<a href="#">amenable</a>	Disposed or willing to conform. <i>Someone <b>amenable</b> to the instruction of others.</i>
<b>chasten</b>	Restrain. <i>The director was somewhat <b>chastened</b> by his recent flops.</i>
<b>civilize</b>	Raise from a barbaric to a civilized state. <i>Both countries feel they have a mission to <b>civilize</b> the world.</i>
<b>compliant</b>	Disposed to agree with others or obey rules, especially to an excessive degree; acquiescent. <i>A <b>compliant</b> labour force.</i>
<b>controllable</b>	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>The glider was fully <b>controllable</b>.</i>
<b>controlled</b>	Having been limited in intensity or level; kept in check. <i>The country s tightly <b>controlled</b> financial markets.</i>
<a href="#">docile</a>	Easily handled or managed. <i><b>Docile</b> pupils eager for instruction.</i>
<b>doctrinaire</b>	A doctrinaire person. <i>The administration s <b>doctrinaire</b> economic policy.</i>
<a href="#">domestic</a>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i><b>Domestic</b> issues such as tax rate and highway construction.</i>
<b>domesticate</b>	Adapt (a wild plant or unclaimed land) to the environment. <i>The horse was <b>domesticated</b> a long time ago.</i>
<b>domesticated</b>	(of an animal) tame and kept as a pet or on a farm. <i><b>Domesticated</b> crops.</i>
<b>dominate</b>	Look down on. <i>The villa <b>dominates</b> the town.</i>
<b>dominated</b>	Harassed by persistent nagging.

<b>dutiful</b>	Motivated by duty rather than desire or enthusiasm. <i>A <b>dutiful</b> visit.</i>
<b>govern</b>	Conduct the policy, actions, and affairs of (a state, organization, or people) with authority. <i>He was incapable of <b>governing</b> the country.</i>
<u>malleable</u>	Easily influenced; pliable. <i>They are as <b>malleable</b> and easily led as sheep.</i>
<u>manageable</u>	Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and <b>manageable</b>.</i>
<u>meek</u>	Very docile- Langston Hughes. <i>She looked <b>meek</b> but had the heart of a lion.</i>
<u>mild</u>	Humble in spirit or manner suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i>A <b>mild</b> sedative.</i>
<b>muted</b>	In a softened tone. <i><b>Muted</b> trumpets.</i>
<u>obedient</u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>The <b>obedient</b> colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.</i>
<b>restrained</b>	Cool and formal in manner. <i><b>Restrained</b> in his response.</i>
<b>subdued</b>	(of colour or lighting) soft and restrained. <i>I felt strangely <b>subdued</b> as I drove home.</i>
<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant. <i>Replacing troublemakers with more <b>submissive</b> people.</i>
<b>subservience</b>	Willingness to obey others unquestioningly. <i>Blind <b>subservience</b> to authority.</i>
<u>susceptible</u>	(of a person) easily influenced by feelings or emotions; sensitive. <i>They only do it to tease him he s too <b>susceptible</b>.</i>
<b>tractability</b>	The trait of being easily persuaded.
<u>tractable</u>	(of a situation or problem) easy to deal with. <i>A <b>tractable</b> student.</i>
<u>vulnerable</u>	(of a person) in need of special care, support, or protection because of age, disability, or risk of abuse or neglect. <i>We were in a <b>vulnerable</b> position.</i>
<u>willing</u>	Given or done readily. <i>He was quite <b>willing</b> to compromise.</i>
