ribbon	A ribbon of a special colour or design awarded as a prize or worn to indicate the holding of an honour especially a small multicoloured piece of ribbon worn in place of the medal it represents. <i>The notes had been typed on an old portable with a faded ribbon.</i>
strap	A strip of metal, often hinged, used to fasten or secure something. <i>Her bra strap.</i>
string	The stringed instruments in an orchestra. <i>She wore a string of agates round her throat.</i>
stripe	A type or category. <i>A green toad with small black stripes or bars.</i>

tape measure Memory device consisting of a long thin plastic strip coated with iron oxide; used to record audio or video signals or to store computer information.

tape recording A recording made on magnetic tape.

tapeline Measuring instrument consisting of a narrow strip (cloth or metal) marked in inches or centimeters and used for measuring lengths.

taping A recording made on magnetic tape.

close	Change one's body stance so that the forward shoulder and foot are closer to the intended point of impact. <i>Management closed ranks.</i>
cordon	Prevent access to or from an area or building by surrounding it with police or other guards. <i>The city centre was cordoned off after fires were discovered in two stores.</i>
fasten	Become fixed or fastened. <i>His gaze was fastened on his daughter.</i>
fence	Enclose with a fence. <i>After stealing your ring he didn't even know how to fence it.</i>

seal	Close with or as if with a seal. <i>Seal the letter.</i>
secure	Succeed in obtaining (something), especially with difficulty. <i>Doors are likely to be well secured at night.</i>
shut	Move so that an opening or passage is obstructed make shut. <i>He was opening and shutting his mouth.</i>
stick	Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist separation. <i>Stick the corner of the sheet under the mattress.</i>
strap	Tie with a strap. <i>The children were strapped into their car seats.</i>

<u>adherence</u>	The property of sticking together (as of glue and wood) or the joining of surfaces of different composition. <i>He moved to Avignon and won the adherence of the French king.</i>
<u>adhesion</u>	A fibrous band of scar tissue that binds together normally separate anatomical structures. <i>Endoscopic surgery for pelvic adhesions.</i>
<u>adhesive</u>	Tending to adhere. <i>Tile adhesive.</i>
<u>audio</u>	An audible acoustic wave frequency. <i>They always raise the audio for commercials.</i>
camcorder	A portable combined video camera and video recorder.

glue	Be fixed as if by glue. <i>The wood is cut into pieces which are then glued together.</i>
glutinous	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>Glutinous mud.</i>
gum	Cover with gum or glue. <i>If you gum the tape it is stronger.</i>
mucous	Of or secreting or covered with or resembling mucus. <i>Mucous tissue.</i>
pitchy	Of the blackest black; similar to the color of jet or coal.
playback	Electronic equipment comprising the part of a tape recorder that reproduces the recorded material. <i>The instant playback facility.</i>
primer	A molecule that serves as a starting material for a polymerization process. <i>New plaster should be treated with a primer.</i>
recorder	An apparatus for recording sound, pictures, or data. <i>A cockpit voice recorder.</i>
slimy	Repellently smooth and obsequious. <i>A slimy little liar.</i>
sticker	An adhesive label or notice, generally printed or illustrated. <i>A disabled sticker for our car.</i>
sticky	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>Sticky cakes and pastries.</i>
studio	A studio flat. <i>Mostly the painting is done in the studio working from drawings.</i>
tacky	(of a glutinous liquid such as paint) not completely dried and slightly sticky to the touch. <i>The paint was still tacky.</i>

taping	A recording made on magnetic tape.
tv	Broadcasting visual images of stationary or moving objects - Ernie Kovacs. <i>The British call a tv set a telly.</i>
vcr	A magnetic tape recorder for recording (and playing back) TV programs.
video	Film with a video camera. Video equipment.
viscid	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>The viscid mucus lining of the intestine.</i>
<u>viscous</u>	Having a relatively high resistance to flow. Viscous lava.
