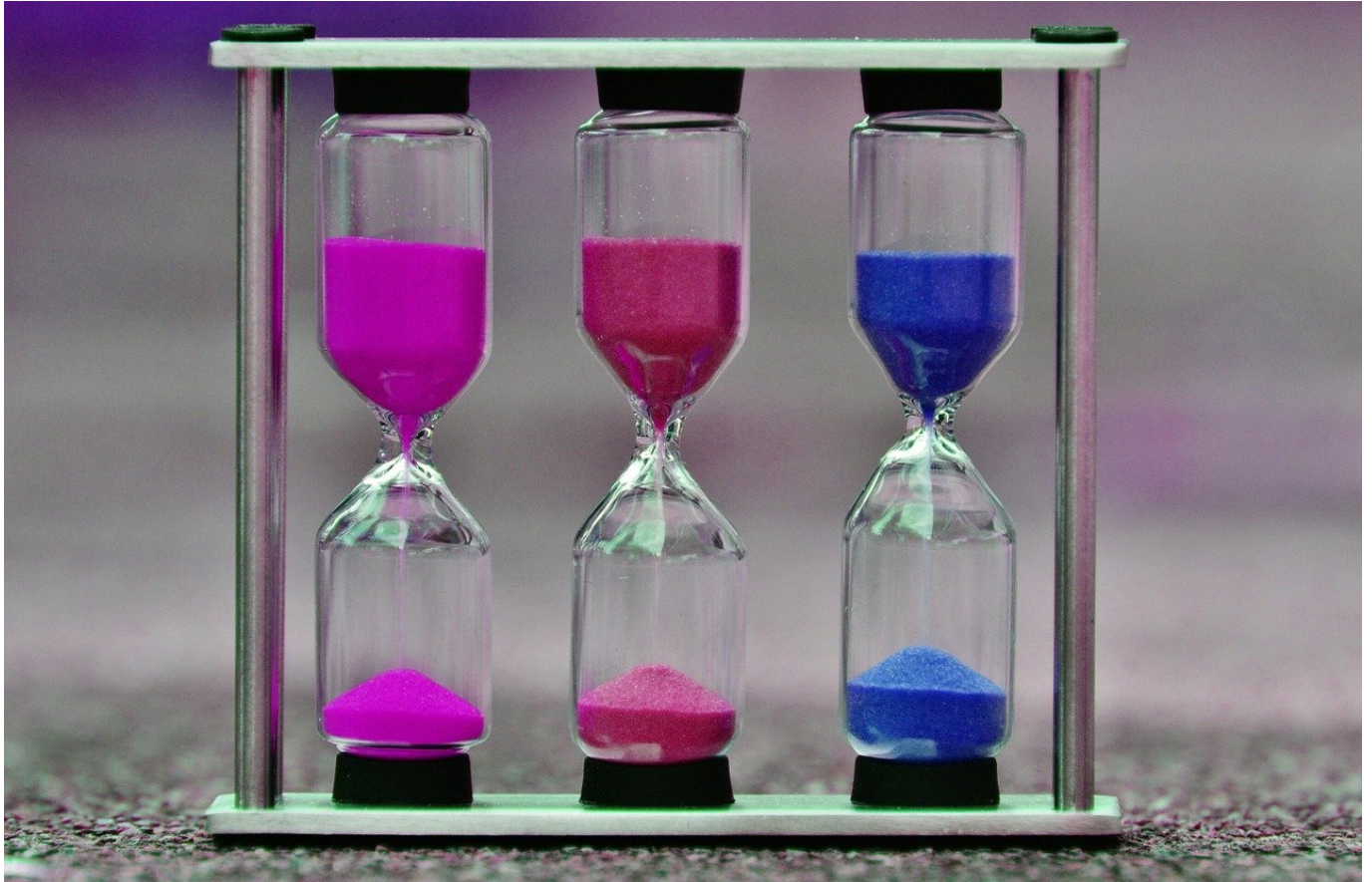

- earthly** Relating to humankind's material existence as distinct from a spiritual or heavenly one.
*Believed that our **earthly** life is all that matters.*
- material** Having material or physical form or substance Benjamin Jowett.
*His support made a **material** difference.*
- mundane** Of this earthly world rather than a heavenly or spiritual one.
*According to the Shinto doctrine spirits of the dead can act upon the **mundane** world.*
- profane** Not concerned with or devoted to religion.
*A talk that tackled topics both sacred and **profane**.*
- secular** Occurring once every century or similarly long period (used especially in reference to celebratory games in ancient Rome).
***Secular** drama.*
- terrestrial** Of or on dry land.
*The nearest to an angelic being that treads this **terrestrial** ball.*
- worldly** Of or concerned with material values or ordinary life rather than a spiritual existence.
*His ambitions for **worldly** success.*

- *The Church did not imitate the secular rulers who thought only of temporal gain.*
- *Temporal matters of but fleeting moment.*

aeon	A divine power or nature emanating from the Supreme Being and playing various roles in the operation of the universe. <i>He reached the crag aeons before I arrived.</i>
auricular	Relating to the ear or hearing. <i>The Catholic doctrine of the necessity of private auricular confession.</i>
buddhism	A religion represented by the many groups (especially in Asia) that profess various forms of the Buddhist doctrine and that venerate Buddha.
buddhist	One who follows the teachings of Buddha.
calvary	A hill near Jerusalem where Jesus was crucified.
church	Take a woman who has recently given birth to church for a service of thanksgiving. <i>The church was largely rebuilt at the end of the 15th century.</i>
confucian	Relating to or characteristic of Confucianism.
confucianism	The teachings of Confucius emphasizing love for humanity; high value given to learning and to devotion to family (including ancestors); peace; justice; influenced the traditional culture of China.
