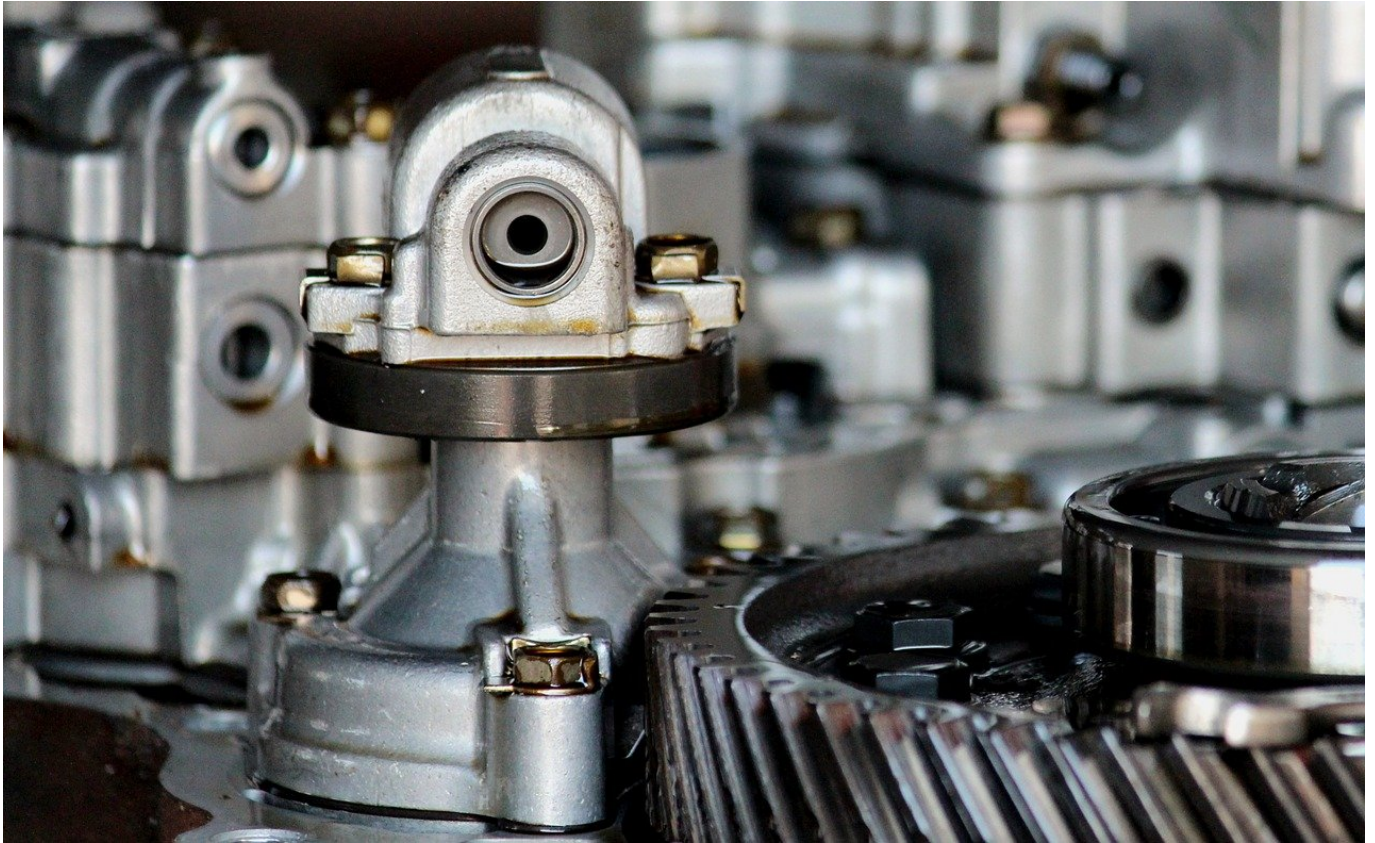

Definitions of "Technicality" as a noun

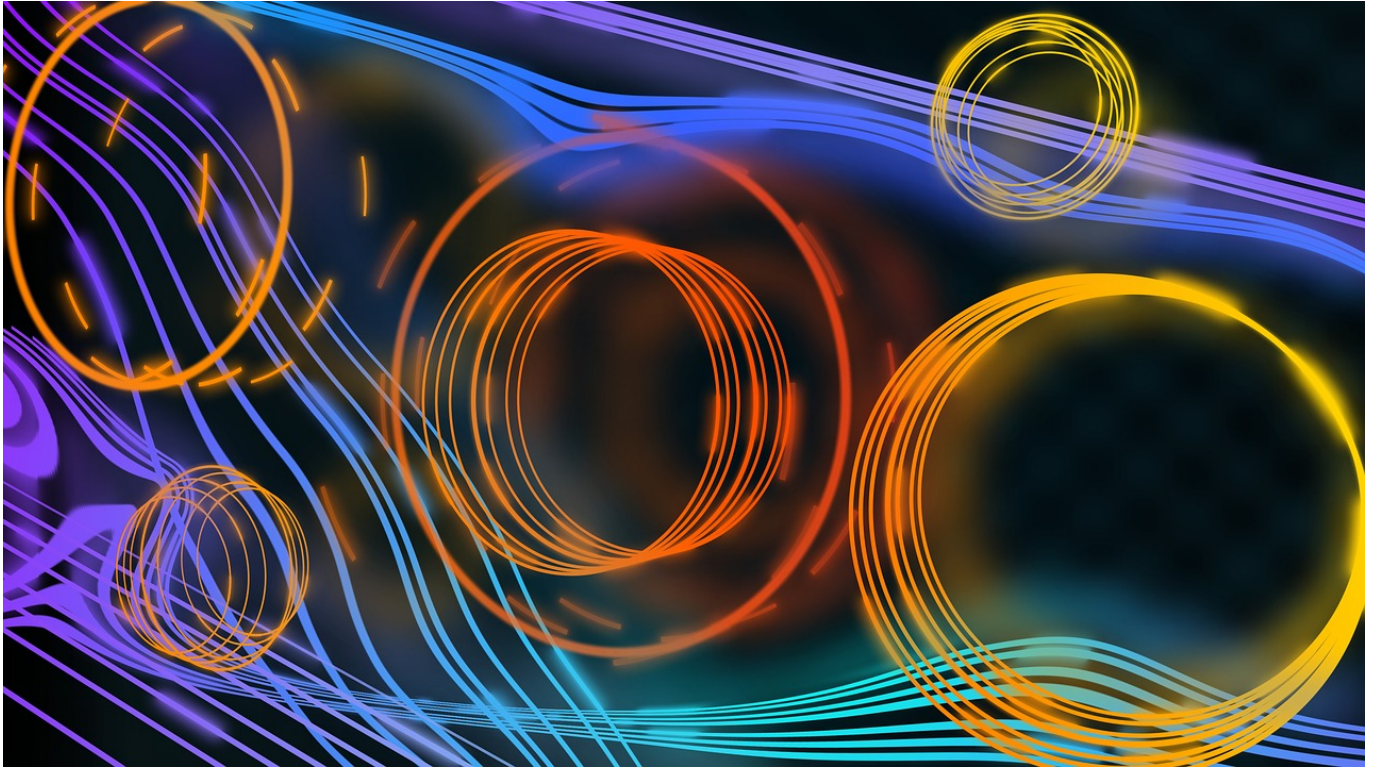
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “technicality” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A point of law or a small detail of a set of rules, as contrasted with the intent or purpose of the rules.*
- *A detail that is considered insignificant.*
