Associations of "Tapped" (30 Words)

bang	Leap jerk bang. <i>She banged into some shelves in the darkness.</i>
botch	Make a mess of, destroy or ruin. <i>He was accused of botching the job.</i>
bungle	Make a mess of, destroy or ruin. <i>It emerged that forensic police had bungled in gathering the evidence.</i>
caress	A gentle affectionate stroking (or something resembling it). <i>He caressed her face.</i>
crackle	Having the surface decorated with a network of fine cracks as in crackleware. <i>The blazing sun crackled the desert sand.</i>
dab	Press against (something) lightly several times with a piece of absorbent material in order to clean or dry it or to apply a substance. <i>She licked a dab of chocolate from her finger.</i>
ding	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were dinging softly.</i>
door	A room that is entered via a door. <i>He slammed the door as he left.</i>
encouraged	Inspired with confidence.
friction	Conflict or animosity caused by a clash of wills, temperaments, or opinions. <i>A considerable amount of friction between father and son.</i>
fumble	(in ball games) fail to catch or field (the ball) cleanly. <i>He fumbled towards the door.</i>
hear	Examine or hear evidence or a case by judicial process. <i>The jury had heard all the evidence.</i>
hearing	The act of hearing attentively. <i>The court may stay execution pending a hearing.</i>

hit	Hit the intended target or goal. <i>He came all the way around on Williams hit.</i>
<u>intercept</u>	An act or instance of intercepting something. <i>The fighter plane was ordered to intercept an aircraft that had entered the country's airspace.</i>
jingle	A short slogan, verse, or tune designed to be easily remembered, especially as used in advertising. <i>He makes up advertising jingles.</i>
knock	Knock against with force or violence. <i>The tornado knocked a tree on to a house.</i>
<u>lightning</u>	A flash or discharge of lightning. <i>A lightning cure for his hangover.</i>
<u>onomatopoeia</u>	The use of onomatopoeia for literary effect.
pang	A sharp spasm of pain. <i>The snack bar will keep those hunger pangs at bay.</i>
pat	Pat or squeeze fondly or playfully especially under the chin. <i>Pat him on the shoulder.</i>
ping	Hit with a pinging noise. <i>The car pinged when I put in low octane gasoline.</i>
rap	A type of popular music of US black origin in which words are recited rapidly and rhythmically over an instrumental backing. <i>He raps under the name of Mr T.</i>
<u>rub</u>	Reproduce the design of a sepulchral brass or a stone by rubbing paper laid on it with coloured wax pencil or chalk etc. <i>He will be using coffee in a rub for a rack of lamb.</i>
<u>slam</u>	Dance the slam dance. <i>The new TV soap was slammed as being cynical and irresponsible.</i>
spoil	The act of spoiling something by causing damage to it. <i>The looters carried their spoils away.</i>
<u>strike</u>	A pitch that passes through the strike zone. <i>The strike lasted more than a month before it was settled.</i>
touch	An act of touching someone or something. <i>Only sight and touch enable us to locate objects in the space around us.</i>
wiretap	Tap a telephone or telegraph wire to get information. <i>The government illegally wiretapped the lawyers.</i>
