gauche	Lacking social polish. A shy and gauche teenager.
graceless	Lacking grace; clumsy- Sir Walter Scott. He wanted to speak so as not to seem sullen or graceless .
heavy-handed	Lacking physical movement skills, especially with the hands- Mary H.
impolitic	Failing to possess or display prudence; unwise. It was impolitic to pay the slightest tribute to the enemy.
<u>inconsiderate</u>	Without proper consideration or reflection. Slovenly inconsiderate reasoning.
indelicate	Slightly indecent. An earthy often indelicate sense of humour.
indiscreet	Having, showing, or proceeding from too great a readiness to reveal things that should remain private or secret. <i>They have been embarrassed by</i> indiscreet friends.
inept	Not elegant or graceful in expression. If the rumor is true can anything be more inept than to repeat it now.
<u>insensitive</u>	Showing or feeling no concern for others' feelings. An insensitive remark.
maladroit	Inefficient or inept; clumsy. <i>Maladroit</i> propaganda.
<u>thoughtless</u>	Without care or thought for others. It was thoughtless of her to have rushed out and not said where she would be going.
undiplomatic	Not skilled in dealing with others. <i>His arrogant and undiplomatic manner.</i>
undiscerning	Lacking judgement, insight, or taste. An undiscerning audience.
unpolished	Unrefined in style or behaviour. His work is unpolished and sometimes incoherent.
unsophisticated	Not wise in the ways of the world. The nightlife of Montmartre awed the unsophisticated tourists.
unsubtle	Lacking subtlety; obvious. A grindingly unsubtle joke.
untactful	Lacking or showing a lack of what is fitting and considerate in dealing with others.
unthinking	Without care or thought for others. She was at pains to correct unthinking prejudices.

amateurish	Lacking professional skill or expertise. A very amateurish job.
awkward	Socially uncomfortable; unsure and constrained in manner. An awkward prose style.
behaviour	The action or reaction of something (as a machine or substance) under specified circumstances. <i>He will vouch for her good behaviour</i> .
boorish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>Was boorish and insensitive.</i>
bungling	Lacking physical movement skills, especially with the hands. <i>He was heavily criticized for his bungling of the case.</i>
clumsy	Done awkwardly or without skill. Did a clumsy job.
<u>crude</u>	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>Managed to make a crude splint.</i>
forgetful	Deficient in retentiveness or range. Forgetful of her responsibilities.
gauche	Unsophisticated and socially awkward. Too gauche to leave the room when the conversation became intimate.
gawky	Nervously awkward and ungainly. A gawky lad with long ungainly legs.
geek	A performer at a carnival or circus whose show consists of bizarre or grotesque acts. A computer geek .
graceless	Lacking graciousness. He wanted to speak so as not to seem sullen or graceless .
<u>handling</u>	The management of someone or something. The handling of prisoners.



<u>incapable</u>	Not allowing the possibility of (a particular action. <i>He is incapable of understanding the matter.</i>
incompetent	An incompetent person. The patient is deemed legally incompetent .
<u>inconsiderate</u>	Thoughtlessly causing hurt or inconvenience to others. It s inconsiderate of her to go away without telling us.
<u>ineffective</u>	Not producing an intended effect. <i>The legal sanctions against oil spills are virtually</i> ineffective .
inelegant	Lacking in refinement or grace or good taste. An inelegant bellow of laughter.
inept	Having or showing no skill; clumsy. <i>If the rumor is true can anything be more inept than to repeat it now.</i>
loutish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>The loutish manners of a bully.</i>
maladroit	Not adroit. Both men are unhappy about the maladroit way the matter has been handled.
oafish	Rough or clumsy and unintelligent. <i>Oafish</i> behaviour.
<u>sloppy</u>	(of semi-fluid matter) containing too much liquid; watery. <i>Do not make the concrete too sloppy.</i>
solecism	A grammatical mistake in speech or writing.
ungainly	(of a person or movement) awkward; clumsy. A gawky lad with long ungainly legs.
<u>unrefined</u>	Not refined or processed. <i>Unrefined</i> ore.
<u>unskilled</u>	Not having or requiring special skill or training. Unskilled labor.
unskillful	Poorly done. It was an unskillful attempt.
unsophisticated	Not complicated or highly developed; basic. The nightlife of Montmartre awed the unsophisticated tourists.
