<u><b>aroma</b></u>	A distinctive odor that is pleasant. <i>The tantalizing <b>aroma</b> of fresh coffee.</i>
<u><b>aromatic</b></u>	An aromatic compound. <i>A massage with <b>aromatic</b> oils.</i>
<b>chocolate</b>	Hot chocolate. <i>A box of <b>chocolates</b>.</i>

<b>comestible</b>	Suitable for use as food. <i>A fridge groaning with <b>comestibles</b>.</i>
<u><b>delectable</b></u>	Capable of arousing desire. <i><b>Delectable</b> handmade chocolates.</i>
<b>delicious</b>	Variety of sweet eating apples. <i><b>Delicious</b> home baked brown bread.</i>
<b>eatable</b>	Suitable for use as food. <i><b>Eatable</b> fruits.</i>
<u><b>edible</b></u>	Fit or suitable to be eaten. <i>The dinner was barely <b>edible</b>.</i>
<u><b>flavor</b></u>	Lend flavor to.
<u><b>flavorful</b></u>	Full of flavor.
<u><b>fragrance</b></u>	A pleasant, sweet smell. <i>The bushes fill the air with <b>fragrance</b>.</i>
<b>fragrant</b>	Having a pleasant or sweet smell. <i>She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.</i>
<u><b>luscious</b></u>	Very sexually attractive. <i>The <b>luscious</b> brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.</i>
<b>odoriferous</b>	Morally offensive. <i>An <b>odoriferous</b> pile of fish.</i>
<b>odorous</b>	Having a natural fragrance. <i>Fresh <b>odorous</b> bread.</i>

<b><u>palatable</u></b>	(of an action or proposal) acceptable or satisfactory. <i>A <b>palatable</b> solution to the problem.</i>
<b>pudding</b>	Any of various soft thick unsweetened baked dishes. <i>Corn <b>pudding</b>.</i>
<b><u>saccharine</u></b>	Excessively sweet or sentimental. <i><b>Saccharine</b> music.</i>
<b><u>savory</u></b>	Pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b>.</i>
<b><u>scent</u></b>	Catch the scent of get wind of. <i>The dog having the help of <b>scent</b> as well as of sight.</i>
<b><u>sour</u></b>	Make or become sour. <i>The kitchen smelled of <b>sour</b> milk.</i>
<b><u>spicy</u></b>	Exciting or entertaining, especially through being mildly indecent. <i>A <b>spicy</b> sauce.</i>
<b><u>sweet</u></b>	In an affectionate or loving manner sweet is sometimes a poetic or informal variant of sweetly Shakespeare. <i>The <b>sweet</b> face of a child.</i>
<b>tangy</b>	Tasting sour like a lemon. <i>A <b>tangy</b> salad.</i>
<b>taste</b>	A kind of sensing distinguishing substances by means of the taste buds. <i>This <b>tastes</b> of nutmeg.</i>
<b>zesty</b>	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
