### catalog

Make a catalogue compile a catalogue.

*He found it in the Sears **catalog**.*

### catalogue

Enter an item in a catalogue.

*A mail order **catalogue**.*

### classification

A group of people or things arranged by class or category.

*New **classifications** for drivers of commercial vehicles.*

### clue

A fact or idea that serves to reveal something or solve a problem.

*Archaeological evidence can give **clues** about the past.*

<b><u>connotation</u></b>	The abstract meaning or intension of a term, which forms a principle determining which objects or concepts it applies to. <i>The work functions both by analogy and by <b>connotation</b>.</i>
<b>cue</b>	Sports implement consisting of a tapering rod used to strike a cue ball in pool or billiards. <i>She had not yet been given her <b>cue</b> to come out on to the dais.</i>
<b>diacritical</b>	(of a mark or sign) serving to indicate different pronunciations of a letter above or below which it is written.
<b><u>embody</u></b>	Represent, as of a character on stage. <i>Livius embodied the population of the town.</i>
<b><u>exclamation</u></b>	A loud complaint or protest or reproach. <i>An <b>exclamation</b> of amazement.</i>
<b><u>guiding</u></b>	Showing the way by conducting or leading; imposing direction on. <i>A <b>guiding</b> principle.</i>
<b>hide-and-seek</b>	Go to or towards.
<b><u>index</u></b>	Provide an index to. <i><b>Index</b> the book.</i>
<b>indicant</b>	Something that serves to indicate or suggest. <i>Symptoms are the prime <b>indicants</b> of disease.</i>
<b>indication</b>	Something (as a course of action) that is indicated as expedient or necessary. <i><b>Indications</b> of strain.</i>
<b>label</b>	Assign a label to designate with a label. <i>She <b>labelled</b> the parcels neatly writing the addresses in capital letters.</i>
<b>list</b>	Be on a list of products at a specified price. <i>The bottom of the line Mercedes <b>lists</b> for 52 050.</i>
<b>mark</b>	Insert punctuation marks into. <i>The examiner may have hundreds of scripts to <b>mark</b>.</i>
<b>nomenclature</b>	The body or system of names used in a particular specialist field. <i>The Linnean system of zoological <b>nomenclature</b>.</i>
<b>note</b>	Make a written note of. <i>He made a <b>note</b> of the appointment.</i>
<b>punctuate</b>	Insert punctuation marks in (text). <i>Style manuals tell you how to <b>punctuate</b>.</i>
<b>punctuation</b>	The marks, such as full stop, comma, and brackets, used in writing to separate sentences and their elements and to clarify meaning. <i>Satisfactory standards of handwriting spelling grammar and <b>punctuation</b>.</i>



<b>sign</b>	<p>Authorize a document or other written or printed material by attaching a signature.</p> <p>A <b>sign</b> of the Zodiac.</p>
<b>signpost</b>	<p>Indicate a place with a signpost.</p> <p>Battle is clearly <b>signposted</b> off all the main roads.</p>
<b>sorting</b>	<p>The basic cognitive process of arranging into classes or categories.</p> <p>The bottleneck in mail delivery is the process of <b>sorting</b>.</p>
<b>tab</b>	<p>The key on a typewriter or a word processor that causes a tabulation.</p> <p>Files with a red <b>tab</b> will be stored separately.</p>
<b>taxonomy</b>	<p>Practice of classifying plants and animals according to their presumed natural relationships.</p> <p>The <b>taxonomy</b> of these fossils.</p>
<b>terminology</b>	<p>A system of words used to name things in a particular discipline.</p> <p>Legal <b>terminology</b>.</p>
<b>ticket</b>	<p>Issue a ticket or a fine to as a penalty.</p> <p>Admission is by <b>ticket</b> only.</p>
