According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "tactical" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of bombing or weapons) done or for use in immediate support of military or naval operations.
- Relating to or constituting actions carefully planned to gain a specific military end.
- (of voting) aimed at preventing the strongest candidate from winning by supporting the next strongest, without regard to one's true political allegiance.
- Of or pertaining to tactic or tactics.
- Showing adroit planning; aiming at an end beyond the immediate action.

adroit	Clever or skilful. An exceptionally adroit pianist.
artful	Clever or skilful, especially in a crafty or cunning way. <i>The artful dodger.</i>
<u>calculated</u>	Carefully thought out in advance. <i>Victims of vicious and calculated assaults.</i>
clever	Showing self-interest and shrewdness in dealing with others. Both Grandma and Mother were clever with their hands.
<u>cunning</u>	Showing inventiveness and skill. The cunning maneuvers leading to his success.
diplomatic	(of an edition or copy) exactly reproducing an original version. <i>Diplomatic</i> relations with Britain were broken.



judicious	Marked by the exercise of good judgment or common sense in practical matters.
	Judicious use of one s money.
<u>planned</u>	Planned in advance. The planned outlays for new equipment.
plotted	With planning and intention.
politic	Marked by artful prudence, expedience, and shrewdness. A politic old scoundrel.
<u>prudent</u>	Careful and sensible; marked by sound judgment. A prudent manager.
shrewd	(of a blow) severe. She was shrewd enough to guess the motive behind his gesture.
skilful	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. A skilful midfielder.
smart	Having or showing a quick-witted intelligence. <i>Hi tech smart weapons.</i>
strategic	(of bombing or weapons) done or for use against industrial areas and communication centres of enemy territory as a long-term military objective <i>Alarms are positioned at strategic points around the prison.</i>
wily	Marked by skill in deception. A wily old attorney.






Usage Examples of "Tactical" as an adjective

- As a tactical officer in the field he had no equal.

Associations of "Tactical" (30 Words)

battlefield	A place or situation of strife or conflict. The battlefield s of the Great War.
<u>calculated</u>	(of an action) done with full awareness of the likely consequences. <i>Victims of vicious and calculated assaults.</i>
<u>combat</u>	Fighting between armed forces. A combat zone.
consultation	A conference between two or more people to consider a particular question. <i>Frequent consultations with his lawyer.</i>
<u>contingency</u>	The absence of necessity; the fact of being so without having to be so. <i>The island s public affairs can occasionally be seen to be invaded by contingency</i> .



contrivance	A device, especially in literary or artistic composition, which gives a sense of artificiality. <i>The plot contained too many improbable</i> contrivance s to be believable.
<u>defensive</u>	An attitude of defensiveness especially in the phrase on the defensive. A defensive player.
machiavellian	A follower of Machiavelli's principles.
management	Those in charge of running a business. <i>He was given overall management of the program.</i>
<u>maneuver</u>	Perform a movement in military or naval tactics in order to secure an advantage in attack or defense. <i>He made a great maneuver.</i>
ouster	Dismissal or expulsion from a position. Ouster proceedings to remove the husband from the matrimonial home.
planning	An act of formulating a program for a definite course of action. Mass production methods call for detailed planning .
<u>ploy</u>	An activity done for amusement. The eternal cross stitch I was set to do before I could indulge my own ploy s.
preparation	The act of preparing something (as food) by the application of heat. Preparations for the ceremony had begun.
project	Draw a projection of. He strives to project an image of youth.
provision	Supply with provisions. Farmers have been slow to make provision for their retirement.
shrewd	(especially of weather) piercingly cold. A bayonet s shrewd thrust.
<u>siege</u>	The action of an armed force that surrounds a fortified place and isolates it while continuing to attack. <i>There is a siege of herons at the river.</i>
significance	The quality of being significant. Do not underestimate the significance of nuclear power.
situation	The general state of things; the combination of circumstances at a given time. The dangerous situation developed suddenly.
strategic	Relating to the identification of long-term or overall aims and interests and the means of achieving them. <i>A large strategic air force.</i>



strategical	Relating to or concerned with strategy.
strategically	With regard to strategy. We have to think strategically about how best to utilize our facilities.
strategy	A plan of action designed to achieve a long-term or overall aim. Shifts in marketing strategy .
tactic	A plan for attaining a particular goal. These are possible tax saving tactic s to discuss with your accountant.
tactician	A person who is skilled at planning tactics. The cunning manoeuvres of a master tactician .
tactics	The branch of military science dealing with detailed maneuvers to achieve objectives set by strategy.
<u>unbeatable</u>	Extremely good; outstanding. <i>The team is unbeatable</i> .
<u>war</u>	A legal state created by a declaration of war and ended by official declaration during which the international rules of war apply. <i>A price war among tour operators.</i>
<u>warfare</u>	An active struggle between competing entities. Diplomatic warfare .
