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## Associations of "Team member" (30 Words)

<b>affiliation</b>	The act of becoming formally connected or joined. <i>A valuable financial <b>affiliation</b>.</i>
<b>aggregation</b>	Several things grouped together or considered as a whole. <i>A single dose of aspirin irreversibly inhibits the normal <b>aggregation</b> of platelets.</i>
<b>alliance</b>	A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim. <i>The shifting <b>alliances</b> within a large family.</i>
<b>ally</b>	A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose. <i>He s a good <b>ally</b> in fight.</i>
<b>amateur</b>	Someone who pursues a study or sport as a pastime. <i>It takes five years for a top <b>amateur</b> to become a real Tour de France rider.</i>
<b>assemblage</b>	A machine or object made of pieces fitted together. <i>Some vast <b>assemblage</b> of gears and cogs.</i>
<b>association</b>	A social or business relationship. <i>His <b>association</b> of his father with being beaten was too strong to break.</i>
<b>cliquish</b>	(of a group or place) tending to form or hold exclusive groups and so not welcoming to outsiders. <i>A notoriously <b>cliquish</b> political club.</i>
<b>club</b>	The premises used by a particular club. <i>The <b>club</b> scene.</i>
<b>collaboration</b>	Something produced in collaboration with someone. <i>His recent opera was a <b>collaboration</b> with Lessing.</i>
<b>combination</b>	A sequence of numbers or letters that opens a combination lock. <i>This colour <b>combination</b> is stunningly effective.</i>

<b>committee</b>	In the UK a committee appointed by Parliament to consider the details of proposed legislation. <i>There was much scrutiny in <b>committee</b>.</i>
<b>confederacy</b>	A league or alliance, especially of confederate states. <i>The Italian <b>confederacy</b> known as the Lombard League.</i>
<b>confederation</b>	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. <i>A referendum on <b>confederation</b>.</i>
<b>cooperation</b>	The practice of cooperating. <i>They worked in close <b>cooperation</b> with the British Tourist Authority.</i>
<b>football</b>	Any of various forms of team game involving kicking and in some cases also handling a ball in particular in the UK soccer or in the US American football. <i>Wherever the president travels a military aide stays close with the <b>football</b>.</i>
<b>foursome</b>	Four people considered as a unit. <i>Wales led 3 2 after the morning <b>foursomes</b>.</i>
<b>fraternity</b>	A social club for male undergraduates. <i>Members of the hunting <b>fraternity</b>.</i>
<b>group</b>	Form a group or group together. <i>I ve always been a fan of the guitarists in the <b>group</b>.</i>
<b>guild</b>	A medieval association of craftsmen or merchants, often having considerable power.
<b>league</b>	The contest for the championship of a league. <i>The <b>league</b> championship.</i>
<b>membership</b>	The state of being a member. <i>They polled their <b>membership</b>.</i>
<b>player</b>	A person who plays a musical instrument. <i>He was a major <b>player</b> in setting up the corporation.</i>
<b>quartet</b>	A composition for a quartet. <i>He joined a barbershop <b>quartet</b>.</i>
<b>reunion</b>	A party of former associates who have come together again. <i>She had a tearful <b>reunion</b> with her parents.</i>
<b>rugby</b>	A form of football played with an oval ball.
<b>sextet</b>	A composition for a sextet. <i>The <b>sextet</b> from The Marriage of Figaro.</i>
<b>squad</b>	A small squad of policemen trained to deal with a particular kind of crime. <i>An assassination <b>squad</b>.</i>
