- *(in areas with guerrilla warfare) a small truck with a machine gun mounted on the back.*



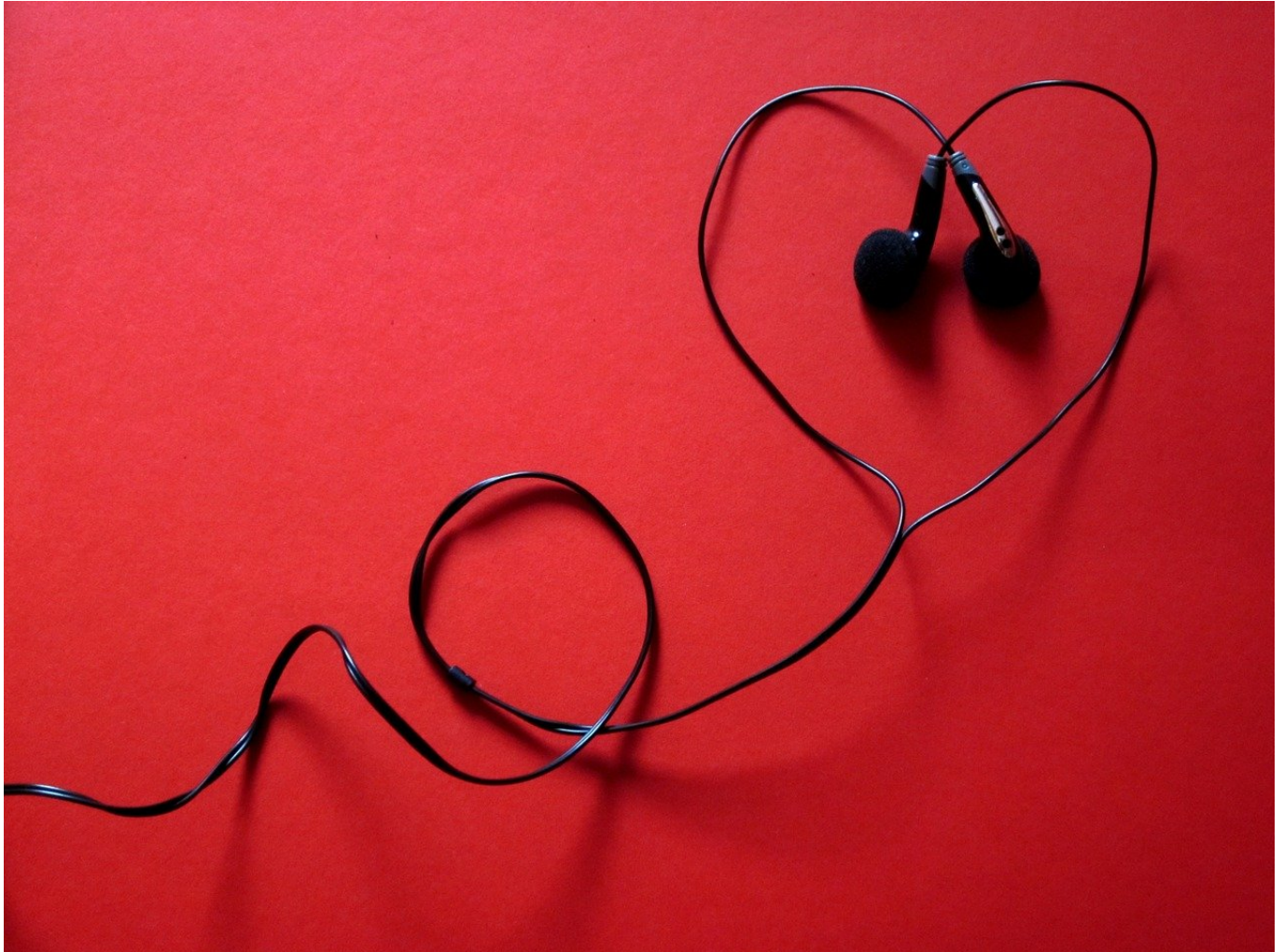
## **Synonyms of "Technical" as a noun (1 Word)**

### Definitions of "Technical" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "technical" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Relating to or concerned with machinery or tools.*
- *Of or relating to or requiring special knowledge to be understood.*
- *Involving or concerned with applied and industrial sciences.*
- *Relating to a particular subject, art, or craft, or its techniques.*
- *(especially of a book or article) requiring special knowledge to be understood.*
- *According to a strict application or interpretation of the law or rules.*

