## Synonyms of "Tasteful" as an adjective (35 Words)

<b>aesthetic</b>	Aesthetically pleasing. <i>The law applies to both functional and <b>aesthetic</b> objects.</i>
<b>appropriate</b>	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc. <i>It seems that an apology is <b>appropriate</b>.</i>
<b>artistic</b>	Satisfying aesthetic standards and sensibilities. <i>Computer programs which produce <b>artistic</b> designs.</i>
<b>attractive</b>	Relating to attraction between physical objects. <i>An <b>attractive</b> opportunity.</i>
<b>beautiful</b>	Highly enjoyable. <i>She spoke in <b>beautiful</b> English.</i>

<b>becoming</b>	Displaying or setting off to best advantage. <i>A <b>becoming</b> new shade of rose.</i>
<b>charming</b>	(of a person or their manner) very polite, friendly, and likeable. <i>A <b>charming</b> little cottage.</i>
<b>chic</b>	Elegantly and stylishly fashionable. <i><b>Chic</b> elegance.</i>
<b>correct</b>	Socially right or correct. <i>Make sure you have been given the <b>correct</b> information.</i>
<b>cultivated</b>	Prepared for raising crops by plowing or fertilizing. <i>He was a remarkably <b>cultivated</b> and educated man.</i>
<b>cultured</b>	(of tissue cells, bacteria, etc.) grown or propagated in an artificial medium. <i><b>Cultured</b> tastes.</i>
<b>decorous</b>	According with custom or propriety. <i>The tete a tete was <b>decorous</b> in the extreme.</i>
<b>discriminating</b>	Showing or indicating careful judgment and discernment especially in matters of taste. <i>The <b>discriminating</b> eye of the connoisseur.</i>
<b>elegant</b>	Refined and tasteful in appearance or behavior or style. <i>An <b>elegant</b> comfortable house.</i>
<b>exquisite</b>	Intense or sharp. <i>The most <b>exquisite</b> kind of agony.</i>
<b>fastidious</b>	Very concerned about matters of cleanliness. <i><b>Fastidious</b> about personal cleanliness.</i>
<b>fit</b>	On the point of or strongly disposed. <i>Felt relaxed and <b>fit</b> after their holiday.</i>
<b>fitting</b>	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>It was <b>fitting</b> that his last innings for Middlesex should bring him his highest first class score.</i>
<b>graceful</b>	Having or showing grace or elegance. <i>She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b>.</i>
<b>handsome</b>	(of a number, sum of money, or margin) substantial. <i><b>Handsome</b> cookery books.</i>
<b>harmonious</b>	Free from disagreement or dissent. <i><b>Harmonious</b> music.</i>
<b>in good taste</b>	Holding office.

<b><u>modest</u></b>	Free from pomp or affectation. <i>He was a very <b>modest</b> man refusing to take any credit for the enterprise.</i>
<b>pleasing</b>	Pleasant or agreeable to the senses. <i>The <b>pleasing</b> austerity of the surroundings.</i>
<b><u>polite</u></b>	Having or showing behaviour that is respectful and considerate of other people. <i>The picture outraged <b>polite</b> society.</i>
<b><u>pretty</u></b>	Unexpectedly bad. <i>He led me a <b>pretty</b> dance.</i>
<b>proper</b>	(of a psalm, lesson, prayer, etc.) appointed for a particular day, occasion, or season. <i>He is a <b>proper</b> youth.</i>
<b><u>refined</u></b>	Developed or improved so as to be precise or subtle. <i><b>Refined</b> sugar.</i>
<b><u>respectable</u></b>	Characterized by socially or conventionally acceptable morals. <i>A perfectly <b>respectable</b> pair of pyjamas.</i>
<b>restrained</b>	Not showy or obtrusive. <i>His <b>restrained</b> gentlemanly voice.</i>
<b>seemly</b>	Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous. <i>I felt it was not <b>seemly</b> to observe too closely.</i>
<b><u>sensitive</u></b>	Quick to detect or respond to slight changes, signals, or influences. <i><b>Sensitive</b> skin.</i>
<b>smart</b>	(of clothes) attractively neat and stylish. <i>You look very <b>smart</b>.</i>
<b><u>stylish</u></b>	Having elegance or taste or refinement in manners or dress. <i>A <b>stylish</b> batsman.</i>
<b>tactful</b>	Having or showing a sense of what is fitting and considerate in dealing with others. <i>She was <b>tactful</b> enough not to shatter his illusion.</i>

