- returns** A reciprocal group action.

- spoils** The act of stripping and taking by force.
- winnings** Something won (especially money).

<u>sweet</u>	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>The sweet notes of the flute.</i>
winning	Having won. <i>A winning smile.</i>

enchancing	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Enchancing views.</i>
enthralling	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>An enthralling book.</i>
enticing	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>Difficult to say no to an enticing advertisement.</i>
entrancing	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>I find you entrancing.</i>
fetching	Attractive. <i>A fetching little garment of pink satin.</i>
flourishing	Very lively and profitable. <i>Flourishing businesses.</i>
industrialist	A person involved in the ownership and management of industry. <i>The exploitation of child labour by nineteenth century industrialists.</i>
intriguing	Capable of arousing interest or curiosity. <i>Our team came up with some most intriguing finds.</i>
inventory	Make a complete list of. <i>In our warehouse you'll find a large inventory of new and used bicycles.</i>
object	Express or raise an objection or protest or criticism or express dissent. <i>Bryant objects this very circumstance to the authenticity of the Iliad.</i>
objective	The objective case. <i>Examine with high power objective.</i>
possession	The state of having, owning, or controlling something. <i>The landlord wishes to gain possession of the accommodation.</i>
profitable	Beneficial; useful. <i>He'd had a profitable day.</i>
purchase	Obtain by purchase acquire by means of a financial transaction. <i>The victory was purchased by the death of Rhiwallon.</i>
successful	Accomplishing a desired aim or result. <i>A successful actor.</i>

tempting	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>A tempting repast.</i>
thing	Anything used for emphasis. <i>You won't find me smoking those filthy things.</i>
thriving	Very lively and profitable. <i>A thriving tourist center.</i>
used	Having already been used. <i>A used car.</i>
wangle	Manage to obtain (something) by persuading or cleverly manipulating someone. <i>I wangled an invitation to her party.</i>
winning	Money won, especially by gambling. <i>A winning personality.</i>