- *Characterizing or showing skill in or specialized knowledge of applied arts and sciences.*
- *Of or relating to technique or proficiency in a practical skill.*
- *Resulting from mechanical failure.*
- *Of or relating to a practical subject that is organized according to scientific principles.*
- *Resulting from or dependent on market factors rather than fundamental economic considerations.*



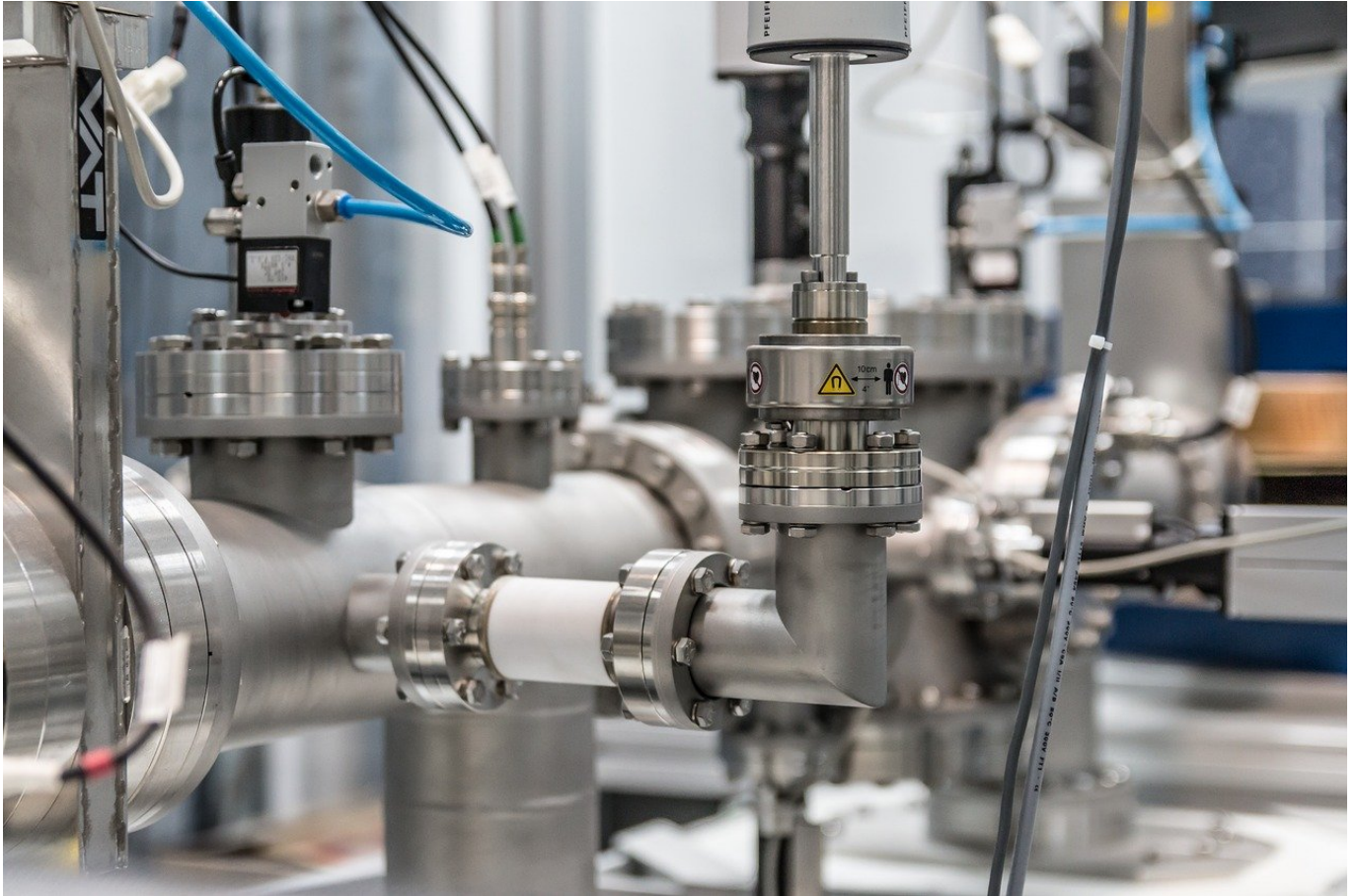
## Synonyms of "Technical" as an adjective (10 Words)

### applied

Concerned with concrete problems or data rather than with fundamental principles- Sidney Hook.

