## Associations of "Tempered" (30 Words)

<b>aggression</b>	Feelings of anger or antipathy resulting in hostile or violent behaviour; readiness to attack or confront. <i>The sheer volume and <b>aggression</b> of his playing.</i>
<b>angry</b>	Feeling or showing anger. <i><b>Angry</b> customers.</i>
<b><u>cantankerous</u></b>	Stubbornly obstructive and unwilling to cooperate- Spectator. <i>He can be a <b>cantankerous</b> old fossil at times.</i>
<b>choleric</b>	Easily moved to anger- H.G.Wells. <i>A <b>choleric</b> outburst.</i>

<b>combustible</b>	A combustible substance. A <b>combustible</b> gas.
<b>combustion</b>	The process of burning something. The <b>combustion</b> of fossil fuels.
<b>exasperated</b>	Greatly annoyed; out of patience. Felt <b>exasperated</b> beyond endurance.
<b>excitability</b>	Excessive sensitivity of an organ or body part.
<b>fiery</b>	Having a passionate and quick-tempered nature. The car was painted a <b>fiery</b> red.
<b>flammability</b>	The quality of being easily ignited and burning rapidly.
<b>furious</b>	Full of anger or energy; violent or intense. <b>Furious</b> about the accident.
<b><u>impatience</u></b>	A restless desire for change and excitement. He was shifting in his seat with <b>impatience</b> .
<b><u>indignant</u></b>	Angered at something unjust or wrong. An <b>indignant</b> denial.
<b>inflammable</b>	A substance which is easily set on fire. <b>Inflammable</b> materials.
<b>infuriated</b>	Marked by extreme anger. <b>Infuriated</b> onlookers charged the police who were beating the boy.
<b>irascible</b>	Quickly aroused to anger. An <b>irascible</b> and difficult man.
<b>irritability</b>	A disposition to exhibit uncontrolled anger. Symptoms include insomnia and <b>irritability</b> .
<b>mollify</b>	Make more temperate, acceptable, or suitable by adding something else. Nature reserves were set up around the power stations to <b>mollify</b> local conservationists.
<b><u>nervous</u></b>	Of or relating to the nervous system. A sensitive <b>nervous</b> person.
<b>nervously</b>	With nervous excitement. I was blushing and smiling <b>nervously</b> .
<b><u>outraged</u></b>	Angered at something unjust or wrong. A look of <b>outraged</b> disbelief.
<b>peevish</b>	Having or showing an irritable disposition. A thin <b>peevish</b> voice.
<b>petulance</b>	The quality of being childish sulky or bad-tempered. A slight degree of <b>petulance</b> had crept into his voice.

<b>querulous</b>	Habitually complaining. <i>She became <b>querulous</b> and demanding.</i>
<b>sigh</b>	A sound like a person sighing. <i>She heard the <b>sigh</b> of the wind in the trees.</i>
<b>tantrum</b>	A display of bad temper. <i>He has temper <b>tantrums</b> if he can't get his own way.</i>
<b>tense</b>	Become stretched or tense or taut. <i>Carefully stretch and then <b>tense</b> your muscles.</i>
<b>testy</b>	Easily irritated; impatient and somewhat bad-tempered. <i>His <b>testy</b> disapproving father.</i>
<b>vexing</b>	Causing irritation or annoyance. <i>It is <b>vexing</b> to have to admit you are wrong.</i>
<b>volatility</b>	The trait of being unpredictably irresolute. <i>A week of historic stock market <b>volatility</b>.</i>
