### **Definitions of "Teeth" as a noun**

- *The kind and number and arrangement of teeth (collectively) in a person or animal.*



### Synonyms of "Teeth" as a noun (1 Word)

**dentition** The arrangement or condition of the teeth in a particular species or individual.  
*Mammals can be reliably identified from a study of their **dentition** alone.*



## Associations of "Teeth" (30 Words)

<b>brushing</b>	The act of brushing your hair.
<b>canine</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of members of the family Canidae. <i><b>Canine</b> behavioural problems.</i>
<b>chew</b>	Something that is meant for chewing. <i>A dog <b>chew</b>.</i>
<b>chewing</b>	Biting and grinding food in your mouth so it becomes soft enough to swallow.
<b>chomp</b>	A chewing noise or action. <i>The boy <b>chomped</b> his sandwich.</i>
<b>chopstick</b>	One of a pair of slender sticks used as oriental tableware to eat food with.
<b>dental</b>	A dental consonant. <i><b>Dental</b> health.</i>



<b>dentifrice</b>	A substance for cleaning the teeth; applied with a toothbrush. <i>Here s a <b>dentifrice</b> with real action.</i>
<b>dentist</b>	A person qualified to practice dentistry. <i>His mouth is still sore from his visit to the <b>dentist</b> s.</i>
<b>denture</b>	A dental appliance that artificially replaces missing teeth. <i>Ideally <b>dentures</b> should be renewed every three or four years.</i>
<b>enamel</b>	Coat or decorate a metallic or hard object with enamel. <i>A new super gloss <b>enamel</b>.</i>
<b>floss</b>	Use dental floss to clean. <i><b>Floss</b> your teeth after every meal.</i>
<b>frankincense</b>	An aromatic gum resin obtained from various Arabian or East African trees; formerly valued for worship and for embalming and fumigation.
<b>gnash</b>	Grind (one's teeth) together as a sign of anger (often used hyperbolically). <i>The dog s jaws were primed to <b>gnash</b>.</i>
<b>gum</b>	A gum tree especially a eucalyptus. <i>Open and close the valves to make sure they don t get <b>gummed</b> up.</i>
<b>implant</b>	Provide someone or something with something by implantation. <i>The dentist <b>implanted</b> a tooth in the gum.</i>
<b>incisor</b>	A narrow edged tooth at the front of the mouth adapted for cutting In humans there are four incisors in each jaw.
<b>jaw</b>	The lower movable bone of the jaw or the part of the face containing it. <i>He <b>jawed</b> his bubble gum.</i>
<b>jimmy</b>	To move or force, especially in an effort to get something open. <i>In Britain they call a <b>jimmy</b> and jemmy.</i>
<b>mastication</b>	Biting and grinding food in your mouth so it becomes soft enough to swallow.
<b>molar</b>	Grinding tooth with a broad crown located behind the premolars. <i>Such <b>molar</b> problems of personality as the ego functions.</i>
<b>mouthwash</b>	A medicated solution used for gargling and rinsing the mouth.
<b>orthodontics</b>	The branch of dentistry dealing with the prevention or correction of irregularities of the teeth.
<b>orthodontist</b>	A dentist who is qualified to treat irregularities in the teeth and jaws. <i>It is essential that you wear your rubber bands as prescribed by your <b>orthodontist</b>.</i>
<b>orthopedist</b>	A specialist in correcting deformities of the skeletal system (especially in children).

<b>tooth</b>	Something resembling the tooth of an animal. <i><b>Tooth</b> decay.</i>
<b>toothbrush</b>	Small brush; has long handle; used to clean teeth.
<b>toothpaste</b>	A thick, soft, moist substance used on a brush for cleaning one's teeth. <i>A tube of <b>toothpaste</b>.</i>
<b>toothpick</b>	A short pointed piece of wood or plastic used for removing bits of food lodged between the teeth.
<b>tusk</b>	Remove the tusks of animals. <i><b>Tusk</b> an elephant.</i>
