scruffy Shabby and untidy.

A teenager in **scruffy** jeans and a baggy T shirt.

seedy

Full of seeds.

A seedy district.

shabby Mean and unworthy and despicable.

Shabby treatment.

Exhausted.

shatteredHe was said to be absolutely **shattered** after losing his job.

shoddy Cheap and shoddy Judith Crist.

We re not paying good money for **shoddy** goods.

Feeling sad or distressed through sympathy with someone

sorry else's misfortune.

I m **sorry** if I was a bit brusque.

tatterdemalion Worn to shreds; or wearing torn or ragged clothing.

A tatterdemalion prince.

(of an argument, excuse, idea, etc.) used so often that it is no

threadbare longer effective.

Tatty rooms with threadbare carpets.

(of a building or other structure) falling or fallen into ruin;

tumbledown dilapidated.

Tumbledown cottages.

well worn In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.



worn

Damaged and shabby as a result of much use. *His face looked worn and old.*
