Definitions of "Tangible" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “tangible” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Perceptible by the senses especially the sense of touch.*
- *(of especially business assets) having physical substance and intrinsic monetary value.*
- *Perceptible by touch.*
- *Capable of being perceived; especially capable of being handled or touched or felt.*
- *Capable of being treated as fact.*
- *Clear and definite; real.*
- *Having physical substance and intrinsic monetary value.*



Synonyms of "Tangible" as an adjective (32 Words)

actual

Used to emphasize the important aspect of something.
*Rocks and trees the **actual** world.*

appreciable

Large or important enough to be noticed.
***Appreciable** amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.*

clear

Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible.
*A **clear** and present danger.*

clear-cut

Having had all the trees removed at one time.

concrete

Specific; definite.
***Concrete** objects such as trees.*

corporeal

Consisting of material objects.
***Corporeal** suffering.*

definite

Having exact and discernible physical limits or form.
*A **definite** statement of the terms of the will.*

discernible	Capable of being perceived clearly. <i>The skyline is easily discernible even at a distance of several miles.</i>
distinct	Easy to perceive; especially clearly outlined. <i>Noticed a distinct improvement.</i>
<u>evident</u>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>Evident hostility.</i>
hard	Unfortunate or hard to bear. <i>Efforts to turn psychology into hard science.</i>
indisputable	Unable to be challenged or denied. <i>A far from indisputable fact.</i>
intelligible	Able to be understood; comprehensible. <i>Intelligible pronunciation.</i>
<u>manifest</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>Manifest disapproval.</i>
material	Having material or physical form or substance. <i>A material witness.</i>
measurable	Capable of being measured. <i>Objectives should be measurable and achievable.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>It was an obvious remark to make.</i>
<u>palpable</u>	Can be felt by palpation. <i>There was a palpable sense of joy in the air.</i>
perceptible	Capable of being perceived by the mind or senses. <i>A perceptible sense of expectation in the court.</i>
physical	Impelled by physical force especially against resistance. <i>The physical size of a computer.</i>
positive	Having a positive charge. <i>He made a positive identification of a glossy ibis.</i>
real	Coinciding with reality F A Olafson. <i>This isn't my real reason for coming.</i>
<u>solid</u>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>Good solid food.</i>
<u>striking</u>	(of an employee) on strike. <i>It is striking that no research into the problem is being carried out.</i>
<u>substantial</u>	Strongly built or made. <i>Spirits are shadowy human beings substantial.</i>

tactile	Producing a sensation of touch. <i>She had a distinct almost tactile memory of the girl fleeing.</i>
touchable	Perceptible by the senses especially the sense of touch.
undoubted	Not questioned or doubted by anyone. <i>Her undoubted ability.</i>
unmistakable	Clearly evident to the mind. <i>The unmistakable sound of his laughter.</i>
verifiable	Capable of being verified. <i>There is not a single verifiable fact.</i>
well defined	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
well documented	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.



Usage Examples of "Tangible" as an adjective

- *The emphasis is now on tangible results.*
- *Tangible property like real estate.*

- *Tangible evidence.*
- *Skin with a tangible roughness.*
- *Tangible assets such as machinery.*
- *The atmosphere of neglect and abandonment was almost tangible.*



Associations of "Tangible" (30 Words)

- accuracy** The degree to which the result of a measurement, calculation, or specification conforms to the correct value or a standard.
*The **accuracy** of radiocarbon dating.*
- apparent** Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.
*For all his **apparent** wealth he had no money to pay the rent.*
- appreciable** Large or important enough to be noticed.
*Pupils may have to travel **appreciable** distances.*

<u>certainty</u>	A fact that is definitely true or an event that is definitely going to take place. <i>She knew with absolute certainty that they were dead.</i>
<u>concrete</u>	Cover an area with concrete. <i>Concrete the walls.</i>
conformation	Acting according to certain accepted standards. <i>We've been looking for stock with good overall conformation.</i>
<u>conspicuous</u>	Obvious to the eye or mind. <i>He was very thin with a conspicuous Adam's apple.</i>
detectable	Able to be discovered or identified. <i>The virus is not yet detectable in the blood.</i>
discernible	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>The skyline is easily discernible even at a distance of several miles.</i>
distinctly	In a distinct and distinguishable manner. <i>Reading each word slowly and distinctly.</i>
essential	Fundamental or central to the nature of something or someone. <i>The essential weakness of the plaintiff's case.</i>
identifiable	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. <i>There are no easily identifiable features on the shoreline.</i>
<u>manifest</u>	Record in a ship's manifest. <i>The buildings in Rome manifest a high level of architectural sophistication.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>Walked with a marked limp.</i>
meaningful	Having meaning. <i>Meaningful glances and repressed passion.</i>
<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>Noticeable grey hairs.</i>
observable	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i>Observable differences.</i>
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>Obvious errors.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<u>palpable</u>	Capable of being perceived; especially capable of being handled or touched or felt. <i>Felt sudden anger in a palpable wave.</i>
perceptible	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>A perceptible sense of expectation in the court.</i>

positivistic	Of or relating to positivism.
<u>practical</u>	Having or put to a practical purpose or use. <i>Steve ll fix it he s quite practical.</i>
real	Really very. <i>There is a real danger of civil war.</i>
<u>recognizable</u>	Capable of being recognized. <i>There was no recognizable photograph of him.</i>
sensible	Done or chosen in accordance with wisdom or prudence; likely to be of benefit. <i>Mum always made me have sensible shoes.</i>
<u>substantial</u>	Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary-Shakespeare. <i>The wind was violent and felt substantial enough to lean against.</i>
<u>substantive</u>	(of a dye) not needing a mordant. <i>There is no substantive evidence for the efficacy of these drugs.</i>
tangibility	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<u>visible</u>	Visible imports or exports. <i>The church spire is visible from miles away.</i>
