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## Associations of "Taking advantage of" (30 Words)

<b>accomplishment</b>	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>A poet of considerable <b>accomplishment</b>.</i>
<b>achieve</b>	Successfully bring about or reach (a desired objective or result) by effort, skill, or courage. <i>People striving to <b>achieve</b>.</i>
<b>acquire</b>	Come to have (a particular reputation) as a result of one’s behaviour or activities. <i>You must <b>acquire</b> the rudiments of Greek.</i>
<b>acquisition</b>	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>Western culture places a high value on material <b>acquisition</b>.</i>
<b><u>behalf</u></b>	As the agent of or on someone’s part usually expressed as on behalf of rather than in behalf of. <i>This letter is written on <b>behalf</b> of my client.</i>
<b>benefit</b>	Derive a benefit from. <i>Families on <b>benefit</b>.</i>
<b><u>businessman</u></b>	A person engaged in commercial or industrial business (especially an owner or executive).
<b>convenience</b>	A device or control that is very useful for a particular job. <i>Services should be run to suit the <b>convenience</b> of customers not of staff.</i>
<b>earnings</b>	The excess of revenues over outlays in a given period of time (including depreciation and other non-cash expenses). <i>Export <b>earnings</b>.</i>
<b><u>enchancing</u></b>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Dinah looked <b>enchancing</b>.</i>
<b><u>entrancing</u></b>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>An <b>entrancing</b> smile.</i>

<b>expediency</b>	The quality of being convenient and practical despite possibly being improper or immoral; convenience. <i>An act of political <b>expediency</b>.</i>
<b>fetching</b>	Very attractive; capturing interest. <i>A <b>fetching</b> little garment of pink satin.</i>
<b>flourishing</b>	Developing rapidly and successfully; thriving. <i>A <b>flourishing</b> career.</i>
<b>industrialist</b>	Someone who manages or has significant financial interest in an industrial enterprise. <i>The exploitation of child labour by nineteenth century <b>industrialists</b>.</i>
<b>maximize</b>	Make as large or great as possible. <i>The company was aiming to <b>maximize</b> profits.</i>
<b>pecuniary</b>	Relating to or consisting of money. <i>He received thanks but no <b>pecuniary</b> compensation for his services.</i>
<b>possession</b>	(sport) the act of controlling the ball (or puck). <i>They said prayers to protect the people inside the hall from demonic <b>possession</b>.</i>
<b>pro</b>	A professional especially in sport. <i>A <b>pro</b> golfer.</i>
<b>profit</b>	Make a profit gain money or materially. <i>It would <b>profit</b> us to change our plans.</i>
<b>profitable</b>	Beneficial; useful. <i>He d had a <b>profitable</b> day.</i>
<b>prosperous</b>	Bringing wealth and success. <i>A <b>prosperous</b> moment to make a decision.</i>
<b>purchase</b>	Something acquired by purchase. <i>They closed the <b>purchase</b> with a handshake.</i>
<b>sake</b>	Used to indicate something that is done as an end in itself rather than to achieve some other purpose. <i>Died for the <b>sake</b> of his country.</i>
<b>sideways</b>	At an angle. <i>The car slipped <b>sideways</b> into the ditch.</i>
<b>successful</b>	Having achieved fame, wealth, or social status. <i>Marketing of Japanese products has been highly <b>successful</b>.</i>
<b>thing</b>	An example or type of something. <i>You won t find me smoking those filthy <b>things</b>.</i>

- thriving** Prosperous and growing; flourishing.  
*Did a **thriving** business in orchids.*
- wangle** Tamper, with the purpose of deception.  
*A rather clever **wangle** on the part of some of the folk at the office.*
- winning** Succeeding with great difficulty.