- admiration** Respect and warm approval.  
*A small token in **admiration** of your works.*
- adorn** Furnish with power or authority; of kings or emperors.  
*Pictures and prints **adorned** his walls.*
- appreciation** Delicate discrimination (especially of aesthetic values).  
*A full **appreciation** of the professor's life and work will be published in the Scotsman tomorrow.*
- artistic** Relating to or characteristic of art or artists.  
***Artistic** workmanship.*
- benediction** A ceremonial prayer invoking divine protection.  
*He eventually wins **benediction**.*
- blessing** Grace said before or after a meal.  
*May God continue to give us his **blessing**.*

<b>brushwork</b>	An artist's distinctive technique of applying paint with a brush. <i>Canvases characterized by lively flowing <b>brushwork</b>.</i>
<b>cultivated</b>	Refined and well educated. <i>He was a remarkably <b>cultivated</b> and educated man.</i>
<b>cultured</b>	Marked by refinement in taste and manners. <i>A <b>cultured</b> and intelligent man.</i>
<b>dandy</b>	Relating to or characteristic of a dandy. <i>His floppy handkerchiefs and antique cufflinks gave him the look of a <b>dandy</b>.</i>
<b>debonair</b>	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. <i>All the men looked <b>debonair</b> and handsome in white tie and tails.</i>
<b>elegance</b>	The quality of being graceful and stylish in appearance or manner. <i>The simplicity and <b>elegance</b> of the solution.</i>
<b>elegant</b>	Graceful and stylish in appearance or manner. <i><b>Elegant</b> handwriting.</i>
<b>enchancingly</b>	In a bewitching manner.
<b>esthetic</b>	Aesthetically pleasing. <i>He despised the <b>esthetic</b> of minimalism.</i>
<b>foppish</b>	Concerned with one's clothes and appearance in an affected and excessive way (typically used of a man). <i>He is <b>foppish</b> and vain.</i>
<b>gentility</b>	Social superiority as demonstrated by polite and respectable manners, behaviour, or appearances. <i>Her grandmother's pretensions to <b>gentility</b>.</i>
<b>glorify</b>	Praise glorify or honor. <i>You are <b>glorifying</b> a rather mediocre building.</i>
<b>grace</b>	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>A beautiful figure which she used in subtle movements of unparalleled <b>grace</b>.</i>
<b>graceful</b>	Characterized by beauty of movement, style, form, or execution. <i>She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b>.</i>
<b>gracefulness</b>	Beautiful carriage.
<b>gracious</b>	Characterized by charm, good taste, and generosity of spirit. <i>Thanks to the <b>gracious</b> gods.</i>
<b>grateful</b>	Affording comfort or pleasure. <i>The <b>grateful</b> shade.</i>

**mincing** Affectedly dainty in manner or gait; effeminate (typically used of a man).  
*I don't have to go through the rest of my life with that **mincing** voice of yours.*

**noble** Especially in former times a person of noble rank or birth.  
*The medieval palace was once owned by a **noble** Florentine family.*

**nobleman** A titled peer of the realm.

**refined** Freed from impurities by processing- Shakespeare.  
*She was delicate and **refined** and unused to hardship.*

**royal** Invested with royal power as symbolized by a crown.  
*The **royal** carriage of a stag's head.*

**sophisticated** Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated.  
***Sophisticated** young socialites.*

**svelte** Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience.  
*She was **svelte** and sophisticated.*
