The **shaking** of his fingers as he lit his pipe.



Shake slightly and uncontrollably as a result of being cold, frightened, or

shiver excited.

They **shiver**ed in the damp foggy cold.

shudder An act of shuddering.

The elevator rose with a **shudder**.

stagger An unsteady uneven gait.

By the back straight he had overtaken the **stagger**.

Move or walk in a swinging or swaying manner.

The easy **sway** of her hips.

topple Cause to topple or tumble by pushing. She **topple**d over when I touched her.

totter (of a system, organization, process, etc.) be insecure or about to fail.

A hunched figure was **totter**ing down the path.

tremble Be in a state of extreme apprehension.

I **tremble** to think that we could ever return to conditions like these.

tremor Undergo a tremor or tremors.

A muscle in my jaw **tremor**ed uncontrollably.

(of the voice) quivering as from weakness or fear.

tremulous Spoke timidly in a tremulous voice.

Lacking stability or fixity or firmness.

unstable Unstable political conditions.

vacillate Waver between different opinions or actions; be indecisive.

I **vacillate**d between teaching and journalism.

Be undecided about something; waver between conflicting positions or courses

vibrate of action.

A low rumbling sound that began to **vibrate** through the car.

vibration A distinctive emotional aura experienced instinctively.

I picked up no unusual **vibration**s as to the envelope s contents.

volatile A volatile substance.

Volatile oils.

waddle Walking with short steps and the weight tilting from one foot to the other.

Ducks walk with a **waddle**.

(especially with reference to an animal's tail) move or cause to move rapidly to

wag and fro.

The dog went out wagging its tail.

waver Someone who communicates by waving.

The flame **waver**ed in the draught.
