Associations of "Tempted" (30 Words)

allure	Powerfully attract or charm; tempt. <i>Will sponsors really be allured by such opportunities.</i>
attract	Be attractive to. <i>The negatively charged ions attract particles of dust.</i>
attraction	A force under the influence of which objects tend to move towards each other. <i>The church is the town's main tourist attraction.</i>
<u>captivate</u>	Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm. <i>He was captivated by her beauty.</i>
<u>charisma</u>	A personal attractiveness or interestingness that enables you to influence others. <i>He has tremendous charisma and stage presence.</i>
<u>charm</u>	Induce into action by using one's charm. <i>A good luck charm.</i>
<u>coax</u>	Gently and persistently persuade (someone) to do something. <i>Her lovely hair had been coaxed into ringlets.</i>
coquet	Behave flirtatiously; flirt. <i>For a while he coquetted with engineering.</i>
<u>decoy</u>	Lure or entrap with or as if with a decoy. <i>They would try to decoy the enemy towards the hidden group.</i>
delusive	Giving a false or misleading impression. <i>Delusive faith in a wonder drug.</i>
<u>entice</u>	Provoke someone to do something through (often false or exaggerated) promises or persuasion. <i>The treat is offered to entice the dog to eat.</i>
enticing	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>Difficult to say no to an enticing advertisement.</i>

entrance	Put into a trance. <i>About fifty people attempted to gain entrance.</i>
fascinate	Attract; cause to be enamored. <i>The serpent fascinates its prey.</i>
glamorize	Make glamorous and attractive. <i>This new wallpaper really glamorizes the living room.</i>
inducement	A positive motivational influence. <i>Companies were prepared to build only in return for massive inducements.</i>
ingratiate	Bring oneself into favour with someone by flattering or trying to please them. <i>A sycophantic attempt to ingratiate herself with the local aristocracy.</i>
ingratiating	Intended to gain approval or favour; sycophantic. <i>An ingratiating manner.</i>
intrigue	Form intrigues for in an underhand manner. <i>Henry and Louis intrigued with the local nobles.</i>
inviting	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An inviting offer.</i>
lure	Something used to lure fish or other animals into danger so they can be trapped or killed. <i>The child was lured into a car but managed to escape.</i>
persuadable	Being susceptible to persuasion. <i>They need to identify the most persuadable voters.</i>
persuade	(of a situation or event) provide a sound reason for (someone) to do something. <i>You can't persuade me to buy this ugly vase.</i>
seduction	Enticing someone astray from right behavior. <i>The seductions of the mainland.</i>
seductive	Tempting and attractive; enticing. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
tempter	A person or thing that tempts. <i>Satan is the great tempter of mankind.</i>
tempting	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>A tempting invitation.</i>
wheedle	Influence or urge by gentle urging, caressing, or flattering. <i>She wheedled her way on to the guest list.</i>
woo	Make amorous advances towards. <i>China is wooing Russia.</i>
