dumb Temporarily unable or unwilling to speak.

Struck dumb.

inarticulate Without joints or articulations.

Remained stupidly **inarticulate** and saying something noncommittal.

Refraining from speech or temporarily speechless.

muteMute e is generally dropped before suffixes beginning with a vowel.

Making little or no noise.

quiet

I ll have a quiet word with him.

Reluctant to draw attention to yourself.

reticent

She was extremely reticent about her personal affairs.



(of a person or an organization) inclined to conceal feelings and

secretive intentions or not to disclose information.

Secretive deals.

Marked by absence of sound.

Gave **silent** consent.

uncommunicative Not inclined to talk or give information or express opinions.

The **uncommunicative** Emily disappeared.

(of a person) not willing to divulge information.

unforthcoming With money **unforthcoming** from the company the project has had to

be delayed.

Aloof or indifferent.

was unresponsive to her passionate advances.

untalkative Temperamentally disinclined to talk.

Joe was shy and **untalkative**.

Usage Examples of "Taciturn" as an adjective

• After such gatherings she would be taciturn and morose.

bashful Disposed to avoid notice blate is a Scottish term for bashful.

Reluctant to give information owing to caution or suspicion.

She treated him to a **cov** *smile of invitation.*

deadpan In a deadpan manner.

She delivered her monologue in a **deadpan** voice.

(of clothing) giving a modest appearance.

demureA **demure** knee length skirt.

diffident Modest or shy because of a lack of self-confidence.

She was diffident when offering a comment on the professor s lecture.

eschew Avoid and stay away from deliberately; stay clear of.

He appealed to the crowd to **eschew** violence.

.. . Not clearly expressed or pronounced.

inarticulate

Mention of her mother filled her with inarticulate irritation.



inaudible Impossible to hear; imperceptible by the ear.

Inaudible pulses of high frequency sound.

A person predominantly concerned with their own thoughts and

introvert feelings rather than with external things.

He **introvert**ed his feelings.

introverted (of a community, company, or other group) concerned principally with

its own affairs; inward-looking or parochial.

Muffle the sound of a musical instrument especially by the use of a

mute mute.

Her footsteps were **mute**d by the thick carpet.

A passive form of a verb.

Passive resistance.

The trait of remaining inactive; a lack of initiative.

The **passivity** of television watching.

prissyExcessively fastidious and easily disgusted.

A middle class family with two **prissy** children.

quietBecome quiet or quieter.

A quiet life.

reclusive Withdrawn from society; seeking solitude.

He led a **reclusive** life.

reserved Set aside for the use of a particular person or party.

Was habitually reserved in speech withholding her opinion.

restrained Cool and formal in manner.

His **restrained** gentlemanly voice.

reticent Reluctant to draw attention to yourself.

She was extremely **reticent** about her personal affairs.

retiring

Of a person who has held and relinquished a position or office.

A **retiring** member of the board.

shy (of a wild mammal or bird) reluctant to remain in sight of humans.

Don t **shy** away from saying what you think.

silent Not expressed aloud.

A **silent** h.

timid Showing a lack of courage or confidence; easily frightened.

I was too **timid** to ask for what I wanted.

timorous Showing or suffering from nervousness or a lack of confidence.

Timorous little mouse.



Inclined to timidity or lack of self-confidence. unassertive

His bland and **unassertive** personal style.

uncommunicative

Unwilling to talk or impart information. The **uncommunicative** Emily disappeared.

Very difficult to pronounce correctly. unutterable

Unutterable consonant clusters.

Withdrawn from society seeking solitude. withdrawn

When her husband died she became very withdrawn.

(of a vocal sound) not in the form of words. wordless

A largely **wordless** engaging performance.
