<u>meticulous</u>	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>He had always been so meticulous about his appearance.</i>
orderly	Clean or organized. <i>An orderly arrangement of objects.</i>
organized	Formed into a structured or coherent whole, particularly on a large scale. <i>Without rules an organized society cannot hold together.</i>
<u>planned</u>	Planned in advance. <i>The planned outlays for new equipment.</i>
<u>practical</u>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>Woodworking is a practical art.</i>
regular	In accord with regular practice or procedure. <i>Elkerton is a regular footer.</i>
routine	Performed as part of a regular procedure rather than for a special reason. <i>The Ministry insisted that this was just a routine annual drill.</i>
standard	Conforming to or constituting a standard of measurement or value or of the usual or regularized or accepted kind. <i>A standard size.</i>
<u>standardized</u>	Brought into conformity with a standard. <i>Standardized education.</i>
<u>structured</u>	Having definite and highly organized structure. <i>A structured environment.</i>
systematized	Arranged according to an organized system; made systematic. <i>Systematized reading schemes.</i>
taxonomic	Of or relating to taxonomy. <i>Taxonomic relations.</i>
taxonomical	Of or relating to taxonomy.
well ordered	Resulting favorably.

Lay out orderly or logically in a line or as if in a line.
*The lens focuses light on to an **array** of pixels.*

coordinate

Form a coordinate bond to an atom or molecule.
***Coordinate** the painters masons and plumbers.*

group

Put in a group or groups.
*Molluscs are **grouped** into seven different classes.*

holistic	Characterized by the belief that the parts of something are intimately interconnected and explicable only by reference to the whole.
integrated	With various parts or aspects linked or coordinated. <i>An integrated Europe.</i>
intended	Resulting from one's intentions. <i>His intended bride.</i>
methodical	Done according to a systematic or established procedure. <i>A methodical man he assembled all the papers into a huge pile.</i>
mobilize	(of a country or its government) prepare and organize (troops) for active service. <i>It would be hard for worker representatives to mobilize the workforce against the employers.</i>
musicology	The study of music as an academic subject, as distinct from training in performance or composition; scholarly research into music.
neat	Showing care in execution. <i>A neat room.</i>
neatly	In a neat way. <i>Neatly folded shirts.</i>
ordered	Marked by an orderly, logical, and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>An ordered sequence.</i>
orderly	A soldier who carries out orders or performs minor tasks for an officer. <i>The crowd was quiet and orderly.</i>
organized	Having formed a trade union or other political group. <i>A repressive regime which crushed organized labour.</i>
planned	Planned in advance. <i>The planned outlays for new equipment.</i>
premeditated	(of an action, especially a crime) thought out or planned beforehand. <i>Premeditated murder.</i>
rally	Drive in a rally. <i>A traction engine rally.</i>
regular	One of the regular clergy. <i>Regular bus departures.</i>
scheme	Devise a system or form a scheme for. <i>I scheme it could work.</i>
set	Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly. <i>The village was set among olive groves on a hill.</i>

setup	Equipment designed to serve a specific function. <i>It takes time to learn the setup around here.</i>
sizing	Any glutinous material used to fill pores in surfaces or to stiffen fabrics.
<u>studied</u>	Produced or marked by conscious design or premeditation- V.L.Parrington. <i>A studied smile.</i>
systematically	In a systematic or consistent manner. <i>Villages were systematically destroyed by bombing.</i>
<u>systemic</u>	Denoting the part of the circulatory system concerned with the transport of oxygen to and carbon dioxide from the body in general, especially as distinct from the pulmonary part concerned with the transport of oxygen from and carbon dioxide to the lungs. <i>A systemic poison.</i>
<u>thorough</u>	Absolute (used to emphasize the degree of something, typically something unwelcome or unpleasant). <i>Thoroughgoing research.</i>
<u>tidy</u>	Of hair neat and tidy. <i>She was a tidy little girl.</i>
<u>union</u>	A device on a national flag emblematic of the union of two or more sovereignties typically in the upper inner corner. <i>Let C be the union of the sets A and B.</i>
