access	Reach or gain access to. <i>How does one access the attic in this house.</i>
admission	The fee charged for admission. <i>There was a substantial reduction in hospital admissions.</i>
admittance	The right to enter. <i>People were unable to gain admittance to the hall.</i>
aperture	An opening, hole, or gap. <i>The bell ropes passed through apertures in the ceiling.</i>
disembodied	Not having a material body. <i>A disembodied ghost.</i>
enchancing	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Dinah looked enchancing.</i>
entrance	An opening, such as a door, passage, or gate, that allows access to a place. <i>About fifty people attempted to gain entrance.</i>
entree	The right to enter. <i>She made a graceful entree into the ballroom.</i>
entry	The point at which a particular performer in an ensemble starts or resumes playing or singing. <i>The door was locked but he forced an entry.</i>
fetching	Very attractive; capturing interest. <i>A fetching little garment of pink satin.</i>
furnishing	Denoting fabrics used for curtains or upholstery. <i>A large room filled with fine ornaments and luxurious furnishings.</i>
indoor	Relating to sports played indoors. <i>The national indoor champion.</i>
indoors	The area or space inside a building. <i>They went indoors and explored the house.</i>

inland	Carried on within the limits of a country; domestic. <i>The inland port of Gloucester.</i>
inmost	Being deepest within the self.
inner	Innermost or essential. <i>A test of inner strength.</i>
inside	Being or applying to the inside of a building. <i>We walked inside.</i>
interior	Of or coming from the middle of a region or country. <i>The layer immediately interior to the epidermis.</i>
internal	Located inward- Leonard Bernstein- David Denby. <i>The internal contradictions of the theory.</i>
intramural	Taking place within a single educational institution. <i>An intramural haematoma.</i>
inward	Directed or moving inward or toward a center. <i>A graceful inward movement of her wrist.</i>
inwardly	Within the mind. <i>Inwardly she was raging.</i>
lining	The act of attaching an inside lining to a garment or curtain etc. <i>Self clean oven linings.</i>
located	Situated in a particular spot or position. <i>Valuable centrally located urban land.</i>
successful	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. <i>A successful business venture.</i>
therein	(formal) in or into that thing or place. <i>Therein lie all the problems.</i>
trapped	Forced to turn and face attackers. <i>Like a trapped animal.</i>
upstage	Move upstage forcing the other actors to turn away from the audience. <i>When he tried to upstage her she sauntered down to the front of the stage.</i>
winning	Having won. <i>The winning team.</i>
within	Internally or inwardly. <i>Beauty coming from within.</i>
