| apportion | Give out as one’s portion or share. <i>They did not apportion blame or liability to any one individual.</i> |
| arrive | Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. <i>She arrived home at 7 o clock.</i> |
| bring | Go or come after and bring or take back. <i>Bring comments.</i> |
| broach | Raise (a difficult subject) for discussion. <i>He broached the subject he had been avoiding all evening.</i> |
| deprivation | The disadvantage that results from losing something. <i>Rural households could escape the worst deprivations of the towns.</i> |
| deprive | Depose (someone, especially a member of the clergy) from office. <i>The Archbishop deprived a considerable number of puritan clergymen.</i> |
| distribution | The spatial or geographic property of being scattered about over a range, area, or volume. <i>An established distribution channel.</i> |
| division | A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>The division of his estates between the two branches of his family.</i> |
| entree | The principal dish of a meal. <i>She made a graceful entree into the ballroom.</i> |
| fetch | The action of fetching. <i>That air of his always fetches women.</i> |
| fractional | Small or tiny in amount. <i>Fractional crystallization.</i> |

| fragment | Break or cause to break into fragments. <i>Small fragments of pottery.</i> |
| fragmentary | Consisting of small disconnected or incomplete parts. <i>Excavations have revealed fragmentary remains of masonry.</i> |
| get | Take vengeance on or get even. <i>You cannot get water out of a stone.</i> |
| half | Half a pint of beer or a similar drink. <i>I am half inclined to believe you.</i> |
| have | Have sex with archaic use. <i>Have you got a job yet.</i> |
| hold | Contain or hold have within. <i>The novel holds many surprises.</i> |
| invulnerable | Immune to attack; impregnable. <i>No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.</i> |
| loot | Stolen money or valuables. <i>A gang looted Rs 1 5 lakh from a passenger.</i> |
| portion | Your overall circumstances or condition in life (including everything that happens to you). <i>Burger joints offering huge portions.</i> |
| possess | Have ownership or possession of. <i>A terrible rage possessed her.</i> |
| private | The lowest rank in the army below lance corporal or private first class. <i>Public figures struggle to maintain a private life.</i> |
| proportion | Give pleasant proportions to. <i>The bleach can be diluted with water in the proportion one part bleach to ten parts water.</i> |
| scarify | Criticize severely and hurtfully. <i>Scarify soil.</i> |
| section | Divide into sections. <i>Nails of round section.</i> |
| share | Have give or receive a share of. <i>Under the proposals investors would pay a greater share of the annual fees required.</i> |
| slat | Close the slats of windows. <i>Sunlight filtered dustily through the slats of the door.</i> |
| uppermost | At or to the highest or most important position. <i>Investors put environmental concerns uppermost on their list.</i> |
