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Associations of "Take advantage" (30 Words)

acquire	Take on a certain form, attribute, or aspect. <i>He acquired a reputation for scrupulous honesty.</i>
acquired	Gotten through environmental forces. <i>Acquired characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.</i>
acquirement	The action of acquiring something. <i>The acquirement of self control.</i>
acquisition	The act of contracting or assuming or acquiring possession of something. <i>A recent acquisition by the museum.</i>
<u>belongings</u>	A person’s movable possessions. <i>She didn t have much baggage with her as most of her belongings had been sent ahead by sea.</i>
bring	Go or come after and bring or take back. <i>Can I bring my cousin to the dinner.</i>
broach	Bring up a topic for discussion. <i>He watched a pot boy broach a new cask.</i>
<u>buccaneer</u>	Live like a buccaneer. <i>The company might be a target for an individual buccaneer seeking power and prestige.</i>
<u>confiscate</u>	Take or seize (someone’s property) with authority. <i>The government confiscated his property early in the war.</i>
<u>deprive</u>	Keep from having, keeping, or obtaining. <i>The city was deprived of its water supplies.</i>
dispossess	Deprive of the possession of real estate. <i>A champion of the poor and the dispossessed.</i>
<u>earn</u>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>The dollars can be placed on deposit and earn interest.</i>

fetch	The action of fetching. <i>The old print fetched a high price at the auction.</i>
forfeiture	The loss or giving up of something as a penalty for wrongdoing. <i>Magistrates ordered the forfeiture of his computer.</i>
get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>I ll get the door.</i>
have	Have gained a qualification. <i>Are you going to have a party.</i>
hold	Have room for hold without crowding. <i>Hold hold he cried.</i>
holder	A smallholder. <i>I replaced the phone in its holder.</i>
loot	Informal terms for money. <i>Police confronted the protestors who were looting shops.</i>
obtain	Come into possession of. <i>How did you obtain the visa.</i>
own	Have ownership or possession of. <i>His father owns a restaurant.</i>
picking	The act of picking crops or fruit or hops etc. <i>He sent the first picking of berries to the market.</i>
possession	The trait of resolutely controlling your own behavior. <i>The book came into my possession.</i>
procure	Obtain (someone) as a prostitute for another person. <i>Food procured for the rebels.</i>
property	Shares or investments in property. <i>That hat is my property.</i>
purchase	Something acquired by purchase. <i>He could get no purchase on the situation.</i>
secure	Fill or close tightly with or as if with a plug. <i>Made a secure place for himself in his field.</i>
wangle	An act or an instance of obtaining something by persuasion or clever manipulation. <i>I think we should be able to wangle it so that you can start tomorrow.</i>
