accentuate	Make more noticeable or prominent. <i>His jacket unfortunately accentuated his paunch.</i>
apt	Quick to learn. <i>An apt reply.</i>
aptitude	Inherent ability. <i>The aptitude of this society to assimilate new elements.</i>
aptness	Appropriateness for the occasion. <i>The phrase had considerable aptness.</i>
banister	The structure formed by the uprights and handrail at the side of a staircase. <i>I stuck my head between the banisters.</i>
bending	The act of bending something.
corner	Solid exterior angle of a building especially one formed by a cornerstone. <i>In many corners of the world they still practice slavery.</i>
disposed	Usually followed by to naturally disposed toward. <i>He is favourably disposed towards the proposals.</i>
emphasis	Special importance or significance. <i>He spoke with emphasis and with complete conviction.</i>
emphasize	Lay stress on (a word or phrase) when speaking. <i>They emphasize the need for daily one to one contact between parent and child.</i>
emphatically	Without doubt; clearly. <i>Greg is emphatically not a slacker.</i>
gangling	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs. <i>A gangling youth with a trace of down on his cheeks.</i>
highlight	Apply a highlighter to one's cheeks or eyebrows in order to make them more prominent. <i>Highlight the area above your eyebrows.</i>

incline	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>He inclined his ear to the wise old man.</i>
inclined	Having made preparations. <i>Inclined to be moody.</i>
lean	Cause to lean or incline. <i>We can lean on this man.</i>
likely	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>Rain is likely.</i>
prone	Lying flat, especially face downwards. <i>I was lying prone on a foam mattress.</i>
propensity	A natural inclination. <i>Their innate propensity to attack one another.</i>
recumbent	(especially of a person or effigy) lying down. <i>Recumbent shrubs.</i>
slant	Heel over. <i>A new slant on science.</i>
spotlight	Illuminate with a spotlight. <i>The dancers are spotlighted from time to time throughout the evening.</i>
staircase	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>A mirrored staircase.</i>
stress	The degree of stress measured in units of force per unit area. <i>In French the last syllable is usually stressed.</i>
susceptible	Easily impressed emotionally. <i>Susceptible to colds.</i>
talent	Natural abilities or qualities. <i>A mighty steed bought from a Thessalian merchant for thirteen talents.</i>
tilt	Charge with a tilt. <i>A tilt at the European Cup.</i>
underline	Draw a line under (a word or phrase) to give emphasis or indicate special type. <i>Certain phrases had been underlined.</i>
underscore	(on a computer or typewriter keyboard) a short horizontal line _ on the baseline. <i>The company underscored the progress made with fuel cells.</i>
yaw	Be wide open. <i>The jet yawed sharply to the right.</i>
