Definitions of "Tattered" as an adjective

- *Ruined or disrupted.*
- *Worn to shreds; or wearing torn or ragged clothing.*
- *Old and torn; in poor condition.*



Synonyms of "Tattered" as an adjective (28 Words)

broken-down	In deplorable condition.
crumbling	Breaking or falling apart into small fragments, especially as part of a process of deterioration. <i>A crumbling empire.</i>
<u>decrepit</u>	Worn and broken down by hard use. <i>A row of decrepit houses.</i>
dilapidated	In deplorable condition. <i>The tank was now rather dilapidated.</i>
faded	Reduced in strength. <i>The faded tones of an old recording.</i>
falling apart at the seams	Decreasing in amount or degree.
falling to pieces	Coming down freely under the influence of gravity.

frayed	(of a person's nerves or temper) showing the effects of strain. <i>The frayed collar of her old coat.</i>
holey	Allowing passage in and out.
in holes	Currently fashionable.
in rags	Holding office.
in ribbons	Holding office.
in tatters	Holding office.
moth-eaten	Showing signs of wear and tear.
on its last legs	Coming after all others in time or space or degree or being the only one remaining.
patched	Mended usually clumsily by covering a hole with a patch. <i>Patched jeans.</i>
ragged	Having an irregular or uneven surface, edge, or outline. <i>A ragged tramp.</i>
scruffy	Shabby and untidy. <i>A teenager in scruffy jeans and a baggy T shirt.</i>
seedy	Full of seeds. <i>A seedy district.</i>
<u>shabby</u>	Mean and unworthy and despicable. <i>Shabby treatment.</i>
<u>shattered</u>	Exhausted. <i>He was said to be absolutely shattered after losing his job.</i>
<u>shoddy</u>	Cheap and shoddy Judith Crist. <i>We re not paying good money for shoddy goods.</i>
<u>sorry</u>	Feeling sad or distressed through sympathy with someone else's misfortune. <i>I m sorry if I was a bit brusque.</i>
tatterdemalion	Worn to shreds; or wearing torn or ragged clothing. <i>A tatterdemalion prince.</i>
<u>threadbare</u>	(of an argument, excuse, idea, etc.) used so often that it is no longer effective. <i>Tatty rooms with threadbare carpets.</i>
tumbledown	(of a building or other structure) falling or fallen into ruin; dilapidated. <i>Tumbledown cottages.</i>
well worn	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

worn

Damaged and shabby as a result of much use.
*His face looked **worn** and old.*
