affiliation	The act of becoming formally connected or joined. <i>A valuable financial affiliation.</i>
aggregation	Several things grouped together or considered as a whole. <i>A single dose of aspirin irreversibly inhibits the normal aggregation of platelets.</i>
alliance	A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim. <i>The shifting alliances within a large family.</i>
ally	A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose. <i>He s a good ally in fight.</i>
amateur	Someone who pursues a study or sport as a pastime. <i>It takes five years for a top amateur to become a real Tour de France rider.</i>
assemblage	A machine or object made of pieces fitted together. <i>Some vast assemblage of gears and cogs.</i>
association	A social or business relationship. <i>His association of his father with being beaten was too strong to break.</i>
cliquish	(of a group or place) tending to form or hold exclusive groups and so not welcoming to outsiders. <i>A notoriously cliquish political club.</i>
club	The premises used by a particular club. <i>The club scene.</i>
collaboration	Something produced in collaboration with someone. <i>His recent opera was a collaboration with Lessing.</i>
combination	A sequence of numbers or letters that opens a combination lock. <i>This colour combination is stunningly effective.</i>

committee	In the UK a committee appointed by Parliament to consider the details of proposed legislation. <i>There was much scrutiny in committee.</i>
confederacy	A league or alliance, especially of confederate states. <i>The Italian confederacy known as the Lombard League.</i>
confederation	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. <i>A referendum on confederation.</i>
cooperation	The practice of cooperating. <i>They worked in close cooperation with the British Tourist Authority.</i>
football	Any of various forms of team game involving kicking and in some cases also handling a ball in particular in the UK soccer or in the US American football. <i>Wherever the president travels a military aide stays close with the football.</i>
foursome	Four people considered as a unit. <i>Wales led 3 2 after the morning foursomes.</i>
fraternity	A social club for male undergraduates. <i>Members of the hunting fraternity.</i>
group	Form a group or group together. <i>I ve always been a fan of the guitarists in the group.</i>
guild	A medieval association of craftsmen or merchants, often having considerable power.
league	The contest for the championship of a league. <i>The league championship.</i>
membership	The state of being a member. <i>They polled their membership.</i>
player	A person who plays a musical instrument. <i>He was a major player in setting up the corporation.</i>
quartet	A composition for a quartet. <i>He joined a barbershop quartet.</i>
reunion	A party of former associates who have come together again. <i>She had a tearful reunion with her parents.</i>
rugby	A form of football played with an oval ball.
sextet	A composition for a sextet. <i>The sextet from The Marriage of Figaro.</i>
squad	A small squad of policemen trained to deal with a particular kind of crime. <i>An assassination squad.</i>
