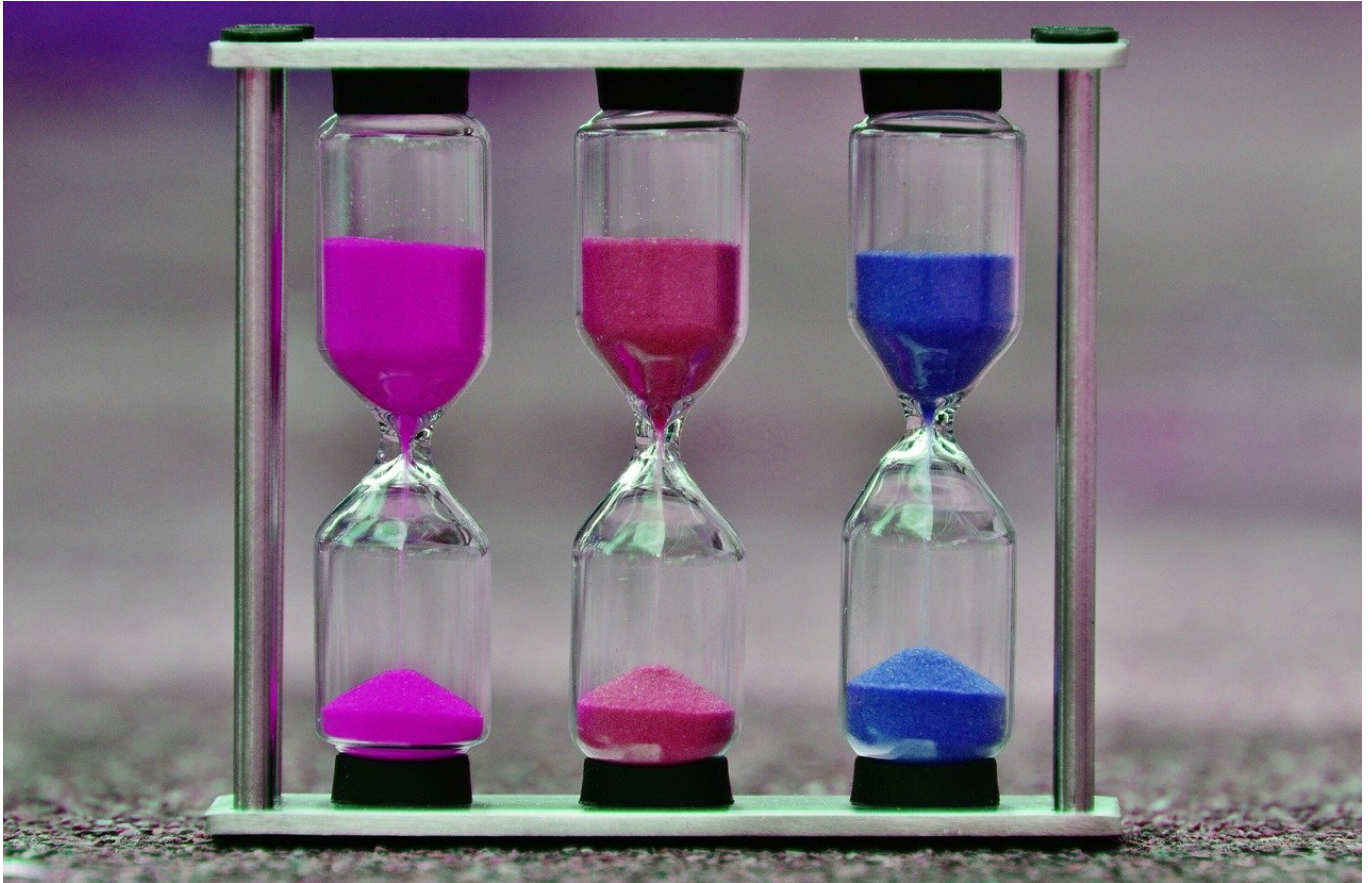

*According to the Shinto doctrine spirits of the dead can act upon the **mundane** world.*
- profane** Not concerned with or devoted to religion.  
*A talk that tackled topics both sacred and **profane**.*
- secular** Occurring once every century or similarly long period (used especially in reference to celebratory games in ancient Rome).  
***Secular** drama.*
- terrestrial** Of or on dry land.  
*The nearest to an angelic being that treads this **terrestrial** ball.*
- worldly** Of or concerned with material values or ordinary life rather than a spiritual existence.  
*His ambitions for **worldly** success.*

