Associations of "Tales" (30 Words)

<u>abstraction</u>	The act of withdrawing or removing something. <i>A series of black and white abstractions.</i>
creativity	The ability to create.
daydream	Indulge in a daydream. <i>Stop daydreaming and pay attention.</i>
<u>dreamer</u>	A person who dreams or is dreaming. <i>A rebellious young dreamer.</i>
fairy	Offensive term for an openly homosexual man. <i>Fairy gold.</i>
fancied	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A fancied wrong.</i>
fanciful	Highly ornamental or imaginative in design. <i>A fanciful mind.</i>
<u>fantasy</u>	Imagination unrestricted by reality. <i>It is ludicrous to fantasy disinventing the hydrogen bomb.</i>
fiction	A literary work based on the imagination and not necessarily on fact. <i>The notion of the country being a democracy is a polite fiction.</i>
genie	An invisible spirit mentioned in the Koran and believed by Muslims to inhabit the earth and influence mankind by appearing in the form of humans or animals.
gnome	A small garden ornament in the form of a bearded man with a pointed hat. <i>A grizzled gnome of a man.</i>
idealist	Someone guided more by ideals than by practical considerations. <i>Hegel described himself as an absolute idealist.</i>
idealistic	Of or relating to the philosophical doctrine of the reality of ideas. <i>Idealistic young doctors who went to work for the rebels.</i>

illusion	A false idea or belief. <i>They have the illusion that I am very wealthy.</i>
illusive	Based on or having the nature of an illusion. <i>An illusive haven.</i>
illusory	Based on illusion; not real. <i>Secret activities offer presidents the alluring but often illusory promise that they can achieve foreign policy goals without the bothersome debate and open decision that are staples of democracy.</i>
<u>imaginary</u>	Existing only in the imagination. <i>A small child s imaginary friends.</i>
improbable	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>The characters have improbable names.</i>
legerdemain	Skilful use of one's hands when performing conjuring tricks. <i>A classic piece of management legerdemain.</i>
magic	Move change or create by or as if by magic. <i>His parents bought him a magic set for Christmas.</i>
<u>mythical</u>	Based on or told of in traditional stories; lacking factual basis or historical validity. <i>Mythical centaurs.</i>
necromancy	The supposed practice of communicating with the dead, especially in order to predict the future. <i>Alchemy necromancy and other magic practices.</i>
<u>props</u>	Proper respect. <i>Certain sectors of the music fraternity still refuse to give him props.</i>
<u>surreal</u>	Having the qualities of surrealism bizarre. <i>As irrational and surreal as a dream.</i>
sylph	An imaginary spirit of the air. <i>An oh so slim sylph dressed in a black leotard.</i>
<u>talisman</u>	An object, typically an inscribed ring or stone, that is thought to have magic powers and to bring good luck. <i>He s a quiet man off the field but on it he s our talisman.</i>
<u>tangential</u>	Of superficial relevance if any. <i>A tangential remark.</i>
thaumaturgy	Any art that invokes supernatural powers. <i>He attracts people by his thaumaturgy.</i>
<u>visionary</u>	Existing only in a vision or in the imagination. <i>He is a visionary keen on policy making.</i>
