## Associations of "Tend to" (30 Words)

<b><u>accentuate</u></b>	Make more noticeable or prominent. <i>His jacket unfortunately <b>accentuated</b> his paunch.</i>
<b><u>apt</u></b>	Quick to learn. <i>An <b>apt</b> reply.</i>
<b><u>aptitude</u></b>	Inherent ability. <i>The <b>aptitude</b> of this society to assimilate new elements.</i>
<b>aptness</b>	Appropriateness for the occasion. <i>The phrase had considerable <b>aptness</b>.</i>
<b>banister</b>	The structure formed by the uprights and handrail at the side of a staircase. <i>I stuck my head between the <b>banisters</b>.</i>
<b>bending</b>	The act of bending something.
<b><u>corner</u></b>	Solid exterior angle of a building especially one formed by a cornerstone. <i>In many <b>corners</b> of the world they still practice slavery.</i>
<b><u>disposed</u></b>	Usually followed by to naturally disposed toward. <i>He is favourably <b>disposed</b> towards the proposals.</i>
<b>emphasis</b>	Special importance or significance. <i>He spoke with <b>emphasis</b> and with complete conviction.</i>
<b>emphasize</b>	Lay stress on (a word or phrase) when speaking. <i>They <b>emphasize</b> the need for daily one to one contact between parent and child.</i>
<b><u>emphatically</u></b>	Without doubt; clearly. <i>Greg is <b>emphatically</b> not a slacker.</i>
<b>gangling</b>	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs. <i>A <b>gangling</b> youth with a trace of down on his cheeks.</i>
<b>highlight</b>	Apply a highlighter to one's cheeks or eyebrows in order to make them more prominent. <i><b>Highlight</b> the area above your eyebrows.</i>

<b>incline</b>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>He <b>inclined</b> his ear to the wise old man.</i>
<b>inclined</b>	Having made preparations. <i><b>Inclined</b> to be moody.</i>
<b>lean</b>	Cause to lean or incline. <i>We can <b>lean</b> on this man.</i>
<b>likely</b>	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>Rain is <b>likely</b>.</i>
<b>prone</b>	Lying flat, especially face downwards. <i>I was lying <b>prone</b> on a foam mattress.</i>
<b>propensity</b>	A natural inclination. <i>Their innate <b>propensity</b> to attack one another.</i>
<b>recumbent</b>	(especially of a person or effigy) lying down. <i><b>Recumbent</b> shrubs.</i>
<b>slant</b>	Heel over. <i>A new <b>slant</b> on science.</i>
<b>spotlight</b>	Illuminate with a spotlight. <i>The dancers are <b>spotlighted</b> from time to time throughout the evening.</i>
<b>staircase</b>	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>A mirrored <b>staircase</b>.</i>
<b>stress</b>	The degree of stress measured in units of force per unit area. <i>In French the last syllable is usually <b>stressed</b>.</i>
<b>susceptible</b>	Easily impressed emotionally. <i><b>Susceptible</b> to colds.</i>
<b>talent</b>	Natural abilities or qualities. <i>A mighty steed bought from a Thessalian merchant for thirteen <b>talents</b>.</i>
<b>tilt</b>	Charge with a tilt. <i>A <b>tilt</b> at the European Cup.</i>
<b>underline</b>	Draw a line under (a word or phrase) to give emphasis or indicate special type. <i>Certain phrases had been <b>underlined</b>.</i>
<b>underscore</b>	(on a computer or typewriter keyboard) a short horizontal line _ on the baseline. <i>The company <b>underscored</b> the progress made with fuel cells.</i>
<b>yaw</b>	Be wide open. <i>The jet <b>yawed</b> sharply to the right.</i>
