eatable	Suitable for use as food. <i>Eatable fruits</i> .
<u>edible</u>	Fit or suitable to be eaten. <i>The dinner was barely <b>edible</b></i> .
<u>flavor</u>	Lend flavor to.
<u>flavorful</u>	Full of flavor.
<u>fragrance</u>	A pleasant, sweet smell. The bushes fill the air with <b>fragrance</b> .
fragrant	Having a pleasant or sweet smell. She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.
<u>luscious</u>	Very sexually attractive. The <b>luscious</b> brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.
odoriferous	Morally offensive. An <b>odoriferous</b> pile of fish.
odorous	Having a natural fragrance. Fresh <b>odorous</b> bread.

pudding	Any of various soft thick unsweetened baked dishes. Corn <b>pudding</b> .
<u>saccharine</u>	Excessively sweet or sentimental. <i>Saccharine music</i> .
<u>savory</u>	Pleasing to the sense of taste. A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b> .
<u>scent</u>	Catch the scent of get wind of. The dog having the help of <b>scent</b> as well as of sight.
<u>sour</u>	Make or become sour. The kitchen smelled of <b>sour</b> milk.
<u>spicy</u>	Exciting or entertaining, especially through being mildly indecent. <i>A <b>spicy</b> sauce.</i>
<u>sweet</u>	In an affectionate or loving manner sweet is sometimes a poetic or informal variant of sweetly Shakespeare. The <b>sweet</b> face of a child.
tangy	Tasting sour like a lemon. A <b>tangy</b> salad.
