*During **adolescence** teenagers often experience violent mood swings.*

**adolescent** Relating to or peculiar to or suggestive of an adolescent.  
***Adolescent** insecurity.*

**adult** Behave in a way characteristic of a responsible adult especially by accomplishing mundane but necessary tasks.  
*An **adult** woman.*

**childhood** The state or period of being a child.  
*He spent his **childhood** in Lewes.*

<b>cub</b>	Hunt fox cubs. <i>She was as protective as a tiger with her <b>cubs</b>.</i>
<b>delinquency</b>	A tendency to be negligent and uncaring. <i>He inherited his <b>delinquency</b> from his father.</i>
<b>girl</b>	A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>I look forward to having a night with the <b>girls</b>.</i>
<b>grow</b>	Cultivate by growing often involving improvements by means of agricultural techniques. <i>The tree trunks had <b>grown</b> together.</i>
<b>immature</b>	In an early period of life or development or growth. <i>Many of the fish caught are <b>immature</b>.</i>
<b>infancy</b>	The earliest state of immaturity. <i>A son who died in <b>infancy</b>.</i>
<b>junior</b>	A child attending a junior school. <i>First year <b>juniors</b>.</i>
<b>juvenile</b>	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>The light coloured plumage of a <b>juvenile</b>.</i>
<b>kid</b>	Leather made from a young goat's skin. <i>She collected the <b>kids</b> from school.</i>
<b>lad</b>	A young man who is boisterously macho. <i>Tony was a bit of a <b>lad</b> always had an eye for the women.</i>
<b>maidenhood</b>	The fact or condition of being a young, unmarried woman. <i>Most brides wear white to symbolize <b>maidenhood</b>.</i>
<b>maturation</b>	The process of an individual organism growing organically; a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>Pod <b>maturation</b>.</i>
<b>nubile</b>	(of a young woman) sexually mature; old enough for marriage. <i>He employed a procession of <b>nubile</b> young secretaries.</i>
<b>playmate</b>	Used euphemistically to refer to a person's lover. <i>Sometimes Valerie wished she had more <b>playmates</b>.</i>
<b>precocious</b>	(of a child) having developed certain abilities or inclinations at an earlier age than is usual or expected. <i>A <b>precocious</b> achievement.</i>
<b>puberty</b>	The period during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction. <i>A particularly traumatic <b>puberty</b>.</i>

<b>rebellious</b>	Resisting control or authority. <i>The <b>rebellious</b> republics.</i>
<b>reformatory</b>	An institution to which young offenders are sent as an alternative to prison. <i><b>Reformatory</b> punishment.</i>
<b>schoolgirl</b>	Characteristic of or associated with schoolgirls. <i><b>Schoolgirl</b> French.</i>
<b>stripling</b>	A young man. <i>He s a mere <b>stripling</b>.</i>
<b>teen</b>	A teenager. <i>A <b>teen</b> idol.</i>
<b>teenage</b>	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. <i>A <b>teenage</b> girl.</i>
<b>young</b>	Young people collectively. <i>The <b>young</b> are amazingly resilient.</i>
<b>youngster</b>	A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for <b>youngster</b>.</i>
<b>youth</b>	An early stage in the development of something. <i>This publishing sector is no longer in its <b>youth</b>.</i>
