adolescent	Relating to or peculiar to or suggestive of an adolescent. <i>Adolescent</i> insecurity.
adult	Behave in a way characteristic of a responsible adult especially by accomplishing mundane but necessary tasks. <i>An <b>adult</b> woman.</i>
<u>childhood</u>	The state or period of being a child. <i>He spent his <b>childhood</b> in Lewes.</i>



cub	Hunt fox cubs. She was as protective as a tiger with her <b>cub</b> s.
delinquency	A tendency to be negligent and uncaring. He inherited his <b>delinquency</b> from his father.
<u>girl</u>	A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. I look forward to having a night with the <b>girl</b> s.
grow	Cultivate by growing often involving improvements by means of agricultural techniques. The tree trunks had <b>grow</b> n together.
<u>immature</u>	In an early period of life or development or growth. Many of the fish caught are <b>immature</b> .
infancy	The earliest state of immaturity. A son who died in <b>infancy</b> .
junior	A child attending a junior school. First year <b>junior</b> s.
<u>juvenile</u>	An actor playing a juvenile role. The light coloured plumage of a <b>juvenile</b> .
kid	Leather made from a young goat's skin. She collected the <b>kid</b> s from school.
lad	A young man who is boisterously macho. Tony was a bit of a <b>lad</b> always had an eye for the women.
maidenhood	The fact or condition of being a young, unmarried woman. Most brides wear white to symbolize <b>maidenhood</b> .
maturation	The process of an individual organism growing organically; a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>Pod maturation</i> .
nubile	(of a young woman) sexually mature; old enough for marriage. <i>He employed a procession of <b>nubile</b> young secretaries.</i>
playmate	Used euphemistically to refer to a person's lover. Sometimes Valerie wished she had more <b>playmate</b> s.
<u>precocious</u>	(of a child) having developed certain abilities or inclinations at an earlier age than is usual or expected. <i>A precocious achievement.</i>
puberty	The period during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction. <i>A particularly traumatic <b>puberty</b></i> .



<u>rebellious</u>	Resisting control or authority. The <b>rebellious</b> republics.
reformatory	An institution to which young offenders are sent as an alternative to prison. <i>Reformatory punishment.</i>
schoolgirl	Characteristic of or associated with schoolgirls. <b>Schoolgirl</b> French.
stripling	A young man. He s a mere <b>stripling</b> .
teen	A teenager. A <b>teen</b> idol.
teenage	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. A <b>teenage</b> girl.
young	Young people collectively. The <b>young</b> are amazingly resilient.
youngster	A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for <b>youngster</b>.</i>
youth	An early stage in the development of something. This publishing sector is no longer in its <b>youth</b> .