conservative	A person favouring free enterprise, private ownership, and socially traditional ideas. <i>He was considered a conservative in his approach to Catholic teachings.</i>
coptic	The liturgical language of the Coptic Church used in Egypt and Ethiopia; written in the Greek alphabet.
deity	The creator and supreme being (in a monotheistic religion such as Christianity). <i>Also on show is a bronze falcon deity.</i>
diehard	One who adheres to traditional views. <i>A diehard Yankees fan.</i>
divinity	God. <i>Ancient Egyptians believed in the divinity of the Pharaohs.</i>
earthly	Used for emphasis. <i>Believed that our earthly life is all that matters.</i>
majestically	With impressive beauty or scale. <i>The steep slopes of the valley floor rise majestically skywards.</i>
materialistic	Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class. <i>We re living in a highly materialistic society.</i>
mosque	(Islam) a Muslim place of worship that usually has a minaret.

pagoda	An ornamental imitation of a Hindu or Buddhist pagoda.
pantheon	(antiquity) a temple to all the gods. <i>The pantheon of the all time greats.</i>
prayer	Earnest or urgent request. <i>I ll say a prayer for him.</i>
priestess	A female priest of a non-Christian religion.
profane	Not concerned with or devoted to religion. <i>Children being brought up in an entirely profane environment.</i>
religion	A strong belief in a supernatural power or powers that control human destiny. <i>The world s great religions.</i>
secular	A secular priest. <i>There is evidence that the slump is not cyclical but secular.</i>
synagogue	(Judaism) the place of worship for a Jewish congregation.
temple	A thing regarded as holy or likened to a temple especially a person s body. <i>The veins in his temple throbbed.</i>
traditional	Produced, done, or used in accordance with tradition. <i>The simple security of traditional assumptions has vanished.</i>
ungodly	Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin. <i>I ve been troubled by telephone calls at ungodly hours.</i>
worldly	(of a person) experienced and sophisticated. <i>She was much more worldly than Nora and dismissed the slur.</i>
