#### Definitions of "Tedious" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "tedious" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Using or containing too many words.
- Too long, slow, or dull; tiresome or monotonous.
- So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness.

#### Synonyms of "Tedious" as an adjective (47 Words)

<u>arid</u>	Lacking vitality or spirit; lifeless-C.J.Rolo. The <b>arid</b> plains north of Cape Town.
<u>banal</u>	So lacking in originality as to be obvious and boring. Songs with <b>banal</b> repeated words.



<u>bland</u>	Smoothly agreeable and courteous with a degree of sophistication. <i>A <b>bland</b> little drama.</i>
boring	Not interesting; tedious. A <b>boring</b> evening with uninteresting people.
colourless	Lacking in variety and interest. A <b>colourless</b> liquid.
deadening	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. A <b>deadening</b> effect on the pace of progress.
deadly dull	Extremely poisonous or injurious; producing venom.
dreary	Causing dejection. A series of <b>dreary</b> dinner parties.
<u>dry</u>	Of noodles not served in a soup but in a sauce or with dry ingredients. <i>Wait until the paint is dry.</i>
dull	Not clear and resonant; sounding as if striking with or against something relatively soft. <i>A dull throbbing.</i>
<u>flat</u>	Of a key having a flat or flats in the signature. A <b>flat</b> joke.
heavy	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. My parents were getting really <b>heavy</b> with me in terms of work.
ho-hum	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness.
humdrum	Tediously repetitious or lacking in variety. A <b>humdrum</b> existence all work and no play.
insipid	Lacking flavour; weak or tasteless. <i>Insipid</i> hospital food.
irksome	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. An <b>irksome</b> journey.
jejune	Displaying or suggesting a lack of maturity. Their entirely predictable and usually <b>jejune</b> opinions.
lacking variety	Inadequate in amount or degree.
lacklustre	Lacking luster or shine. The conditioner will revitalize <b>lacklustre</b> hair.
leaden	Darkened with overcast. A <b>leaden</b> sky.
<u>lifeless</u>	Dead or apparently dead. A <b>lifeless</b> planet.
long-winded	Using or containing too many words.



<u>mindless</u>	Devoid of intelligence or thought. <i>Mindless violence</i> .
monochrome	Having or appearing to have only one color.
<u>monotonous</u>	Sounded or spoken in a tone unvarying in pitch. The statistics that he quotes with <b>monotonous</b> regularity.
<u>mundane</u>	Concerned with the world or worldly matters. <i>His <b>mundane</b> humdrum existence.</i>
<u>pedestrian</u>	Lacking wit or imagination. Disenchantment with their <b>pedestrian</b> lives.
plodding	Slow-moving and unexciting. <i>Plodding</i> methodical Ralph Bellamy.
prosaic	Not challenging; dull and lacking excitement. <b>Prosaic</b> language can t convey the experience.
run-of-the-mill	Not special in any way.
slow	Of a sports field or ground likely to make the ball bounce or run slowly or to prevent competitors from travelling fast. <i>Large organizations can be</i> <b>slow</b> <i>to change</i> .
<u>soporific</u>	Tending to induce drowsiness or sleep. The motion of the train had a somewhat <b>soporific</b> effect.
soul-destroying	Destructive to the spirit or soul.
soulless	Lacking sensitivity or the capacity for deep feeling. She found the apartment beautiful but <b>soulless</b> .
<u>tiresome</u>	Causing one to feel bored or annoyed. The <b>tiresome</b> chirping of a cricket.
unexciting	Not exciting; dull. Many school prospectuses are dull and <b>unexciting</b> .
uninspired	(of a person) not filled with excitement. <i>He writes repetitive and <b>uninspired</b> poetry.</i>
uninspiring	Not producing excitement or interest. An <b>uninspiring</b> game that United scarcely deserved to win.
uninteresting	Not arousing curiosity or interest. The scenery is dull and <b>uninteresting</b> .
unvaried	Not involving change. A plain <b>unvaried</b> diet.
unvarying	Unvarying in nature. Principles of <b>unvarying</b> validity.



