## Talisman as a Noun

### Definitions of "Talisman" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “talisman” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An object, typically an inscribed ring or stone, that is thought to have magic powers and to bring good luck.*
- *A trinket or piece of jewelry usually hung about the neck and thought to be a magical protection against evil or disease.*
- *A person regarded as representing and inspiring a particular group.*



## Synonyms of "Talisman" as a noun (8 Words)

- amulet** A trinket or piece of jewelry usually hung about the neck and thought to be a magical protection against evil or disease.
- charm** A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles specifically charm quarks charm antiquarks and hadrons containing these expressed as a quantum number.  
*The **charm** begins with ritual instructions.*
- fetish** A form of sexual desire in which gratification depends to an abnormal degree on some object or item of clothing or part of the body.  
*The western **fetish** for all things North African.*
- idol** A material effigy that is worshipped.  
*A soccer **idol**.*
- juju** The power associated with a juju.
- mascot** A person or thing that is supposed to bring good luck, especially one linked to a particular organization or event.  
*The team's dolphin **mascot**.*
- phylactery** (Judaism) either of two small leather cases containing texts from the Hebrew Scriptures (known collectively as tefillin); traditionally worn (on the forehead and the left arm) by Jewish men during morning prayer.
- totem** A clan or tribe identified by their kinship to a common totemic object.  
*Other radical groups look to the party as a **totem** of the anti austerity movement.*



### **Usage Examples of "Talisman" as a noun**

- *He's a quiet man off the field, but on it he's our talisman.*
- *A dolphin talisman would ensure a safe journey on land or at sea.*
- *Those rings, so fresh and gleaming, were their talismans.*

<b>amulet</b>	An ornament or small piece of jewellery thought to give protection against evil, danger, or disease.
<b>bewitchment</b>	A magical spell.
<b>charmed</b>	Strongly attracted. <i>A <b>charmed</b> quark.</i>
<b><u>conjure</u></b>	Engage in plotting or enter into a conspiracy, swear together. <i>She had forgotten how to <b>conjure</b> up the image of her mother's face.</i>
<b>coven</b>	A group or meeting of witches. <i><b>Covens</b> of militants within the party.</i>
<b>crone</b>	An ugly old woman.
<b>disbelieve</b>	Reject as false; refuse to accept. <i>To <b>disbelieve</b> is as much an act of faith as belief.</i>
<b>divination</b>	The art or gift of prophecy (or the pretense of prophecy) by supernatural means. <i>The mediums are hired to perform <b>divinations</b>.</i>
<b>genie</b>	(Islam) an invisible spirit mentioned in the Koran and believed by Muslims to inhabit the earth and influence mankind by appearing in the form of humans or animals.
<b>legerdemain</b>	An illusory feat; considered magical by naive observers. <i>A classic piece of management <b>legerdemain</b>.</i>
<b>magic</b>	An illusory feat considered magical by naive observers. <i>A <b>magical</b> spell.</i>
<b><u>magical</u></b>	Beautiful or delightful in a way that seems removed from everyday life. <i>A <b>magical</b> spell.</i>
<b><u>magician</u></b>	A person with magical powers. <i>He was the <b>magician</b> of the fan belt.</i>
<b><u>mystic</u></b>	Relating to or resembling mysticism. <i><b>Mystical</b> theories about the securities market.</i>
<b><u>myth</u></b>	A traditional story accepted as history; serves to explain the world view of a people. <i>Attacking the party's irresponsible <b>myths</b> about privatization.</i>
<b>necromancer</b>	A person who practises necromancy; a wizard or magician. <i>Dr Faustus a <b>necromancer</b> of the 16th century.</i>

<b>necromancy</b>	The supposed practice of communicating with the dead, especially in order to predict the future. <i>Alchemy <b>necromancy</b> and other magic practices.</i>
<b><u>potion</u></b>	A medicinal or magical or poisonous beverage. <i>A healing <b>potion</b>.</i>
<b>seance</b>	A meeting of spiritualists. <i>The <b>seance</b> was held in the medium s parlor.</i>
<b><u>shaman</u></b>	In societies practicing shamanism one acting as a medium between the visible and spirit worlds practices sorcery for healing or divination.
<b>sleight</b>	Adroitness in using the hands. <i>Except by <b>sleight</b> of logic the two positions cannot be harmonized.</i>
<b><u>sorcerer</u></b>	One who practices magic or sorcery.
<b>sorcery</b>	The use of magic, especially black magic.
<b><u>spell</u></b>	Place under a spell. <i>A <b>spell</b> of work.</i>
<b>thaumaturgy</b>	Any art that invokes supernatural powers. <i>He attracts people by his <b>thaumaturgy</b>.</i>
<b><u>trance</u></b>	Put into a trance. <i>In the Hades Warehouse there s the finest in <b>trance</b> and techno.</i>
<b><u>witch</u></b>	A woman who is bewitchingly attractive. <i>Mrs Mucharski had somehow <b>witched</b> the house.</i>
<b><u>witchcraft</u></b>	The practice of magic, especially for evil purposes; the use of spells. <i>Children and goods were believed to be vulnerable to the <b>witchcraft</b> of jealous neighbours.</i>
<b><u>wizard</u></b>	(in legends and fairy tales) a man who has magical powers. <i><b>Wizardly</b> powers.</i>
<b>wizardry</b>	Great skill in a particular area of activity. <i>Pless s <b>wizardry</b> with a bat.</i>
