**dispossess**Deprive of the possession of real estate.

A champion of the poor and the **dispossess**ed.

earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages.

The dollars can be placed on deposit and **earn** interest.



fetch The action of fetching.

The old print **fetch**ed a high price at the auction.

forfeiture

The loss or giving up of something as a penalty for wrongdoing.

Magistrates ordered the **forfeiture** of his computer.

Take vengeance on or get even.

I ll **get** the door.

have Have gained a qualification.

Are you going to **have** a party.

hold Have room for hold without crowding.

Hold hold he cried.

holder A smallholder.

I replaced the phone in its **holder**.

loot Informal terms for money.

Police confronted the protestors who were **loot**ing shops.

**obtain** Come into possession of.

How did you **obtain** the visa.

own Have ownership or possession of.

His father **own**s a restaurant.

**picking**The act of picking crops or fruit or hops etc.

He sent the first **picking** of berries to the market.

**possession** The trait of resolutely controlling your own behavior.

The book came into my **possession**.

Obtain (someone) as a prostitute for another person.

procure

Food procured for the rebels.

Shares or investments in property.

That hat is my **property**.

**purchase** Something acquired by purchase.

He could get no **purchase** on the situation.

Fill or close tightly with or as if with a plug.

Made a **secure** place for himself in his field.