<u>vapid</u>	Offering nothing that is stimulating or challenging; bland. A bunch of <b>vapid</b> schoolgirls.
verbose	Using or containing too many words. <b>Verbose</b> and ineffective instructional methods.
wearisome	Causing one to feel tired or bored. They insisted on his presence at <b>wearisome</b> musical soir es.
wearying	Physically and mentally fatigued. A long <b>wearying</b> journey.
windy	(of a person) nervous or anxious about something. A <b>windy</b> bluff.
wordy	Using or containing too many words. A <b>wordy</b> and repetitive account.

# Associations of "Tedious" (30 Words)

<u>banal</u>	So lacking in originality as to be obvious and boring. Songs with <b>banal</b> repeated words.
bored	Uninterested because of frequent exposure or indulgence. She s <b>bored</b> out of her mind.
boredom	The feeling of being bored by something tedious. I ll die of <b>boredom</b> if I live that long.
boring	The act of drilling. A <b>boring</b> evening with uninteresting people.
bromide	A reproduction or piece of typesetting on bromide paper. Feel good <b>bromide</b> s create the illusion of problem solving.
dull	Make dull or blunt. A <b>dull</b> glow.
ennui	A feeling of listlessness and dissatisfaction arising from a lack of occupation or excitement. <i>He succumbed to <b>ennui</b> and despair.</i>



<u>frustrating</u>	Causing annoyance or upset because of an inability to change or achieve something. It can be very <b>frustrating</b> to find that the size you want isn t there.
hesitance	The quality or state of being tentative, unsure, or slow in acting or speaking. They agreed to go along after initial <b>hesitance</b> .
humdrum	Monotonous routine. An escape from the <b>humdrum</b> of his life.
irksome	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. An <b>irksome</b> journey.
jejune	Of insufficient quantity to meet a need. <i>Jejune</i> responses to our problems.
<u>lackluster</u>	Lacking luster or shine. A dull <b>lackluster</b> life.
leaden	Dull, heavy, or slow. <b>Leaden</b> steps.
<u>monotonous</u>	Sounded or spoken in a tone unvarying in pitch. <i>The statistics that he quotes with <b>monotonous</b> regularity.</i>
<u>monotony</u>	The quality of wearisome constancy, routine, and lack of variety. <i>He had never grown accustomed to the <b>monotony</b> of his work.</i>
nondescript	A nondescript person or thing. A <b>nondescript</b> novel.
prolixity	Boring verbosity.
prosaic	Not fanciful or imaginative. A <b>prosaic</b> and unimaginative essay.
<u>solitude</u>	A state of social isolation. The battle to preserve beloved <b>solitude</b> s flared up all over the country.
tedium	The state or quality of being tedious. The <b>tedium</b> of car journeys.
tired	(especially of a statement or idea) boring or uninteresting because overfamiliar. <i>Fisher rubbed his <b>tired</b> eyes.</i>
<u>tiresome</u>	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. Weeding is a <b>tiresome</b> but essential job.
<u>tiring</u>	Producing exhaustion. It had been a <b>tiring</b> day.



Characteristic or suggestive of an institution especially in being uniform or **uninteresting** dull or unimaginative.

	A very <b>uninteresting</b> account of her trip.
unvaried	Lacking variety. A plain <b>unvaried</b> diet.
<u>vapid</u>	Lacking taste or flavor or tang. <b>Vapid</b> tea.
verbose	Using or containing too many words. <b>Verbose</b> and ineffective instructional methods.
wearing	Geology the mechanical process of wearing or grinding something down as by particles washing over it. <i>The visit was especially wearing</i> .
wearisome	Causing one to feel tired or bored. They have schedules and inventories that tell them in <b>wearisome</b> detail what they should look for.
