<b>ambrosial</b>	Extremely pleasing to the taste; sweet and fragrant. <i>Ambrosial</i> food.
<b>appetizing</b>	Appealing to or stimulating the appetite especially in appearance or aroma. The <i>appetizing</i> aroma of sizzling bacon.
<b>aroma</b>	A distinctive odor that is pleasant. The tantalizing <i>aroma</i> of fresh coffee.
<b>aromatic</b>	An aromatic compound. A massage with <i>aromatic</i> oils.
<b>chocolate</b>	Hot chocolate. A box of <i>chocolates</i> .
<b>cloying</b>	Excessively sweet, rich, or sentimental, especially to a disgusting or sickening degree. A romantic rather <i>cloying</i> story.
<b>comestible</b>	Suitable for use as food. A fridge groaning with <i>comestibles</i> .
<b>delectable</b>	Capable of arousing desire. <i>Delectable</i> handmade chocolates.
<b>delicious</b>	Variety of sweet eating apples. <i>Delicious</i> home baked brown bread.
<b>eatable</b>	Suitable for use as food. <i>Eatable</i> fruits.
<b>edible</b>	Fit or suitable to be eaten. The dinner was barely <i>edible</i> .
<b>flavor</b>	Lend flavor to.
<b>flavorful</b>	Full of flavor.
<b>fragrance</b>	A pleasant, sweet smell. The bushes fill the air with <i>fragrance</i> .
<b>fragrant</b>	Having a pleasant or sweet smell. She gathered the <i>fragrant</i> blooms.
<b>luscious</b>	Very sexually attractive. The <i>luscious</i> brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.
<b>odoriferous</b>	Morally offensive. An <i>odoriferous</i> pile of fish.
<b>odorous</b>	Having a natural fragrance. Fresh <i>odorous</i> bread.

<b>palatable</b>	(of an action or proposal) acceptable or satisfactory. <i>A <b>palatable</b> solution to the problem.</i>
<b>pudding</b>	Any of various soft thick unsweetened baked dishes. <i>Corn <b>pudding</b>.</i>
<b>saccharine</b>	Excessively sweet or sentimental. <i><b>Saccharine</b> music.</i>
<b>savory</b>	Pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>A <b>past</b> that was scarcely <b>savory</b>.</i>
<b>scent</b>	Catch the scent of get wind of. <i>The dog having the help of <b>scent</b> as well as of sight.</i>
<b>sour</b>	Make or become sour. <i>The kitchen smelled of <b>sour</b> milk.</i>
<b>spicy</b>	Exciting or entertaining, especially through being mildly indecent. <i>A <b>spicy</b> sauce.</i>
<b>sweet</b>	In an affectionate or loving manner sweet is sometimes a poetic or informal variant of sweetly Shakespeare. <i>The <b>sweet</b> face of a child.</i>
<b>tangy</b>	Tasting sour like a lemon. <i>A <b>tangy</b> salad.</i>
<b>taste</b>	A kind of sensing distinguishing substances by means of the taste buds. <i>This <b>tastes</b> of nutmeg.</i>
<b>zesty</b>	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