- *The specific details or terms belonging to a particular field.*
- *The state of being technical; the use of technical terms or methods.*
- *The state of being technical as in the use of technical terms or methods.*
- *A specific detail in a set of rules or terms belonging to a particular field.*



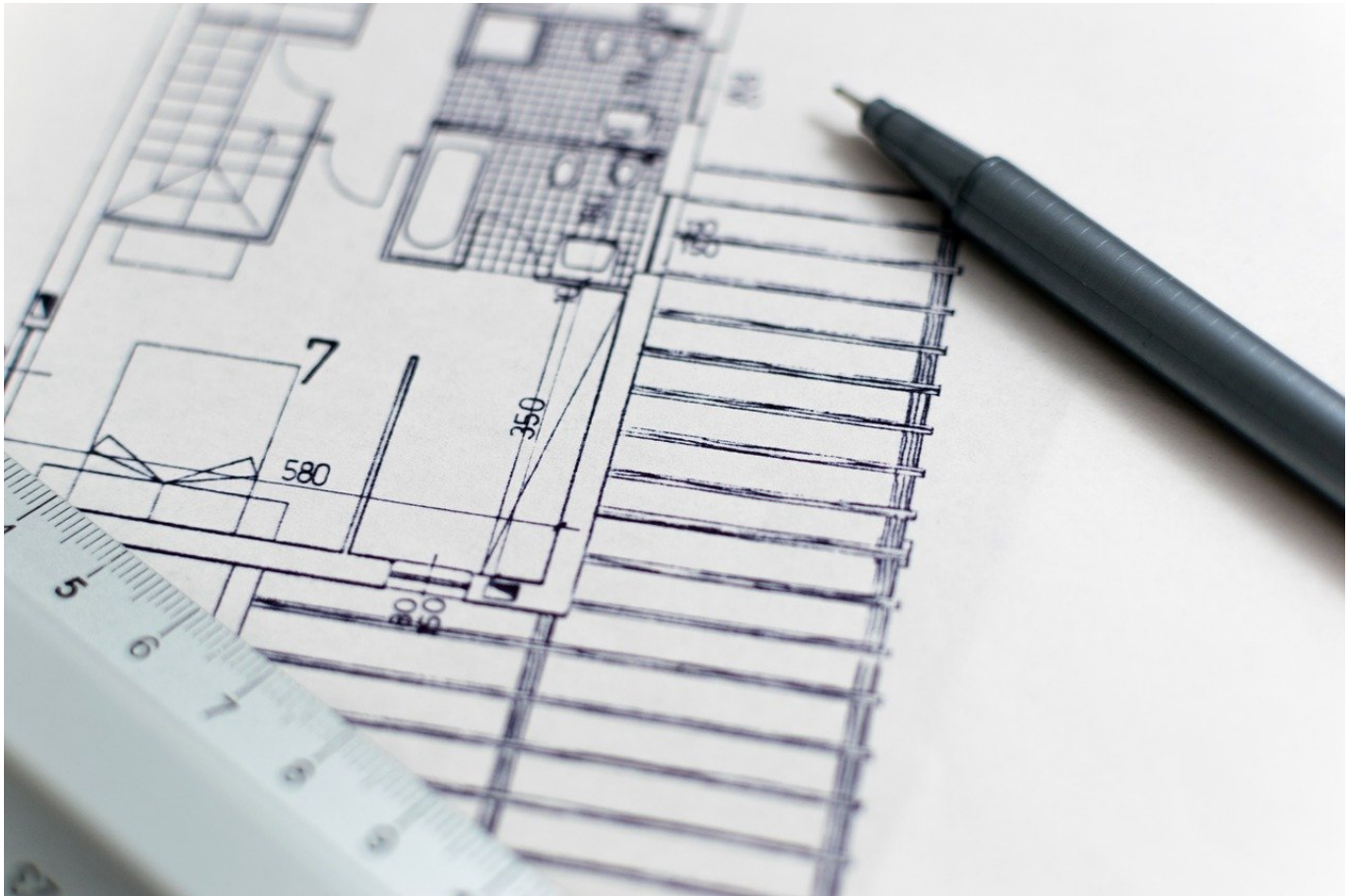
Synonyms of "Technicality" as a noun (8 Words)

