## Associations of "Tackling" (30 Words)

<a href="#">armament</a>	A military force equipped for war. <i>Armaments factories.</i>
<a href="#">battle</a>	Battle or contend against in or as if in a battle. <i>He died in <b>battle</b>.</i>
<b>bravely</b>	In a way that shows a willingness to face and endure danger or pain; courageously. <i>She <b>bravely</b> had a go at paragliding.</i>
<b>brunt</b>	The worst part or chief impact of a specified action. <i>Bore the <b>brunt</b> of the attack.</i>
<b>competitively</b>	In a way that compares favorably with others of the same nature, particularly in relation to price. <i>They were clamouring <b>competitively</b> for her attention.</i>
<a href="#">contend</a>	Come to terms with. <i>She had to <b>contend</b> with his uncertain temper.</i>
<a href="#">cope</a>	Brick that is laid sideways at the top of a wall. <i>His ability to <b>cope</b> with stress.</i>
<a href="#">defensive</a>	An attitude of defensiveness especially in the phrase on the defensive. <i>A <b>defensive</b> stance.</i>
<b>fight</b>	Be engaged in a fight carry on a fight. <i>Ginny felt the <b>fight</b> trickle out of her.</i>
<b>fishing</b>	The act of someone who fishes as a diversion. <i>The area is renowned for its excellent deep sea <b>fishing</b>.</i>
<b>fist</b>	Strike with the fist. <i>He <b>fisted</b> a goal bound shot over the bar.</i>
<b>football</b>	Any of various forms of team game involving kicking and in some cases also handling a ball in particular in the UK soccer or in the US American football. <i>Wherever the president travels a military aide stays close with the <b>football</b>.</i>

<b>gamely</b>	In a plucky manner. <i>He battled <b>gamely</b> but was outclassed by his more experienced opponent.</i>
<b>grapple</b>	Succeed in doing, achieving, or producing (something) with the limited or inadequate means available. <i>Passers by <b>grappled</b> with the man after the knife attack.</i>
<b>internecine</b>	Relating to conflict within a group. <i>The region s history of savage <b>internecine</b> warfare.</i>
<b>javelin</b>	The athletic sport of throwing a javelin. <i>His nearest rival in the <b>javelin</b>.</i>
<b>lance</b>	A weapon resembling a lance used in hunting fish or whales. <i>He <b>lanced</b> through Harlequins midfield to score Swansea s lone try.</i>
<b>naval</b>	Connected with or belonging to or used in a navy. <i>A <b>naval</b> base.</i>
<b>perforate</b>	Perforated. <i>The walls will be <b>perforated</b> with thousands of circular openings.</i>
<b>quarrel</b>	Have a disagreement over something. <i>They had a <b>quarrel</b>.</i>
<b>regatta</b>	A meeting for boat races.
<b>strife</b>	Bitter conflict; heated often violent dissension. <i><b>Strife</b> within the community.</i>
<b>submarine</b>	Attack by submarine. <i>The Germans <b>submarined</b> the Allies.</i>
<b>tactic</b>	The art of disposing armed forces in order of battle and of organizing operations, especially during contact with an enemy. <i>These are possible tax saving <b>tactics</b> to discuss with your accountant.</i>
<b>tool</b>	Work with a tool. <i>The factory must be <b>tooled</b> to produce the models.</i>
<b>tournament</b>	A sporting competition in which contestants play a series of games to decide the winner. <i>The Royal <b>Tournament</b>.</i>
<b>warfare</b>	An active struggle between competing entities. <i>Guerrilla <b>warfare</b>.</i>
<b>warship</b>	A government ship that is available for waging war.
<b>wrestle</b>	To move in a twisting or contorted motion, (especially when struggling). <i>He <b>wrestled</b> all his life with his feeling of inferiority.</i>
