Take or seize (someone's property) with authority. The government confiscate d his property early in the war.
Keep from having, keeping, or obtaining. The city was deprive d of its water supplies.
Deprive of the possession of real estate. A champion of the poor and the dispossess ed.
Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. The dollars can be placed on deposit and earn interest.



fetch	The action of fetching. The old print fetch ed a high price at the auction.
forfeiture	The loss or giving up of something as a penalty for wrongdoing. Magistrates ordered the forfeiture of his computer.
get	Take vengeance on or get even. I ll get the door.
have	Have gained a qualification. Are you going to have a party.
hold	Have room for hold without crowding. <i>Hold hold</i> he cried.
holder	A smallholder. I replaced the phone in its holder .
loot	Informal terms for money. Police confronted the protestors who were loot ing shops.
obtain	Come into possession of. How did you obtain the visa.
<u>own</u>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>His father owns a restaurant.</i>
picking	The act of picking crops or fruit or hops etc. <i>He sent the first picking of berries to the market.</i>
possession	The trait of resolutely controlling your own behavior. <i>The book came into my possession</i> .
procure	Obtain (someone) as a prostitute for another person. Food procure d for the rebels.
property	Shares or investments in property. That hat is my property .
purchase	Something acquired by purchase. <i>He could get no purchase on the situation.</i>
<u>secure</u>	Fill or close tightly with or as if with a plug. Made a secure place for himself in his field.
wangle	An act or an instance of obtaining something by persuasion or clever manipulation. I think we should be able to wangle it so that you can start tomorrow.
