- *A flat slab of stone, clay, or wood, used especially for an inscription.*
- *A small portable computer that accepts input directly on to its screen rather than via a keyboard or mouse.*
- *A small block or bar of soap.*
- *A kind of token giving authority for a train to proceed over a single-track line.*
- *A small disc or cylinder of a compressed solid substance, typically a measured amount of a medicine or drug.*
- *A traditional sweet made from sugar, condensed milk, and butter, resembling fudge but having a hard, grainy texture.*
- *A dose of medicine in the form of a small pellet.*

<b>chunk</b>	A compact mass. <i>We won a <b>chunk</b> of money.</i>
<b>drop</b>	The act of dropping something. <i>He had a <b>drop</b> too much to drink.</i>
<b>lozenge</b>	A small medicinal tablet originally in the shape of a lozenge taken for sore throats and dissolved in the mouth. <i><b>Lozenge</b> patterns.</i>
<b>memo pad</b>	A written proposal or reminder.
<b>notebook</b>	A book with blank pages for recording notes or memoranda. <i>He copied the number into his <b>notebook</b>.</i>
<b>notepad</b>	A pad of blank or ruled pages for writing notes on.
<b>pad</b>	The fleshy underpart of an animal's foot or of a human finger. <i>A <b>pad</b> of cotton wool.</i>
<b>pad of paper</b>	A daily or weekly publication on folded sheets; contains news and articles and advertisements.
<b>panel</b>	A committee appointed to judge a competition. <i>The cartoon strip has four <b>panels</b>.</i>
<b>pastille</b>	A small pellet of aromatic paste burnt as a perfume or deodorizer. <i>A perforated bowl used for burning sweet smelling <b>pastilles</b>.</i>
<b>pellet</b>	A small mass of bones and feathers regurgitated by a bird of prey. <i>Owl <b>pellets</b>.</i>
<b>piece</b>	A figure or token used to make moves in a board game. <i>A <b>piece</b> of pie.</i>
<b>pill</b>	A contraceptive in the form of a pill containing estrogen and progesterin to inhibit ovulation and so prevent conception. <i>His competitor's success was a bitter <b>pill</b> to take.</i>
<b>plaque</b>	A sticky deposit on teeth in which bacteria proliferate. <i><b>Plaque</b> around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
<b>plate</b>	An amount of food on a plate. <i>A dinner <b>plate</b>.</i>
<b>sign</b>	A gesture used in a system of sign language. <i>The shops are full which is a <b>sign</b> that the recession is past its worst.</i>
<b>sketch pad</b>	A brief literary description.
<b>sketchbook</b>	A book containing sheets of paper on which sketches can be drawn.
<b>slab</b>	A large, thick slice or piece of cake, bread, chocolate, etc. <i>He handled the rope competently and set out up the centre of the <b>slab</b>.</i>

**tab**

The key on a typewriter or a word processor that causes a tabulation.  
*Pull the **tab** to open the can.*

**writing pad**

The activity of putting something in written form.

A person who prepared and sold medicines and drugs.

**aspirin**

The acetylated derivative of salicylic acid; used as an analgesic anti-inflammatory drug (trade names Bayer, Empirin, and St. Joseph) usually taken in tablet form; used as an antipyretic; slows clotting of the blood by poisoning platelets.

**biofeedback**

A training program in which a person is given information about physiological processes (heart rate or blood pressure) that is not normally available with the goal of gaining conscious control of them.

**capsule**

Enclose in a capsule.  
A **capsule** wardrobe.

<b>chemist</b>	A scientist who specializes in chemistry. <i>Antihistamine tablets are freely available in <b>chemists</b>.</i>
<b>dosage</b>	The quantity of an active agent (substance or radiation) taken in or absorbed at any one time. <i>There are recommendations about <b>dosage</b> in elderly patients.</i>
<b>drugstore</b>	A retail shop where medicine and other articles are sold.
<b>geriatrics</b>	The branch of medical science that deals with diseases and problems specific to old people.
<b>healthcare</b>	The organized provision of medical care to individuals or a community. <i>Rural people deserve good <b>healthcare</b>.</i>
<b>herbal</b>	Of or relating to herbs. <i><b>Herbal</b> remedies.</i>
<b>inoculate</b>	Impregnate with the virus or germ of a disease in order to render immune. <i>He <b>inoculated</b> his tenants against smallpox.</i>
<b>internist</b>	A medical specialist in internal diseases.
<b>medication</b>	The act of treating with medicines or remedies. <i>He was given <b>medication</b> for pain.</i>
<b>nostrum</b>	Hypothetical remedy for all ills or diseases; once sought by the alchemists. <i>A charlatan who sells <b>nostrums</b>.</i>
<b>otolaryngology</b>	The medical specialty that deals with diseases of the ear, nose and throat.
<b>otorhinolaryngology</b>	The medical specialty that deals with diseases of the ear, nose and throat.
<b>overdose</b>	Give an overdose to. <i>The rock star <b>overdosed</b> and was found dead in his hotel room.</i>
<b>painkiller</b>	A medicine used to relieve pain.
<b>pediatrician</b>	A specialist in the care of babies.
<b>pharmaceutical</b>	A compound manufactured for use as a medicinal drug. <i>A <b>pharmaceutical</b> drug.</i>
<b>pharmaceutics</b>	The art and science of preparing and dispensing drugs and medicines. <i>Natural molecules now occupy an increasingly important place in <b>pharmaceutics</b>.</i>

<b>pharmacist</b>	A health professional trained in the art of preparing and dispensing drugs.
<b>pharmacology</b>	The branch of medicine concerned with the uses, effects, and modes of action of drugs.
<b>pharmacopoeia</b>	A stock of medicinal drugs.
<b>physician</b>	A person qualified to practise medicine, especially one who specializes in diagnosis and medical treatment as distinct from surgery. <i>Our family <b>physician</b>.</i>
<b>pill</b>	An oral contraceptive in pill form. <i>His competitor s success was a bitter <b>pill</b> to take.</i>
<b>prescribe</b>	(of a medical practitioner) advise and authorize the use of (a medicine or treatment) for someone, especially in writing. <i>He was <b>prescribed</b> a course of antibiotics.</i>
<b>prescription</b>	Available only with a doctor s written prescription. <i>The lotion is available on <b>prescription</b>.</i>
<b>relaxant</b>	A thing having a relaxing effect. <i>A muscle <b>relaxant</b>.</i>
