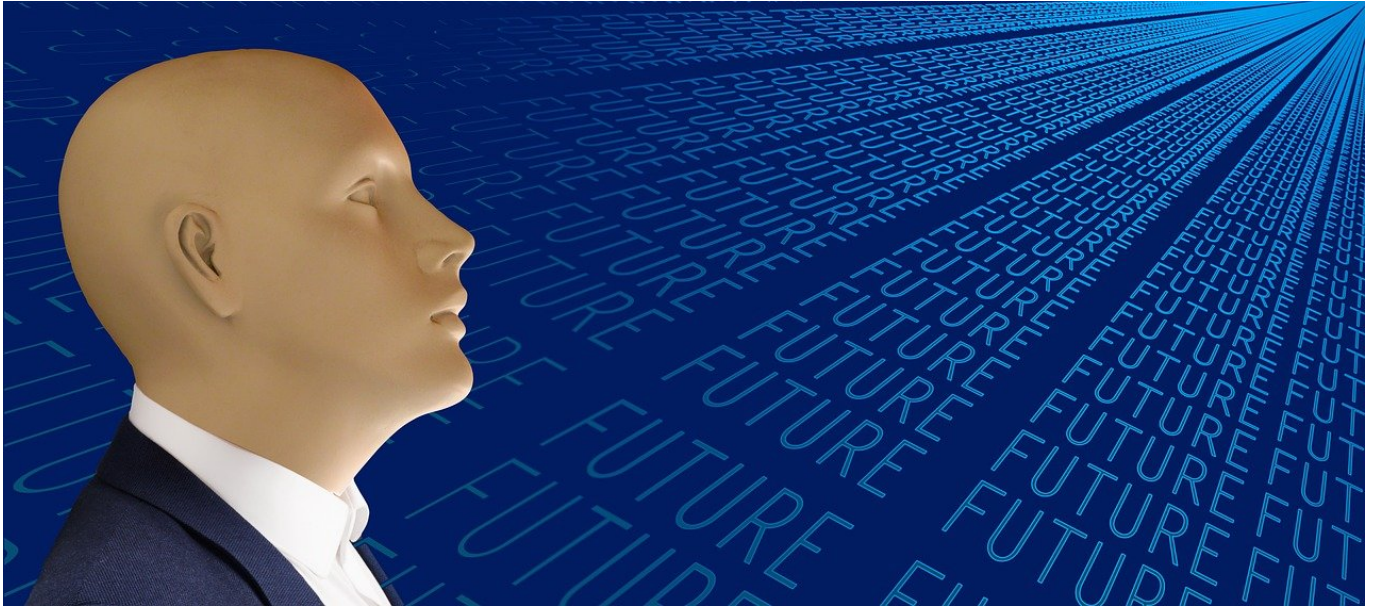

- consistent** In agreement or consistent or reliable.

- efficient** Able to accomplish a purpose; functioning effectively.

<b><u>meticulous</u></b>	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>He had always been so <b>meticulous</b> about his appearance.</i>
<b>orderly</b>	Clean or organized. <i>An <b>orderly</b> arrangement of objects.</i>
<b>organized</b>	Formed into a structured or coherent whole, particularly on a large scale. <i>Without rules an <b>organized</b> society cannot hold together.</i>
<b><u>planned</u></b>	Planned in advance. <i>The <b>planned</b> outlays for new equipment.</i>
<b><u>practical</u></b>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>Woodworking is a <b>practical</b> art.</i>
<b>regular</b>	In accord with regular practice or procedure. <i>Elkerton is a <b>regular</b> footer.</i>
<b>routine</b>	Performed as part of a regular procedure rather than for a special reason. <i>The Ministry insisted that this was just a <b>routine</b> annual drill.</i>
<b>standard</b>	Conforming to or constituting a standard of measurement or value or of the usual or regularized or accepted kind. <i>A <b>standard</b> size.</i>
<b><u>standardized</u></b>	Brought into conformity with a standard. <i><b>Standardized</b> education.</i>
<b><u>structured</u></b>	Having definite and highly organized structure. <i>A <b>structured</b> environment.</i>
<b>systematized</b>	Arranged according to an organized system; made systematic. <i><b>Systematized</b> reading schemes.</i>
<b>taxonomic</b>	Of or relating to taxonomy. <i><b>Taxonomic</b> relations.</i>
<b>taxonomical</b>	Of or relating to taxonomy.
<b>well ordered</b>	Resulting favorably.