- details** An isolated fact that is considered separately from the whole.
*After the trial he gave us the real **details**.*
- finer points** Money extracted as a penalty.
- niceties** Conformity with some esthetic standard of correctness or propriety.
- nicety** Accuracy or precision.
*She prided herself on her **nicety** of pronunciation.*
- particulars** A proposition that asserts something about some (but not all) members of a class.
He always reasons from the particular to the general.
- specifics** A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease.
*Quinine is a **specific** for malaria.*
- subtleties** The quality of being difficult to detect or analyze.
*You had to admire the **subtlety** of the distinctions he drew.*

- *The extreme technicality of the proposed constitution.*

- *He has great expertise in the technicalities of the game.*
- *The resolution died on a technicality.*
- *The defendant was acquitted on a legal technicality.*
- *The judicial system suffered from too much technicality and formality.*

denseness	The quality of being mentally slow and limited.
detail	Provide details for. <i>The ambulances were detailed to the fire station.</i>
detailed	Developed or executed with care and in minute detail. <i>A detailed plan.</i>
diminutive	A diminutive word or suffix. <i>Diminutive in stature.</i>
elaboration	The result of improving something. <i>The concept needs more elaboration than a short essay allows.</i>
exactitude	The quality of being precise or accurate. <i>He writes with exactitude and precision.</i>

exegesis	Critical explanation or interpretation of a text, especially of scripture. <i>The task of biblical exegesis.</i>
infinitesimal	A variable that has zero as its limit. <i>An infinitesimal pause.</i>
instant	Instant coffee. <i>Your letter of the 6th instant.</i>
intricacy	Marked by elaborately complex detail. <i>The intricacy of the procedure.</i>
involution	A function, transformation, or operator that is equal to its inverse, i.e. which gives the identity when applied to itself. <i>Periods of artistic involution.</i>
lilliputian	Small and of little importance. <i>Our worries are lilliputian compared with those of countries that are at war.</i>
little	Used in names of animals and plants that are smaller than related kinds e.g. little grebe. <i>He had slept little these past weeks.</i>
microscopic	Relating to a microscope. <i>A microscopic skirt.</i>
minuscule	Minuscule script. <i>He believed the risk of infection was minuscule.</i>
minute	The distance covered in a minute by someone driving or walking. <i>Two minute whiplike threads of protoplasm.</i>
minutiae	A small or minor detail. <i>He had memorized the many minutiae of the legal code.</i>
moment	The n th moment of a distribution is the expected value of the n th power of the deviations from a fixed value. <i>She was silent for a moment before replying.</i>
nadir	An extreme state of adversity; the lowest point of anything. <i>Asking that question was the nadir of my career.</i>
nicety	A detail or aspect of polite social behaviour. <i>She prided herself on her nicety of pronunciation.</i>
nuance	Give nuances to. <i>Without understanding the finer nuances you can't enjoy the humor.</i>
painstakingly	With great care and thoroughness. <i>The property has been painstakingly restored by its current owners.</i>

particulate	Composed of distinct particles. <i>Particulate pollution.</i>
pinprick	A minor annoyance. <i>For the blood to be poisoned it takes only a pinprick.</i>
precise	(of ideas, images, representations, expressions) characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth; strictly correct. <i>A precise mind.</i>
refinement	The quality of excellence in thought and manners and taste. <i>Recent refinements to production techniques.</i>
small	Small items of clothing especially underwear. <i>A small car.</i>
tiny	A very young child. <i>Tiny feet.</i>
twinkling	Shining intermittently with a sparkling light. <i>Twinkling eyes happy smiles.</i>