<b>aeon</b>	A divine power or nature emanating from the Supreme Being and playing various roles in the operation of the universe. <i>He reached the crag <b>aeons</b> before I arrived.</i>
<b>auricular</b>	Relating to the ear or hearing. <i>The Catholic doctrine of the necessity of private <b>auricular</b> confession.</i>
<b>buddhism</b>	A religion represented by the many groups (especially in Asia) that profess various forms of the Buddhist doctrine and that venerate Buddha.
<b>buddhist</b>	One who follows the teachings of Buddha.
<b>calvary</b>	A hill near Jerusalem where Jesus was crucified.
<b>church</b>	Take a woman who has recently given birth to church for a service of thanksgiving. <i>The <b>church</b> was largely rebuilt at the end of the 15th century.</i>
<b>confucian</b>	Relating to or characteristic of Confucianism.
<b>confucianism</b>	The teachings of Confucius emphasizing love for humanity; high value given to learning and to devotion to family (including ancestors); peace; justice; influenced the traditional culture of China.
<b>conservative</b>	A person favouring free enterprise, private ownership, and socially traditional ideas. <i>He was considered a <b>conservative</b> in his approach to Catholic teachings.</i>
<b>coptic</b>	The liturgical language of the Coptic Church used in Egypt and Ethiopia; written in the Greek alphabet.
<b>deity</b>	The creator and supreme being (in a monotheistic religion such as Christianity). <i>Also on show is a bronze falcon <b>deity</b>.</i>
<b>diehard</b>	One who adheres to traditional views. <i>A <b>diehard</b> Yankees fan.</i>
<b>divinity</b>	God. <i>Ancient Egyptians believed in the <b>divinity</b> of the Pharaohs.</i>
<b>earthly</b>	Used for emphasis. <i>Believed that our <b>earthly</b> life is all that matters.</i>
<b>majestically</b>	With impressive beauty or scale. <i>The steep slopes of the valley floor rise <b>majestically</b> skywards.</i>
<b>materialistic</b>	Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class. <i>We re living in a highly <b>materialistic</b> society.</i>
<b>mosque</b>	(Islam) a Muslim place of worship that usually has a minaret.

<b>pagoda</b>	An ornamental imitation of a Hindu or Buddhist pagoda.
<b>pantheon</b>	(antiquity) a temple to all the gods. <i>The <b>pantheon</b> of the all time greats.</i>
<b>prayer</b>	Earnest or urgent request. <i>I ll say a <b>prayer</b> for him.</i>
<b>priestess</b>	A female priest of a non-Christian religion.
<b>profane</b>	Not concerned with or devoted to religion. <i>Children being brought up in an entirely <b>profane</b> environment.</i>
<b>religion</b>	A strong belief in a supernatural power or powers that control human destiny. <i>The world s great <b>religions</b>.</i>
<b>secular</b>	A secular priest. <i>There is evidence that the slump is not cyclical but <b>secular</b>.</i>
<b>synagogue</b>	(Judaism) the place of worship for a Jewish congregation.
<b>temple</b>	A thing regarded as holy or likened to a temple especially a person s body. <i>The veins in his <b>temple</b> throbbed.</i>
<b>traditional</b>	Produced, done, or used in accordance with tradition. <i>The simple security of <b>traditional</b> assumptions has vanished.</i>
<b>ungodly</b>	Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin. <i>I ve been troubled by telephone calls at <b>ungodly</b> hours.</i>
<b>worldly</b>	(of a person) experienced and sophisticated. <i>She was much more <b>worldly</b> than Nora and dismissed the slur.</i>
