Associations of "Teeming" (30 Words)

bazaar	A fundraising sale of goods. <i>The church bazaar.</i>
clump	Form a clump or clumps. <i>They sat on the wall in clumps of two and three.</i>
compact	A mass of powdered metal compacted together in preparation for sintering. <i>The rubbish was taken to the depot to be compacted.</i>
compactly	Taking up no more space than necessary. <i>He wrote compactly but clearly.</i>
compress	Squeeze or press (two things) together. <i>Her face compressed into a frown.</i>
compression	An increase in the density of something.
congested	(of a part of the body) abnormally full of blood. <i>Congested arteries.</i>
congestion	Excessive crowding. <i>The new bridge should ease congestion in the area.</i>
constricted	Especially tense; especially in some dialects. <i>Constricted air passages.</i>
crowded	(of a space) full of people, leaving little or no room for movement; packed. <i>A very crowded room.</i>
dense	Hard to pass through because of dense growth. <i>As the storm cleared a dense fog came down.</i>
filled	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Theirs was a house filled with laughter.</i>
full	The time when the Moon is fully illuminated. <i>Fully grown.</i>
hairy	Hazardous and frightening. <i>A hairy tweed coat and skirt.</i>

impenetrable	(of matter) incapable of occupying the same space as other matter at the same time. <i>Impenetrable gloom.</i>
jammed	Extremely crowded or filled to capacity. <i>A suitcase jammed with dirty clothes.</i>
<u>lush</u>	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>I had some really lush pressies.</i>
luxuriate	Enjoy (something) as a luxury; take self-indulgent delight in. <i>She was luxuriating in a long bath.</i>
narrowed	Reduced in size as by squeezing together. <i>A narrowed view of the world.</i>
nonporous	Not porous; especially not having vessels that appear as pores.
overcrowd	Crowd together too much. <i>Try not to overcrowd the leaflet with text.</i>
<u>packed</u>	Extremely crowded or filled to capacity. <i>A packed theater.</i>
<u>pressed</u>	Compacted by ironing. <i>Immaculately pressed trousers.</i>
removal	Dismissal from office. <i>His fellow employees formed guards of honour at the removal and funeral.</i>
<u>thick</u>	Spoken as if with a thick tongue. <i>The top was thick with dust.</i>
thickly	In a concentrated manner. <i>The meat was too thickly cut and impossible to chew.</i>
tightly	Securely fixed or fastened. <i>Tightly reasoned arguments.</i>
<u>traffic</u>	Vehicles moving on a public highway. <i>Europe's air traffic.</i>
underbrush	Shrubs and small trees forming the undergrowth in a forest.
<u>width</u>	The extent of something from side to side. <i>A single width of hardboard.</i>
