- bespoke** Making or selling bespoke goods especially clothing.
*Group tours and **bespoke** itineraries.*
- bespoken** (of clothing) custom-made.
- tailor-made** Custom-made.
- trim** Of places; characterized by order and neatness; free from disorder.
*A **trim** little villa.*

- *A neat tailored suit.*
- *A tailored charcoal-grey suit.*
- *Tailored curtains.*



Associations of "Tailored" (30 Words)

adapted	Changed in order to improve or made more fit for a particular purpose. <i>Seeds precisely adapted to the area.</i>
aligning	Causing to fall into line or into position.
<u>alignment</u>	Arrangement in a straight line or in correct relative positions. <i>Four railways all on different alignments.</i>
applicable	Relevant or appropriate. <i>Gave applicable examples to support her argument.</i>
<u>apposite</u>	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>The observations are apposite to the discussion.</i>
clearly	Without doubt or question. <i>Her ability to write clearly.</i>
defined	Clearly characterized or delimited. <i>Lost in a maze of words both defined and undefined.</i>

desirability	Attractiveness to the opposite sex. <i>We agree on the desirability of a negotiated settlement.</i>
egregious	Remarkably good. <i>Egregious abuses of copyright.</i>
especial	Surpassing what is common or usual or expected. <i>These traditions are of especial interest to feminists.</i>
fit	Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired. <i>The landlord had not seen anyone fitting that description.</i>
fur	A coat cape or similar garment made of fur. <i>A long lean muscular cat with sleek fur.</i>
hairdressing	The occupation of cutting and styling hair. <i>Courses in beauty and hairdressing.</i>
just	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>She s just coming.</i>
justification	The action or manner of justifying a line of type or piece of text. <i>The justification of barbarous means by holy ends.</i>
neat	Tending to disregard specifics for the sake of convenience; facile. <i>Took his whiskey neat.</i>
notably	To a remarkable degree or extent. <i>A diet low in animal fat protects against potentially fatal diseases notably diabetes.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.</i>
particularly	Uniquely or characteristically- John Knowles. <i>Particularly able students.</i>
pertinence	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
proper	Thoroughly. <i>Proper manners.</i>
propriety	The details or rules of behaviour conventionally considered to be correct. <i>They questioned the propriety of certain investments made by the council.</i>
rearrange	Change (the position, time, or order of something). <i>Rearrange the furniture in my room.</i>
shave	The act of removing hair with a razor. <i>They shaved profit margins.</i>
shear	Cut or cut through with shears. <i>Shear sheep.</i>

- special** A person assigned to a special duty a special constable or special correspondent.
*The **special** features of a computer.*
- especially** For a special purpose.
*A new coat and hat bought **especially**.*
- specifically** In distinction from others.
*Censorship or more **specifically** the banning of books is a threat to the freedom of speech.*
- trim** Adjust the balance of a ship or aircraft by rearranging its cargo or by means of its trim tabs.
***Trim** lumber.*
- whittle** Cut small bits or pare shavings from.
*The shortlist of fifteen was **whittled** down to five.*
