awkward	Socially uncomfortable; unsure and constrained in manner. <i>Make sure the baby isn't sleeping in an awkward position.</i>
bungling	Lacking physical movement skills, especially with the hands- Mary H. <i>A bungling performance.</i>
clumsy	Lacking social skills; tactless. <i>The cold made his fingers clumsy.</i>

gauche	Lacking social polish. <i>A shy and gauche teenager.</i>
graceless	Lacking grace; clumsy- Sir Walter Scott. <i>He wanted to speak so as not to seem sullen or graceless.</i>
heavy-handed	Lacking physical movement skills, especially with the hands- Mary H.
impolitic	Failing to possess or display prudence; unwise. <i>It was impolitic to pay the slightest tribute to the enemy.</i>
<u>inconsiderate</u>	Without proper consideration or reflection. <i>Slovenly inconsiderate reasoning.</i>
indelicate	Slightly indecent. <i>An earthy often indelicate sense of humour.</i>
indiscreet	Having, showing, or proceeding from too great a readiness to reveal things that should remain private or secret. <i>They have been embarrassed by indiscreet friends.</i>
inept	Not elegant or graceful in expression. <i>If the rumor is true can anything be more inept than to repeat it now.</i>
<u>insensitive</u>	Showing or feeling no concern for others' feelings. <i>An insensitive remark.</i>
maladroit	Inefficient or inept; clumsy. <i>Maladroit propaganda.</i>
<u>thoughtless</u>	Without care or thought for others. <i>It was thoughtless of her to have rushed out and not said where she would be going.</i>
undiplomatic	Not skilled in dealing with others. <i>His arrogant and undiplomatic manner.</i>
undiscerning	Lacking judgement, insight, or taste. <i>An undiscerning audience.</i>
unpolished	Unrefined in style or behaviour. <i>His work is unpolished and sometimes incoherent.</i>
<u>unsophisticated</u>	Not wise in the ways of the world. <i>The nightlife of Montmartre awed the unsophisticated tourists.</i>
unsubtle	Lacking subtlety; obvious. <i>A grudgingly unsubtle joke.</i>
untactful	Lacking or showing a lack of what is fitting and considerate in dealing with others.
unthinking	Without care or thought for others. <i>She was at pains to correct unthinking prejudices.</i>

- *It was tactless to bring up those disagreeable.*

amateurish	Lacking professional skill or expertise. <i>A very amateurish job.</i>
awkward	Socially uncomfortable; unsure and constrained in manner. <i>An awkward prose style.</i>
behaviour	The action or reaction of something (as a machine or substance) under specified circumstances. <i>He will vouch for her good behaviour.</i>
boorish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>Was boorish and insensitive.</i>
bungling	Lacking physical movement skills, especially with the hands. <i>He was heavily criticized for his bungling of the case.</i>
clumsy	Done awkwardly or without skill. <i>Did a clumsy job.</i>
<u>crude</u>	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>Managed to make a crude splint.</i>
forgetful	Deficient in retentiveness or range. <i>Forgetful of her responsibilities.</i>
gauche	Unsophisticated and socially awkward. <i>Too gauche to leave the room when the conversation became intimate.</i>
gawky	Nervously awkward and ungainly. <i>A gawky lad with long ungainly legs.</i>
geek	A performer at a carnival or circus whose show consists of bizarre or grotesque acts. <i>A computer geek.</i>
graceless	Lacking graciousness. <i>He wanted to speak so as not to seem sullen or graceless.</i>
<u>handling</u>	The management of someone or something. <i>The handling of prisoners.</i>

<u>incapable</u>	Not allowing the possibility of (a particular action). <i>He is incapable of understanding the matter.</i>
incompetent	An incompetent person. <i>The patient is deemed legally incompetent.</i>
<u>inconsiderate</u>	Thoughtlessly causing hurt or inconvenience to others. <i>It s inconsiderate of her to go away without telling us.</i>
<u>ineffective</u>	Not producing an intended effect. <i>The legal sanctions against oil spills are virtually ineffective.</i>
inelegant	Lacking in refinement or grace or good taste. <i>An inelegant bellow of laughter.</i>
inept	Having or showing no skill; clumsy. <i>If the rumor is true can anything be more inept than to repeat it now.</i>
loutish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>The loutish manners of a bully.</i>
maladroit	Not adroit. <i>Both men are unhappy about the maladroit way the matter has been handled.</i>
oafish	Rough or clumsy and unintelligent. <i>Oafish behaviour.</i>
<u>sloppy</u>	(of semi-fluid matter) containing too much liquid; watery. <i>Do not make the concrete too sloppy.</i>
solecism	A grammatical mistake in speech or writing.
ungainly	(of a person or movement) awkward; clumsy. <i>A gawky lad with long ungainly legs.</i>
<u>unrefined</u>	Not refined or processed. <i>Unrefined ore.</i>
<u>unskilled</u>	Not having or requiring special skill or training. <i>Unskilled labor.</i>
unskillful	Poorly done. <i>It was an unskillful attempt.</i>
<u>unsophisticated</u>	Not complicated or highly developed; basic. <i>The nightlife of Montmartre awed the unsophisticated tourists.</i>
