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Associations of "Tear it apart" (30 Words)

alone	Lacking companions or companionship. <i>Was alone with her thoughts.</i>
asunder	Widely separated especially in space. <i>As wide asunder as pole from pole.</i>
avulsion	An abrupt change in the course of a stream that forms the boundary between two parcels of land resulting in the loss of part of the land of one landowner and a consequent increase in the land of another.
cloistered	Kept away from the outside world; sheltered. <i>The cloistered academic world of books.</i>
detached	Showing lack of emotional involvement. <i>A detached garage.</i>
dichotomous	(of branching) in which the axis is divided into two branches. <i>A dichotomous view of the world.</i>
disjointed	Separated at the joint. <i>A disjointed fowl.</i>
farther	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>Farther from our expectations.</i>
individually	One by one; singly; separately. <i>Individually wrapped cheeses.</i>
individuation	Discriminating the individual from the generic group or species.
isolated	Single; exceptional. <i>An isolated pawn.</i>
isolation	A defense mechanism in which memory of an unacceptable act or impulse is separated from the emotion originally associated with it. <i>He opposed a policy of American isolation.</i>

partition	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. Partition a room off.
<u>reclusive</u>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>Sitting under the reclusive calm of a shade tree.</i>
<u>remote</u>	A remote control device. <i>A remote possibility.</i>
rend	Cause great emotional pain to. <i>The speculation and confusion which was rending the civilized world.</i>
rive	(of wood or stone) split or crack. <i>The wood was riven with deep cracks.</i>
schism	The formal separation of a church into two churches or the withdrawal of one group over doctrinal differences. <i>Another schism like that and they will wind up in bankruptcy.</i>
<u>secluded</u>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>The gardens are quiet and secluded.</i>
segregation	The separation of paired alleles during meiosis so that members of each pair of alleles appear in different gametes. <i>An official policy of racial segregation.</i>
separable	Capable of being divided or dissociated. <i>Body and soul are not separable.</i>
separate	A garment that can be purchased separately and worn in combinations with other garments. <i>After her parents separated she was brought up by her mother.</i>
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>His parents are separated.</i>
separately	Apart from others. <i>They arrived together but left separately.</i>
<u>separation</u>	The extraction or removal of a specified substance for use or rejection. <i>An improved method of lead separation.</i>
<u>sever</u>	Divide by cutting or slicing, especially suddenly and forcibly. Sever a relationship.
<u>solitary</u>	Devoid of creatures. <i>Tigers are essentially solitary.</i>
<u>split</u>	An instance or act of splitting or being split a division. Splits appeared in the decaying planks.

unattached Not fastened together.
*Local people **unattached** to any organization.*

uncommitted Not committed to a cause, activity, etc.
*There is very little **uncommitted** money to fund new policies.*
