amenable	Disposed or willing to conform. <i>Someone amenable to the instruction of others.</i>
chasten	Restrain. <i>The director was somewhat chastened by his recent flops.</i>
civilize	Raise from a barbaric to a civilized state. <i>Both countries feel they have a mission to civilize the world.</i>
compliant	Disposed to agree with others or obey rules, especially to an excessive degree; acquiescent. <i>A compliant labour force.</i>
controllable	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>The glider was fully controllable.</i>
controlled	Having been limited in intensity or level; kept in check. <i>The country s tightly controlled financial markets.</i>
docile	Easily handled or managed. <i>Docile pupils eager for instruction.</i>
doctrinaire	A doctrinaire person. <i>The administration s doctrinaire economic policy.</i>
domestic	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>Domestic issues such as tax rate and highway construction.</i>
domesticate	Adapt (a wild plant or unclaimed land) to the environment. <i>The horse was domesticated a long time ago.</i>
domesticated	(of an animal) tame and kept as a pet or on a farm. <i>Domesticated crops.</i>
dominate	Look down on. <i>The villa dominates the town.</i>
dominated	Harassed by persistent nagging.

dutiful	Motivated by duty rather than desire or enthusiasm. <i>A dutiful visit.</i>
govern	Conduct the policy, actions, and affairs of (a state, organization, or people) with authority. <i>He was incapable of governing the country.</i>
<u>malleable</u>	Easily influenced; pliable. <i>They are as malleable and easily led as sheep.</i>
<u>manageable</u>	Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and manageable.</i>
<u>meek</u>	Very docile- Langston Hughes. <i>She looked meek but had the heart of a lion.</i>
<u>mild</u>	Humble in spirit or manner suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i>A mild sedative.</i>
muted	In a softened tone. <i>Muted trumpets.</i>
<u>obedient</u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>The obedient colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.</i>
restrained	Cool and formal in manner. <i>Restrained in his response.</i>
subdued	(of colour or lighting) soft and restrained. <i>I felt strangely subdued as I drove home.</i>
submissive	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant. <i>Replacing troublemakers with more submissive people.</i>
subservience	Willingness to obey others unquestioningly. <i>Blind subservience to authority.</i>
<u>susceptible</u>	(of a person) easily influenced by feelings or emotions; sensitive. <i>They only do it to tease him he s too susceptible.</i>
tractability	The trait of being easily persuaded.
<u>tractable</u>	(of a situation or problem) easy to deal with. <i>A tractable student.</i>
<u>vulnerable</u>	(of a person) in need of special care, support, or protection because of age, disability, or risk of abuse or neglect. <i>We were in a vulnerable position.</i>
<u>willing</u>	Given or done readily. <i>He was quite willing to compromise.</i>
