## Synonyms of "Tantalizing" as an adjective (2 Words)

**tantalising** Arousing desire or expectation for something unattainable or mockingly out of reach.

**tempting** Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire.  
*It is often **tempting** to bring about change rapidly.*

<b>appetite</b>	A feeling of craving something- Granville Hicks. <i>Her <b>appetite</b> for life.</i>

<b>chomp</b>	Munch or chew noisily or vigorously. <i>She <b>chomped</b> on a roll.</i>
<b><u>craving</u></b>	A powerful desire for something. <i>A <b>craving</b> for chocolate.</i>
<b>desire</b>	Something that is desired. <i>There had been a time years ago when he had <b>desired</b> her.</i>
<b>eat</b>	Eat a meal take a meal. <i>He was <b>eating</b> a hot dog.</i>
<b>epicurean</b>	Of Epicurus or epicureanism. <i>An <b>epicurean</b> banquet.</i>
<b>famish</b>	Be extremely hungry. <i>Many <b>famished</b> in the countryside during the drought.</i>
<b>glutton</b>	An excessively greedy eater. <i>He s a <b>glutton</b> for adventure.</i>
<b>gluttonous</b>	Excessively greedy. <i>A <b>gluttonous</b> cigar smoking capitalist.</i>
<b>gourmand</b>	A connoisseur of good food; a gourmet.
<b>greedy</b>	Wanting to eat or drink more than one can reasonably consume. <i><b>Greedy</b> for money and power.</i>
<b>hedonistic</b>	Engaged in the pursuit of pleasure; sensually self-indulgent. <i>Lives of unending <b>hedonistic</b> delight.</i>
<b>hungry</b>	(usually followed by `for') extremely desirous. <i>I always find art galleries <b>hungry</b> work.</i>
<b><u>insatiable</u></b>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>An <b>insatiable</b> demand for old buildings to restore.</i>
<b>lupine</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of wolves.
<b><u>mystery</u></b>	A religious belief based on divine revelation, especially one regarded as beyond human understanding. <i>The 1920s murder <b>mystery</b> The Ghost Train.</i>
<b>porcine</b>	Resembling swine; coarsely gluttonous or greedy. <i>A bald <b>porcine</b> old man.</i>
<b>rapacious</b>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i>A <b>rapacious</b> appetite.</i>
<b><u>ravenous</u></b>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i>A <b>ravenous</b> appetite.</i>
<b>repletion</b>	The state of being satisfactorily full and unable to take on more.

<b>satiety</b>	The state of being satisfactorily full and unable to take on more. <i>A molecule that seems to regulate <b>satiety</b>.</i>
<b><u>starve</u></b>	Force someone out of (a place) or into (a specified state) by starvation. <i>She left her animals to <b>starve</b>.</i>
<b><u>starving</u></b>	Suffering from lack of food. <i>The world's <b>starving</b> children.</i>
<b>taste</b>	Have a distinctive or characteristic taste. <i>Arrogance and lack of <b>taste</b> contributed to his rapid success.</i>
<b>taunt</b>	Provoke or challenge (someone) with insulting remarks. <i>Pupils began <b>taunting</b> her about her weight.</i>
<b>tease</b>	Make fun of or attempt to provoke (a person or animal) in a playful way. <i>The advertisement is intended to <b>tease</b> the customers.</i>
<b>thirst</b>	Feel the need to drink. <i>Tens of thousands died of <b>thirst</b> and starvation.</i>
<b><u>unquenchable</u></b>	Impossible to quench. <i><b>Unquenchable</b> thirst.</i>
<b><u>voracious</u></b>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i><b>Voracious</b> sharks.</i>