**Applied** psychology.

<b>expert</b>	Having or involving a great deal of knowledge or skill in a particular area. <i>I have a friend who is very <b>expert</b> at the language.</i>
<b><u>mechanical</u></b>	Relating to mechanics as a science. <i><b>Mechanical</b> royalties.</i>
<b>mechanically skillful</b>	Using (or as if using) mechanisms or tools or devices.
<b><u>practical</u></b>	Having or put to a practical purpose or use. <i>A <b>practical</b> stylish kitchen.</i>
<b>proficient</b>	Of or relating to technique or proficiency in a practical skill. <i>I was <b>proficient</b> at my job.</i>
<b>scientific</b>	Conforming with the principles or methods used in science. <i>A <b>scientific</b> approach.</i>
<b>specialist</b>	Possessing or involving detailed knowledge or study of a restricted topic. <i>A <b>specialist</b> electrical shop.</i>
<b><u>specialized</u></b>	Requiring or involving detailed and specific knowledge or training. <i>A <b>specialized</b> tool.</i>
<b>technological</b>	Relating to or using technology. <i><b>Technological</b> development.</i>

<b>adept</b>	Very skilled or proficient at something. <i>An <b>adept</b> juggler.</i>
<b>adroit</b>	Quick or skillful or adept in action or thought. <i>His <b>adroit</b> replies to hecklers won him many followers.</i>
<b>artistry</b>	Creative skill or ability. <i>The <b>artistry</b> of the pianist.</i>
<b>bravura</b>	The display of great daring. <i>The recital ended with a blazing display of <b>bravura</b>.</i>

<b>deft</b>	Demonstrating skill and cleverness. <i>A <b>deft</b> waiter.</i>
<b>dexterous</b>	Showing or having skill, especially with the hands. <i><b>Dexterous</b> of hand and inventive of mind.</i>
<b>expert</b>	A person with special knowledge or ability who performs skillfully. <i>I have a friend who is very <b>expert</b> at the language.</i>
<b>guru</b>	Each of the first ten leaders of the Sikh religion. <i>A <b>guru</b> of genomics.</i>
<b>maven</b>	An expert or connoisseur. <i>Fashion <b>mavens</b> call beige oatmeal.</i>
<b>practiced</b>	Skillful after much practice. <i>A <b>practiced</b> marksman.</i>
<b>professionalism</b>	The competence or skill expected of a professional. <i>The key to quality and efficiency is <b>professionalism</b>.</i>
<b>proficiency</b>	The quality of having great facility and competence. <i>He demonstrated his <b>proficiency</b> in Chinese.</i>
<b>proficient</b>	A person who is proficient. <i>She felt reasonably <b>proficient</b> in Italian.</i>
<b>repairman</b>	A skilled worker whose job is to repair things. <i>A TV <b>repairman</b>.</i>
<b>seasoned</b>	(of food) having had salt, pepper, herbs, or spices added. <i><b>Seasoned</b> wood.</i>
<b>skilled</b>	Having or showing the knowledge, ability, or training to perform a certain activity or task well. <i><b>Skilled</b> legal advice.</i>
<b>skillful</b>	Done with delicacy and skill. <i>The effect was achieved by <b>skillful</b> retouching.</i>
<b>software</b>	The programs and other operating information used by a computer. <i>The <b>software</b> industry.</i>
<b>specialty</b>	The special line of work you have adopted as your career.
<b>tanner</b>	A craftsman who tans skins and hides. <i>Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless <b>tanners</b>.</i>
<b>technician</b>	Someone known for high skill in some intellectual or artistic technique. <i>A laboratory <b>technician</b>.</i>

- technique** A way of carrying out a particular task, especially the execution or performance of an artistic work or a scientific procedure.  
*An established athlete with a very good **technique**.*
- toolmaker** A maker of tools, especially a person who makes and maintains tools for use in a manufacturing process.
- veteran** A serviceman who has seen considerable active service.  
*A Vietnam **veteran**.*
- virtuosity** Great skill in music or another artistic pursuit.  
*A performance of considerable **virtuosity**.*
- workmanship** The degree of skill with which a product is made or a job done.  
*Cracks on the motorway were caused by poor **workmanship**.*