## Associations of "Systematic" (30 Words)

### **aegis**

Armor plate that protects the chest; the front part of a cuirass.  
*The negotiations were conducted under the **aegis** of the UN.*

### **arranged**

Deliberately arranged for effect.  
*Haphazardly **arranged** interlobular septa.*

### **array**

Lay out orderly or logically in a line or as if in a line.  
*The lens focuses light on to an **array** of pixels.*

### **coordinate**

Form a coordinate bond to an atom or molecule.  
***Coordinate** the painters masons and plumbers.*

### **group**

Put in a group or groups.  
*Molluscs are **grouped** into seven different classes.*

<b>holistic</b>	Characterized by the belief that the parts of something are intimately interconnected and explicable only by reference to the whole.
<b>integrated</b>	With various parts or aspects linked or coordinated. <i>An <b>integrated</b> Europe.</i>
<b>intended</b>	Resulting from one's intentions. <i>His <b>intended</b> bride.</i>
<b>methodical</b>	Done according to a systematic or established procedure. <i>A <b>methodical</b> man he assembled all the papers into a huge pile.</i>
<b>mobilize</b>	(of a country or its government) prepare and organize (troops) for active service. <i>It would be hard for worker representatives to <b>mobilize</b> the workforce against the employers.</i>
<b>musicology</b>	The study of music as an academic subject, as distinct from training in performance or composition; scholarly research into music.
<b>neat</b>	Showing care in execution. <i>A <b>neat</b> room.</i>
<b>neatly</b>	In a neat way. <i><b>Neatly</b> folded shirts.</i>
<b>ordered</b>	Marked by an orderly, logical, and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>An <b>ordered</b> sequence.</i>
<b>orderly</b>	A soldier who carries out orders or performs minor tasks for an officer. <i>The crowd was quiet and <b>orderly</b>.</i>
<b>organized</b>	Having formed a trade union or other political group. <i>A repressive regime which crushed <b>organized</b> labour.</i>
<b>planned</b>	Planned in advance. <i>The <b>planned</b> outlays for new equipment.</i>
<b>premeditated</b>	(of an action, especially a crime) thought out or planned beforehand. <i><b>Premeditated</b> murder.</i>
<b>rally</b>	Drive in a rally. <i>A traction engine <b>rally</b>.</i>
<b>regular</b>	One of the regular clergy. <i><b>Regular</b> bus departures.</i>
<b>scheme</b>	Devise a system or form a scheme for. <i>I <b>scheme</b> it could work.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly. <i>The village was <b>set</b> among olive groves on a hill.</i>

- setup** Equipment designed to serve a specific function.  
*It takes time to learn the **setup** around here.*
- sizing** Any glutinous material used to fill pores in surfaces or to stiffen fabrics.
- studied** Produced or marked by conscious design or premeditation- V.L.Parrington.  
*A **studied** smile.*
- systematically** In a systematic or consistent manner.  
*Villages were **systematically** destroyed by bombing.*
- systemic** Denoting the part of the circulatory system concerned with the transport of oxygen to and carbon dioxide from the body in general, especially as distinct from the pulmonary part concerned with the transport of oxygen from and carbon dioxide to the lungs.  
*A **systemic** poison.*
- thorough** Absolute (used to emphasize the degree of something, typically something unwelcome or unpleasant).  
***Thoroughgoing** research.*
- tidy** Of hair neat and tidy.  
*She was a **tidy** little girl.*
- union** A device on a national flag emblematic of the union of two or more sovereignties typically in the upper inner corner.  
*Let  $C$  be the **union** of the sets  $A$  and  $B$ .*
