A group of people or things arranged by class or category.

clue

A fact or idea that serves to reveal something or solve a problem.

Archaeological evidence can give **clues** about the past.

<u>connotation</u>	The abstract meaning or intension of a term, which forms a principle determining which objects or concepts it applies to. <i>The work functions both by analogy and by connotation.</i>
cue	Sports implement consisting of a tapering rod used to strike a cue ball in pool or billiards. <i>She had not yet been given her cue to come out on to the dais.</i>
diacritical	(of a mark or sign) serving to indicate different pronunciations of a letter above or below which it is written.
<u>embody</u>	Represent, as of a character on stage. <i>Livius embodied the population of the town.</i>
<u>exclamation</u>	A loud complaint or protest or reproach. <i>An exclamation of amazement.</i>
<u>guiding</u>	Showing the way by conducting or leading; imposing direction on. <i>A guiding principle.</i>
hide-and-peek	Go to or towards.
<u>index</u>	Provide an index to. <i>Index the book.</i>
indicant	Something that serves to indicate or suggest. <i>Symptoms are the prime indicants of disease.</i>
indication	Something (as a course of action) that is indicated as expedient or necessary. <i>Indications of strain.</i>
label	Assign a label to designate with a label. <i>She labelled the parcels neatly writing the addresses in capital letters.</i>
list	Be on a list of products at a specified price. <i>The bottom of the line Mercedes lists for 52 050.</i>
mark	Insert punctuation marks into. <i>The examiner may have hundreds of scripts to mark.</i>
nomenclature	The body or system of names used in a particular specialist field. <i>The Linnean system of zoological nomenclature.</i>
note	Make a written note of. <i>He made a note of the appointment.</i>
punctuate	Insert punctuation marks in (text). <i>Style manuals tell you how to punctuate.</i>
punctuation	The marks, such as full stop, comma, and brackets, used in writing to separate sentences and their elements and to clarify meaning. <i>Satisfactory standards of handwriting spelling grammar and punctuation.</i>

- sign** Authorize a document or other written or printed material by attaching a signature.
*A **sign** of the Zodiac.*
- signpost** Indicate a place with a signpost.
*Battle is clearly **signposted** off all the main roads.*
- sorting** The basic cognitive process of arranging into classes or categories.
*The bottleneck in mail delivery is the process of **sorting**.*
- tab** The key on a typewriter or a word processor that causes a tabulation.
*Files with a red **tab** will be stored separately.*
- taxonomy** Practice of classifying plants and animals according to their presumed natural relationships.
*The **taxonomy** of these fossils.*
- terminology** A system of words used to name things in a particular discipline.
*Legal **terminology**.*
- ticket** Issue a ticket or a fine to as a penalty.
*Admission is by **ticket** only.*
